





As published in the Paris News dated Friday, November 23, the Cap Rock merger hasn't been completed vet and Smith said he doesn't want to quit with the task unfinished. Does that mean the merger is not a done deal, as some would have us believe?

The by-laws were revised when the LEC Board wanted to clean up the by-laws by removing misspelled words and grammar punctuation errors as stated by Smith, LEC Board of Director in District 4. In order to correct these errors, was it really necessary to give the Board of Directors the power to change the by-laws to require 1/3 of its members, instead of 10% of its members as required by previous by-laws, for a member to bring charges against a board member, and at all general meetings of members, either annual or special, a member may vote by proxy unless the board of Directors, at its discretion, determines that voting by proxy will not be allowed at any such meting. If proxies


