## Commissioners Court Minutes

On this the 13th day of July 1987, the Commissioners Court of Sherman County convened in regular session being open to the public, at the regular meeting place in the Courthouse in Stratford, Texas, with the following members of the Court present: W.S. Frizzell, Jr., County Judge, Wayne Cummings, Comm. Prec. 1; Boyd Spurlock, Comm. Prec. 2; Dale Hamilton, Comm. Prec. 3; Darrell Cotney, Comm. Prec. 4; M.L. Albert, County and District Clerk and Tom Wade, Sheriff. Absent-0. The above constituting a quorum, the following proceedings were had to wit:

It is ordered by the Court that the monthly reports of M.L. Albert, County and District clerk; Linda R. Keener, County Treasurer; Robert Pierce, Justice of the Peace Prec. 3; John Woods, Justice of the Peace Prec. 4; Tom Wade, Sheriff; Jack Barton, County Attorney, Zelda Pickens, Tax Assessor Collector; be approved and all proper claims examined, approved and ordered paid. Foregoing minutes read and approved.

Representing Dumas Family Services Center on the 1988 Budget and meeting with the court, Michael Lind, David Harker, and Gennell York requested an increase in funding of \$1,060.00 for the 1988 Budget year. Motion by Commissioner Darrell Cotney seconded by Commissioner Wayne Cummings that Dumas Family Services Center 1988 Budget be increased to a total of \$3,240.00 provided services are continued in Sherman County. All ayes. Motion carried.

Scott Buckles met with the Court to discuss the 4% salary increase to dispatchers. Budget approval for County and Hospital District are at different times of year and presents a problem for the Hospital District. No solution was found.

Travis Spurlock appeared before the court protesting the 4% increase to County employees.

Bids were received, opened and tabulated. The following bid was received: West Texas equipment Co.

140G Caterpillar with trade-\$75,087.00 Motion by Commissioner Dale Hamilton seconded by Commissioner Boyd Spurlock that the bid of West Texas Equipment for a 140G Caterpillar with trade in difference of \$75,087.00 be accepted. All ayes. Motion carried.

Ron Carter representing Phillips Petroleum Co. met with the court requesting R.O.W. crossing between sections 37 & 54, Block 3-B and between sections 61 and 90, Block 1-C in Sherman County, Texas. Motion by Commissioner Dale Hamilton, seconded by Commissioner Boyd Spurlock that the two above referred crossings be approved. All ayes. Motion carried. (Copy of contract on file with the County Clerk).

Sheriff Tom Wade met with the Court requesting a washer and dryer for the jail. The total cost would be approximately \$725.00 Motion by Commissioner Dale Hamilton seconded by Commissioner Darrell Cotney that the sheriff be permitted to purchase a washer and dryer for the jail. All ayes. Motion carried.

Motion by Commissioner Wayne Cummings seconded by Commissioner Darrell Cotney that the County Judge be authorized to sign for Sherman County the resolution supporting a Regional Law Enforcement Drug Unit and the City of Amarillo's application for grant funds. All ayes. Motion carried. (Copy on file in Clerk's office.)

A jail exercise area proposal is to be requested from Getman and Sons with less concrete.

M. L. Albert, County Clerk and Linda Keener, County Treasurer met with the Court to discuss the old copy machine. Motion by Judge W.S. Frizzell seconded by Commissioner Dale Hamilton that a used copier be purchased at a cost of \$495.15 to be located on the second floor. All ayes. Motion carried.

No one else appearing except the above quoted persons on the 1988 Budget and the 4% salary increases for elected officials the following orders were entered:

This date being the meeting for the public impact on the 4% salary increase for elected officials and only protest registered the following order was presented: Motion by Commissioner Wayne Cummings seconded by Commissioner Dale Hamilton that effective October 1, 1987 a 4% increase in elected officials and appointed officials be adopted. Commissioners Wayne Cummings, Dale Hamilton and Darrell Cotney aye. Commissioner Boyd Spurlock no. Motion carried.

Motion by Commissioner Darrell Cotney seconded by Commissioner Dale Hamilton that the FY 1988 Budget be adopted and passed with an increase of Dumas Family Services Budget of \$1,060.00 Commissioner Wayne Cummings, Dale Hamilton, and Darrell Cotney, aye. Commissioner Boyd Spurlock, no. Motion carried.

## Schoolboard Meeting

The Stratford Independent School Board met in regular session on July 10, 1987 with all members present. At this meeting, the Board approved the minutes of the previous meeting and approved payment of current bills.

Superintendent Bass gave a report on the State TEAMS test for the first grade. Results of the test show that our students are achieving better than the state average. In other business, the Board accepted the resignation of Jana Roberts with regrets. The Board then approved the hiring of the following teachers: Rita Harker, English; Shari Kliewer, Elementary Music; Betty Ingham, Jr. High Band Director; Kandi Patterson, Elementary; and Shawna Brooks, Elementary. The school staff is now complete for the coming school year.

The Board reviewed the operations of the cafeteria for the past year and set the prices for school breakfast and lunches at the same price as last year--lunches will be \$1.15 for Elementary and Jr. High Students, \$1.25 for High School, and visitors \$2.25. Breakfast will be \$1.00 for all students. The board commended Betty Henry and her staff for the

efficient operation of the cafeteria.

The Board then studied the budget for the year and studied a proposed budget for the 1987-88 school year. The Board then set the salaries for teachers for the coming year at the same amount above state schedule as the past year, \$4,000.00 above for B.A. Degree and \$4,500.00 above for an M.A. Degree. The Board approved a 3% increase for all auxiliary employees.

The Board also passed the policy that all new teachers hired for the coming year and for each year thereafter be placed on probationary contract for two years. This policy is within the framework of the state law.

The Board read a letter from a patron pertaining to student initiation during the Stratford Jamboree. The School Board has no jurisdiction over these activities and went on record as being opposed to any form of student initiation.

Superintendent Bass gave reports to the Board on summer maintenance, transportation, and the Classroom Management Seminar attended by Superintendent Bass and Principals Sam Brite and Steve Haynes at San Marcos.

Authority is available to guarantee loans for Texas rural residents for use in creating new business or expanding existing enterprises. J. Lynn Futch, FmHA State Director, said today.

"Although the Farmers Home Administration guarantees a loan made by a commercial lender, we are interested in the economic

health of our rural communities and welcome inquiries about this program," Futch said. "Our business and industry program was created primarily to provide jobs in rural communities and towns up to 50,000 in population."

"There may be many people in rural areas of Texas who are not familiar with the opportunities available under the B&I program, especially the fact that we can guarantee loans for a variety of sizes of business, including family-size enterprises," he added.

We are especially interested in anything we can do to help improve job opportunities for farmers who are trying to find new occupations."
