## Blizzards extend winning streak, lead standing

With only two regular season games to play, Winters remains undefeated in district, after defeating the Bronte Longhorns 46-13

WINTERS- Extending their streak to four wins and seven victories overall, the Winters Blizzards defeated the Bronte Longhorns 46-13, and took over the lone lead in the District 6-2A Div. II high school football standings.

Last week the Blizzards shared the top of the standing with Menard, but the Yellow Jackets suffered their first district defeat to the Miles Bulldogs to drop to 2-1. With two games left to play the district championship is still attainable by four teams: Roscoe, Miles and Menard share a close second place with a record of 2-1.

Friday night the Blizzards scored 33 points in the first quarter to cruise to for the remainder of the game and prevent the Bronte Longhorns from getting their first win of the season. Winters is now 3-0 in district, 7-1 overall, while Bronte dropped to 0-3 (0-8).

Jimmy John Ripley passed for 6 of 12, with 162 yards for two touchdowns and one interception. Jonathan Sandoval passed for 1 of 2 for 8 yards. Receiving, Luke Kraatz captured two passes for 74 yards and two touchdowns, followed by Daryl Hagle with 2 for 65 and one touchdown; Stephon Cleghorn racked up 16 yards in one pass and Jordan Hamrick captured two passes for 15 yards.

Rushing Ripley led the charts with nine carries for 62 yards and one touchdown, followed by Julian Soto with 56 yards in six carries and one visit to pay dirt, Cleghorn tallied 17 yards in three carries with one touchdown, and Ty Cortez racked up 10 yards in four carries with one entry to the end zone.

Chris Diaz (5 for 36), Michael Chavis (7 for 34), Cameron Cooper (2 for 8) and Jonathan Sandoval (2 for 1) complete the rushing blitz.

Friday night, the Blizzards will be hosting the Miles Bulldogs for their last home game of the season.

Roy had a unique perspective on life, and will be missed.

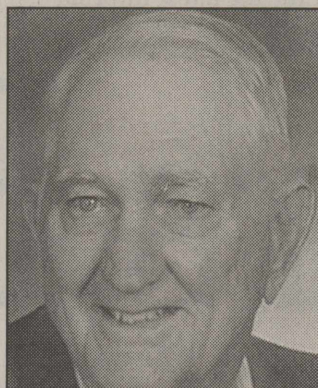

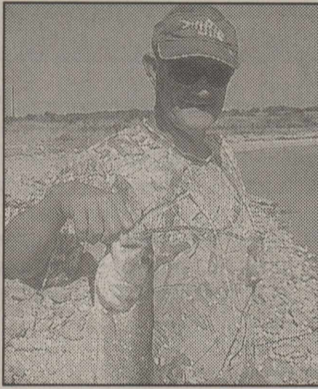

## Weather Whys

Q: You hear the term "harvest moon" and "hunter's moon." What exactly do they mean?

A: Naming full moons goes back to hundreds of years ago when the Native Americans — mainly the Algonquin tribes of New England — tried to describe the full moons of their day, says Brent McRoberts of Texas A&M University. "Many of these names were either weather related or tied in with seasonal conditions of the time," he explains. "For example, a 'harvest moon' is the full moon that usually occurs in September, when the moon is so bright that farmers could work late into the night. A 'hunter's moon' was usually in October, when the deer were at their fattest, leaves were turning color and the temperatures were getting quite chilly."

### Veteran's Corner

The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) announced it will begin accepting applications by mail on Monday, November 3, 2014, for the Fry Scholarship under newly expanded eligibility criteria to include surviving spouses. The expanded criteria for the Fry Scholarship is the latest in a series of VA actions to implement provisions of the Veterans Access, Choice, and Accountability Act of 2014 ("Choice Act"). Specifically, Section 701 of the Choice Act expands the Fry Scholarship to include the surviving spouses of service members who died in the line of duty after September 10, 2001. Prior to this expansion, only children of those who died in the line of duty

were eligible for this benefit. The Fry Scholarship will entitle eligible spouses to up to 36 months of the full, 100-percent level of the Post-9/11 GI Bill, which includes a tuition-and-fee payment, a monthly housing allowance and stipend for books and supplies. Some spouses currently eligible for or already receiving benefits under the Survivors' and Dependents' Educational Assistance (DEA) program may now be eligible for the Fry Scholarship. All surviving spouses eligible for DEA and the Fry Scholarship must make an irrevocable election for terms beginning on or after January 1, 2015. 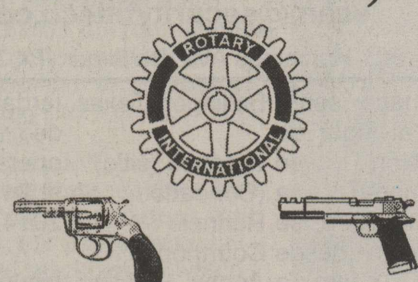

By taking the tour the girls earned a new petal patch towards their Daisy Flower, which represents their promise center. The

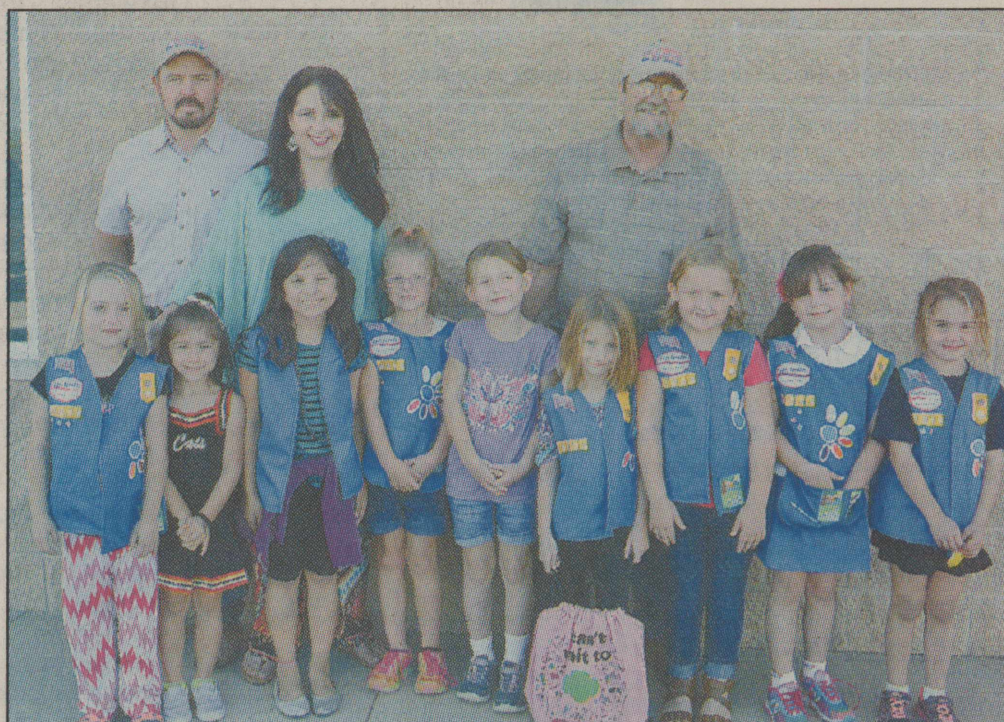

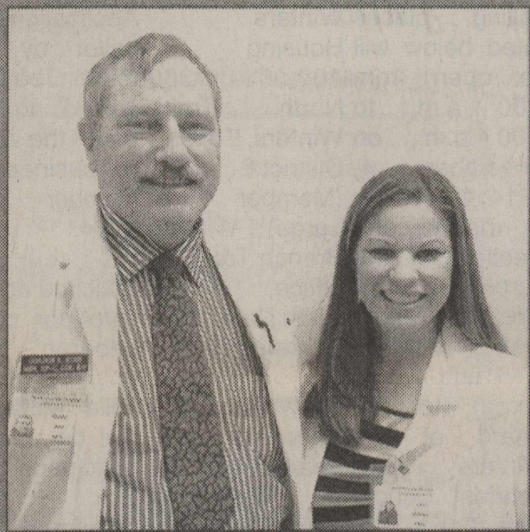

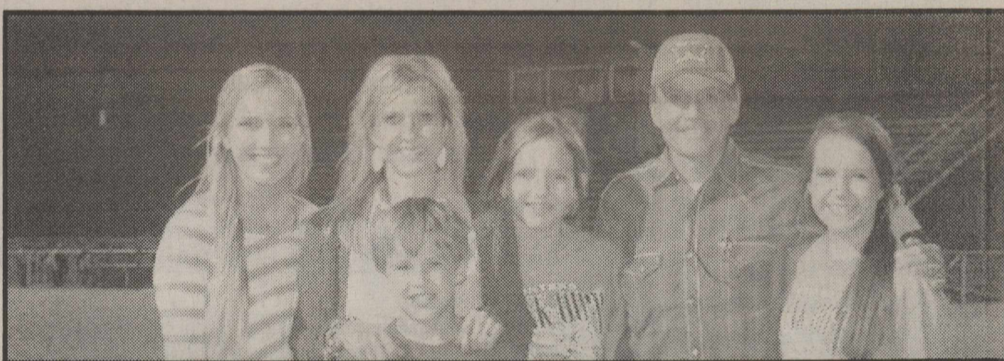
