Clerk's Office taking applications to vote by mail

BALLINGER- Runnels County Clerk's Office is now accepting applications for early voting by mail for the November 5 Constitutional Amendment Election and the General Election for the City of Miles.

A qualified voter is eligible to vote by mail if the voter: Expects to be absent from the county of residence on Election Day and during the regular hours for early voting by personal appearance; is disabled; will be 65 years of age or older on Election Day; or is confined in jail but eligible to vote.

The last day to receive an application to vote by mail is October 25.

Any qualified voter will be eligible for early voting by personal appearance at the County Clerk's Office in Ballinger beginning October 21, and ending November 1, 2013 from 8:30 a.m. until 5 p.m.

Sample ballots are available at the County Clerk's Office in Ballinger, and Tax Branch Office in Winters.

CHICK-INN DEDICATION DAY

CHERRY SODAS, ONION RINGS AND LOTS OF MEMORIES

WINTERS- The headliner was put on hold, but the historical significance, the memories and the achievement of landing a Historical Marker for the Chick-Inn, brought together the community in Winters. Everybody remembered the old days when the diner was the place to be, and was the gathering spot of hundreds of teenagers spanning several generations.

Due to the Saturday morning rain the dedication ceremony was taken from U.S. 83, 1 mile south of Winters, to the WHS Cafeteria. There the attendants shared their memories spanning the Chick-Inn's famous steak fingers, cherry sodas and onion rings, marriage proposals and of course, everybody "Making the Drag."

The program, with M.C. Ruth Cooper, WHS Class of 1954 and Chairperson of the Runnels County Historical Commission, featured former WHS Band Director (1968-1976) Kirke McKenzie and current Band Director Phillip Mooney playing The Star Spangled Banner.

"This is very important to Runnels County, not only Winters community, in the fact that it has brought forth history that could have been lost completely, but we are celebrating the dedication today of a very special part of Winters community that lasted for about 30 years," said Cooper.

"Most markers are dedicated to a subject that has

long passed, this is somewhat of a living marker because the people that experienced the 30 years of the Chick-Inn serving the community is still living," she added.

For Randall Conner, WHS Class of 1967 and one of the strongest supporters of the marker project, the history of the Chick-Inn helped to bring the community together.

"I think everybody is excited about it, it's a project that came in an unusual way, through Facebook," Conner said. "It's bringing people that grew up here, bringing them back and getting them involved and

seeing what the community is like today," he added.

Terry Loehman, WHS Class of 1971 and Pastor of the New Beginnings Church led the invocation, and the introductions were by Marilyn Egan, WHS Class of 1959 and former County Judge in Runnels County.

Geoff Connor, WHS Class of 1981 and former Texas Secretary of State led the pledge to the U.S. and Texas flags followed by his presentation of "Growing Up in Small Town America."

WINTERS- The Winters Blizzards received all the support from the 12th man in their Homecoming game, but in the field the Brock Eagles probed to be a tough opponent, and defeated Winters by a score of 50-13 last Friday, September 27, 2013. Winters dropped to 1-4 for the season with one non-district game left to play.

Brock got off to a strong start, scoring two uncontested touchdowns in the first quarter. First Slaten Gough carried a 40-yard rush into the endzone to break the zero, and then Seth Boleman completed a 30 yard pass to Titus Gossett. Klay Marr made both of the extra points good.

Winters responded before the first was over, when quarterback Chris Gerhart completed a 30-yard touchdown pass into the endzone to Jimmy John Ripley. Lukas Kraatz added the kick, 14-7.

With less than a minute in the first quarter Gough would add one more for Brock, with a 3-yard rush

and Marr's kick to put the score 21-7.

In the second quarter Winters' defense held the Eagles to one touchdown only. Gough rushed a 50-yard carry into paydirt

while Boleman completed a pass to Lance Ewell for a two-point conversion.

After halftime Boleman threw a 15-yard pass to Gossett for a touchdown. Gough completed a pass to Tyler Skelton for the extra point and the score went Brock 37, Winters 7.

Before the third was over Tyler Gray would add six more for the Eagles with a 40-yard rush. Marr put the kick between the poles, Brock 44, Winters 7.

In the last quarter the Blizzards scored their second touchdown of the night, when Daryl Hagle carried a ball 85 yards into the endzone. This time the kick was failed, Brock 44, Winters 13.

Brock put the cherry on the cake just before the end of the game, when Lance Ewell carried a ball 75 yards into promised land. The point after touchdown was missed for the final 50-13.

Passing for the Blizzards Chris Gerhart completed 2 of 10, for a total of 43 yards and had one interception. Jimmy John

Zebra mussels found in Lake Belton and suspected in more lakes

ATHENS— Zebra mussels, a destructive invasive species that originated in Eurasia, have been found in Lake Belton in Central Texas.

Texas Parks and Wildlife Department Executive Director Carter Smith Wednesday signed an order adopting an emergency rule to add lakes Belton and Stillhouse Hollow, and portions of the Leon and Lampasas rivers to the list of water bodies covered by special regulations intended to control the spread of zebra mussels. Under these special regulations, boaters who drain their boats and gear will not be considered in violation of rules prohibiting possession of zebra mussels.

"The Lake Belton discovery underscores how critical it is for boaters all across Texas to get informed and involved to help stop the spread of zebra mussels," said Brian Van Zee, TPWD Inland Fisheries regional director based in Waco. "Unfortunately, zebra mussel larvae, called

veligers, are not visible to the naked eye. You could be transporting them on your boat and not even know it. This is why it's particularly important to always Clean, Drain, and Dry your boat and gear before heading to another water body."

A Texas Mussel Watch volunteer was looking for native mussels along the shores of Lake Belton on September 18 when she found a Giant Floater that had a small mussel attached to its shell. Suspecting that it might be a zebra mussel she reported it to the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department. The following day, TPWD confirmed that the small mussel was in fact a zebra mussel.

A follow up survey conducted by TPWD after the September 18 discovery revealed that zebra mussels are well established in Lake Belton and are found throughout the lake. In fact, three size classes of zebra mussels were found in Lake Belton indicating that they were likely introduced to the reservoir sometime in 2012.

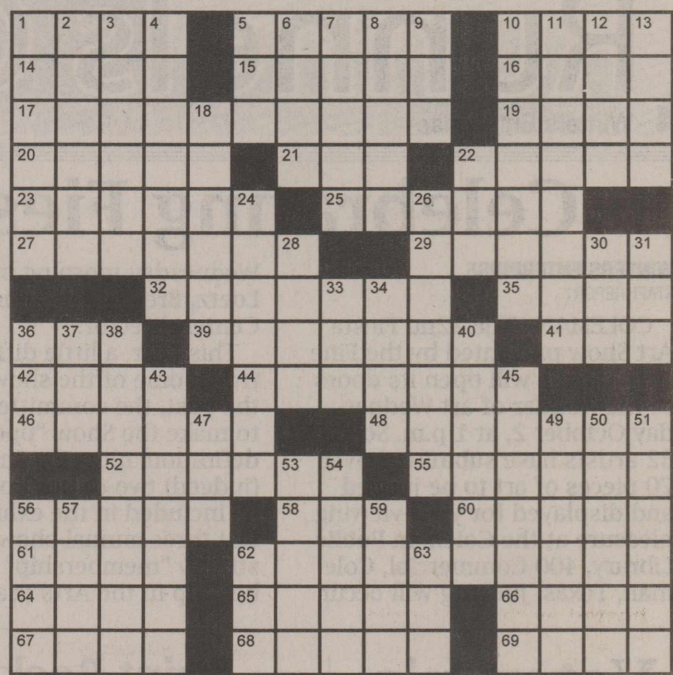

Weather Whys

Q: You hear the term "harvest moon" and "hunter's moon." What exactly do they mean?

A: Naming full moons goes back to early American days when the Indians — mainly the Algonquin tribes of New England — tried to describe the full moons of their day, says Brent McRoberts of Texas A&M University. "Many of these names were either weather related or tied in with seasonal conditions of the time," he explains. "For example, a 'harvest moon' is the full moon that usually occurs in September, when the moon is so bright that that farmers could work late into the night. A 'hunter's moon' was usually in October, when the deer were at their fattest, leaves were turning color and the temperatures were getting quite chilly." When the snows were deep in January, wolf packs would often howl near Indian villages, prompting the "full wolf moon," the first full moon in January, McRoberts adds.

playing God Bless America, Joe Eckols, WHS Class of 1971 and chairperson of the Chick-Inn Historical Marker Committee, presented the evolution of the marker.

"On January 28 of 2012 Mike Bedford used Facebook to post a simple question 'How many of you are old enough to remember going to the Chick-Inn on Saturday night', there was so many responses that by April of last year it was suggested that we should secure a historical marker for the Chick-Inn," said Eckols.

"A lot of people met their future spouses at the Chick-Inn, more than one marriage proposal was delivered there, and

I believe one marriage was performed by Judge J.C. Hodnett," Echols recalled.

The inscription of the marker was read by Mike Pumphrey, WHS Class of 1968, who also prepared the Historical Marker Application.

The program continued with Bobby Mayo, WHS Class of 1950 and long time manager of the Fiesta-Inn and State theaters, talking about the origin of the Chick-Inn.

Mike Wilson and Mary Cochran Schlottman, grandson and granddaughter of Leonard and Julia Wilson, talked about the Wilson years. The Hodnett years were presented by Mike Fowler, WHS Class of 1974 and son-in-law of J.C. and Tommy Hodnett.

Bill Cathey, WHS Class of 1966 and teacher and Principal of WHS from 1971 to 2002 presented "Remember Who You Are and Where You Come From."

The closing remarks were by Randall Conner, benediction by Cliff Poe, WHS Class of 1972 and semi-retired pastor, and Wendell Gideon, WHS Class of 1954 and Administrator for UIL Music Contests closed the program leading the Winters High School Song.

Sunday afternoon, September 29, 2013, a group of about 25 individuals met at the site of the Chick-Inn marker at 1:30 p.m. and got the marker finally unveiled. Randall Conner spoke briefly about the event and expressed appreciation to everyone that had a part in the preparation that went into the entire process.

Ruth Cooper spoke briefly about the significance of the history of the marker to the community and Runnels County History for future generations.

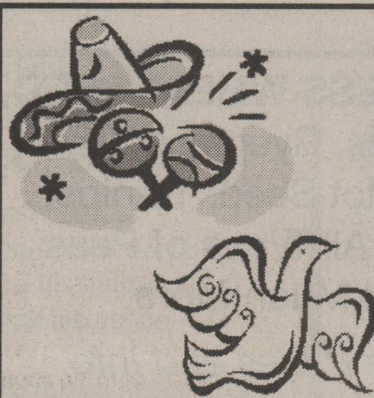
