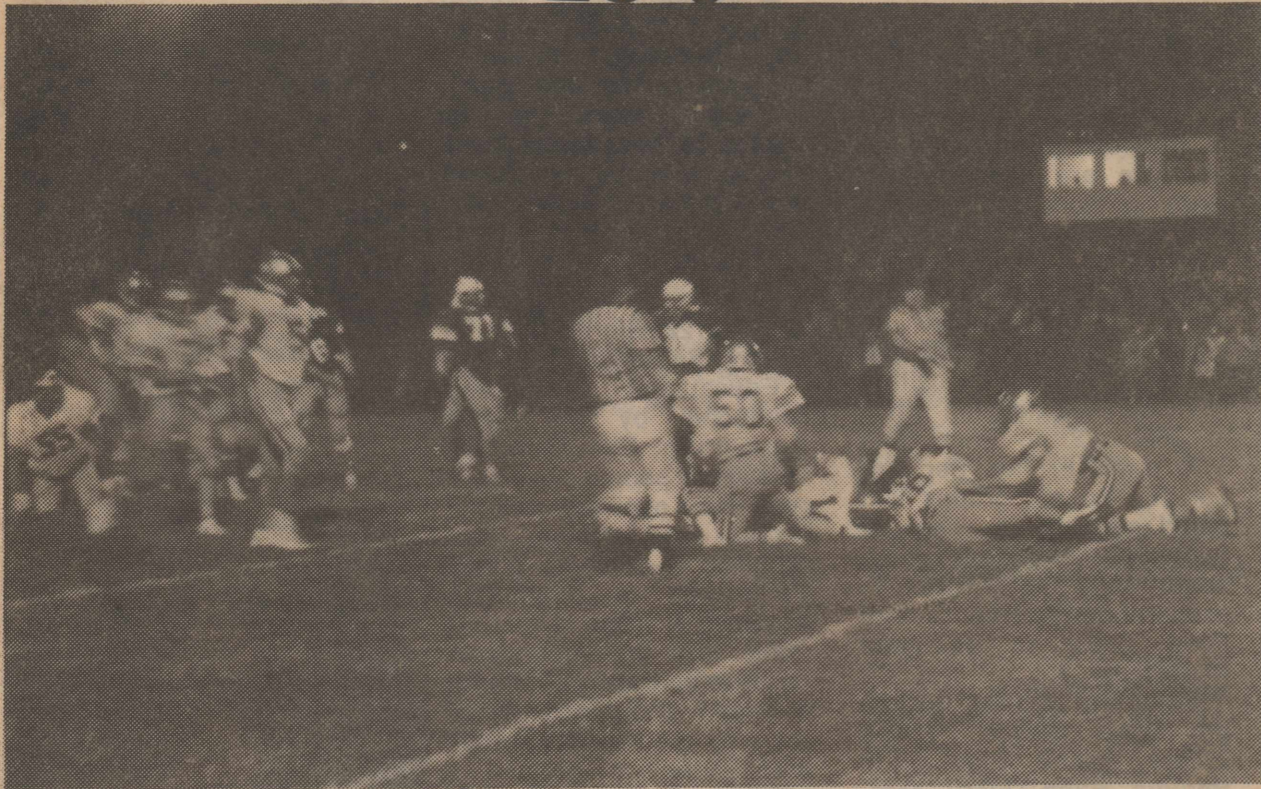

## Elks Whip Wolves 28-0

The Elks continued their outstanding defensive play by recording another shut-out over the Dalhart Wolves by the score of 28-0. The defensive secondary intercepted three passes; one each by McBryde, Waters, and Mungia. Neal Smith had an interception taken away because of a penalty. The defense sacked the quarterback four times and recovered two fumbles. Mike Kirkwood had 14 tackles and Wade McKinney 12. The Elk defense held the Dalhart offense to only 75 yards rushing and 31 yards passing. Bryon Borth and Lloyd Willard had a good game filling in for injured players. Parker Johnson,

Scott, Riffe, Jade Palmer also did an excellent job on defense.

Offensively the Elks rolled up 402 yards of offense. Doug Pittman had an outstanding game passing. He completed 8 of 16 passes for 228 yards. Dirk Davis caught three passes for 160 yards and two touchdowns. He had another touchdown reception of 40 yards nullified by a penalty. Neal Smith and Mike Kirkwood caught two passes each, and Chris Waters had one reception. Gareed McBryde was our leading rusher with 17 carries for 97 yards and one touchdown. Gareed also had a touchdown run nullified by a penalty. Parker

Johnson scored one touchdown and had 9 carries for 34 yards. Lance Brooks had 5 carries for 25 yards before leaving the game with an injury.

It would be very difficult to have this much offense without the work of our offensive line. These men had another outstanding game. They are Gary Clements, Scott Riffe, Jade Palmer, Wade McKinney and Craig Brooks.

Our next opponent is Turpin, Okla. They have been picked to win their district this season. They have seven returning starters from last season. Last week they defeated Gruver 28-6. The game with Turpin ended in a 0-0 tie last season. We have always had close games with Turpin, in 1984 it was 8-7, 1985 13-12. I think we can expect another close contest this week.

and all the trimmings will be served. Bill Gillenwaters and George Avent are chefs for the meat. Live music will entertain.

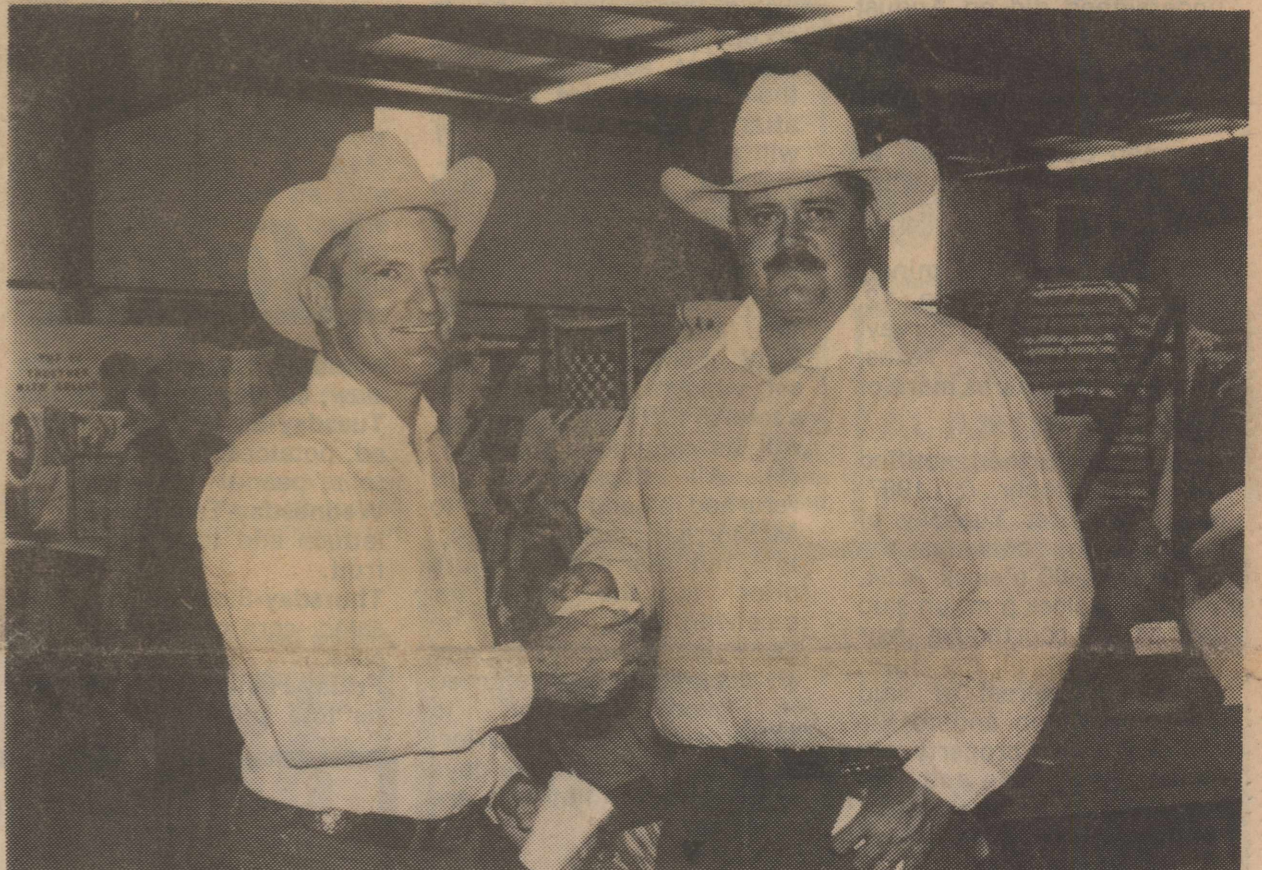
Tickets are available from community members. Adults \$5 and children 6 to 12, \$3. Proceeds go toward building maintenance.

Thirty-three parents, guests and 4-H'ers attended this event which highlighted the completion of the 4-H Breads project.

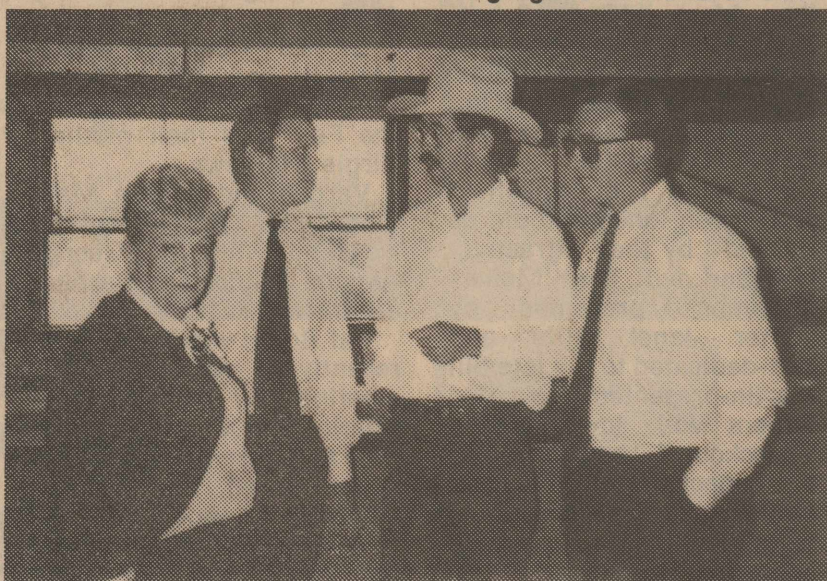
## Golf News
