Controversy over Prairiland Trustee Election questions where candidates live

The upcoming Prairiland CISD trustee election is fraught with controversy.

Since the consolidation of the schools there has been a "Gentlemen's Agreement" to elect two board members each from Blossom, Deport and Cunningham and one from Pattonville.

That agreement is being ignored in this year's election.

A concerned group of citizens,

led by Reggie McDowra, is protesting.

McDowra says that "I feel this is an attempt to tax without representation" McDowra said.

Superintendent James Morton said that according to two attorneys he had spoken with, the 30-year old tradition is not legal.

James Norwood, a former board member who served ten years on

the board after consolidation, stated that there would "never have been a consolidated district had the agreement not been included."

Both the Texas Education Code and the Texas Election Code allow school districts to elect trustees either at-large, by single member districts or by a combination of the two. Superintendent Morton said.

I am writing this letter to recognize the Deport and Pattonville Fire Departments. On November 30, 2001, the day my house nearly burned down, I witnessed first hand their bravery, courage and compassion.

As most everyone knows, I had gone to school that day around 8 a.m. and by 10:15 a.m., Mr. Salter, my principal, came to me and told me that he had received a call saying that my house was on fire.

He immediately got someone to take over my classes and I went home. When I got home, the fire trucks were already there. The windows to my kitchen had just blown out from the pressure of the heat that had built up.

When the front door was opened, the firemen proceeded to do their jobs. Smoke was coming out everywhere and the fire was traveling upward towards my roof. I looked up and saw a group of firemen standing on the roof. They had to knock a hole in the roof to vent the smoke and then put out the fire. Firemen were all over the place...going in the front door, back door, attic, garage.

Of course, I was just in complete shock. I was watching them risk their lives. I thought to myself, these are volunteer firemen. They don't get paid for this. I was humbled by their service and humanitarianism.

Eventually, the fire was put out and my little dog was brought out. He had died of smoke inhalation. I heard later that one of the fireman had tried to revive him. He was buried behind my house before they left the scene.

The Pattonville VFD will sponsor a fish fry and auction on Saturday, May 11 from 4 to 8 p.m. at the Fire Station and Community Center.

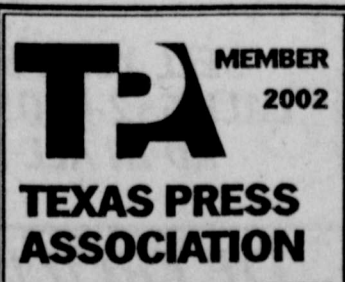

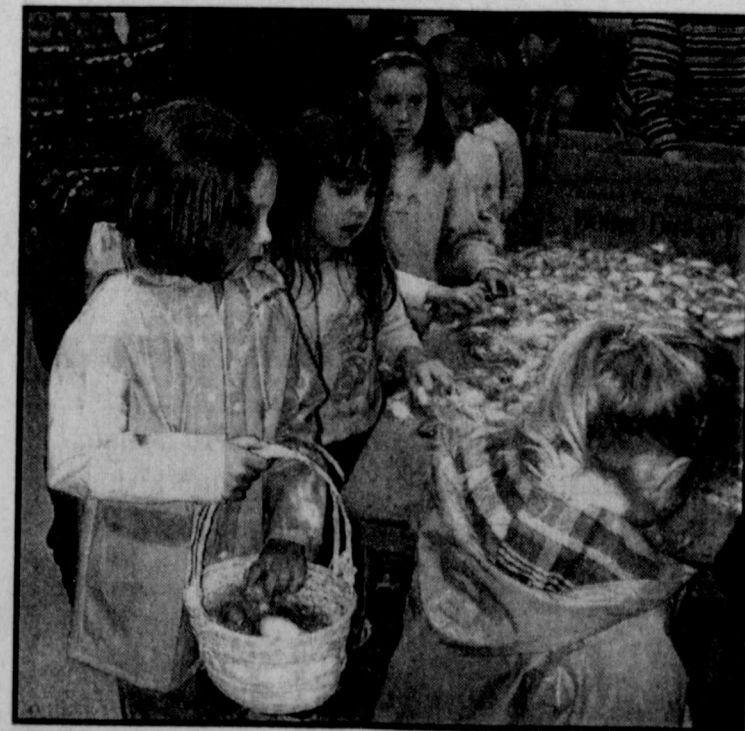

Doris Jenkins, Paris

Cornbread Squares
2 cans whole kernel corn-undrained-15-1/4 ounce
2 cans cream style corn-14-3/4 ounce
2 cups sour cream
1 cup butter or margarine-melted
2 packages cornbread muffin mix-8-1/2 ounces each
3 eggs

In large mixing bowl, combine all ingredients and beat until combined. Pour into two greased 13x9x2 baking dishes. Bake at 350 degrees for 40-45 minutes or until toothpick comes out clean. Cool for 15 minutes and serve warm. Yield 24 servings.

Confetti Cabbage Slaw
10 pounds cabbage-shredded
2 tablespoons salt
6 cups vinegar
3 cups cider vinegar
1-1/2 cups water
2 tablespoons mustard seed
2 tablespoon celery seed
1 bunch celery-chopped
4 medium carrots-shredded
1 medium sweet red pepper-diced
1 medium green pepper-diced

In large bowl, combine cabbage and salt and let stand for 2 hours. In large saucepan, combine sugar, water, vinegar, mustard seed and celery seed. Bring to boil over medium heat and stir until sugar is dissolved. Remove from heat and cool completely. Drain cabbage if desired and add remaining vegetables and add dressing and toss to coat. Cover and refrigerate for 2 hours or freeze for up to 3 months. Serve with slotted spoon. Yields 50-60 servings.

Toffee- Chip Cookies
1 cup butter or margarine-softened
1/2 cup vegetable oil
1 cup sugar
1 cup packed brown sugar
1 teaspoon vanilla
2 eggs
3-1/2 cups all-purpose flour
1 teaspoon cream of tartar
1 teaspoon baking soda
1 teaspoon salt
3 cups crisp rice cereal
1 cup quick cooking oats
1 cup flaked coconut
1 cup chopped pecans
1 cup English toffee bits or almond briclé chips

In large mixing bowl, cream butter, oil, sugars and vanilla. Add eggs, one at a time, beating well after each addition. Combine flour, cream of tartar, baking soda and salt. Add to the creamed mixture. Stir in remaining ingredients and drop by table-spoonsful 2 inches apart onto greased baking sheet. Bake at 350 degrees for 10-12 minutes or until lightly browned. Remove to wire rack to cool. Yield 12 dozen.

Brunswick Stew
4 large onions-halved and thinly sliced
1/4 cup butter or margarine
1 broiler/fryer-cutup (3-4 pounds)
2 quarts water
2 cans crushed tomatoes-28 oz. each
1-3/4 cups catsup
1 can tomato paste-6 ounce
10-3/4 ounce can condensed tomato soup-undiluted
2 medium jalapeno peppers-seed and chopped
1 tablespoon salt
1 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce
1 teaspoon hot pepper sauce
1 teaspoon pepper
1 pound fully cooked ham
2 lb. ground beef-cooked and drained
16 oz package frozen cut green beans
16 ounce package butter beans
16 ounce package frozen corn
6 cups hot mashed potatoes-prepare without milk and butter

In large stockpot saute onions in butter until tender. Add chicken and water. Bring to boil and reduce heat and simmer for 1 hour. Remove chicken and debone and dice. Skim fat from broth and return chicken to broth. Add next 14 ingredients and bring to boil. Reduce heat and cover to simmer for 1 hour or until vegetables are tender. Stir in potatoes and heat through. Yield about 8 quarts for a little over 25 servings. When cutting or seeding the jalapeno peppers use rubber gloves to protect your hands and avoid touching your face.

In large mixing bowl, cream butter, oil, sugars and vanilla. Add eggs, one at a time, beating well after each addition. Combine flour, cream of tartar, baking soda and salt. Add to the creamed mixture. Stir in remaining ingredients and drop by table-spoonsful 2 inches apart onto greased baking sheet. Bake at 350 degrees for 10-12 minutes or until lightly browned. Remove to wire rack to cool. Yield 12 dozen.

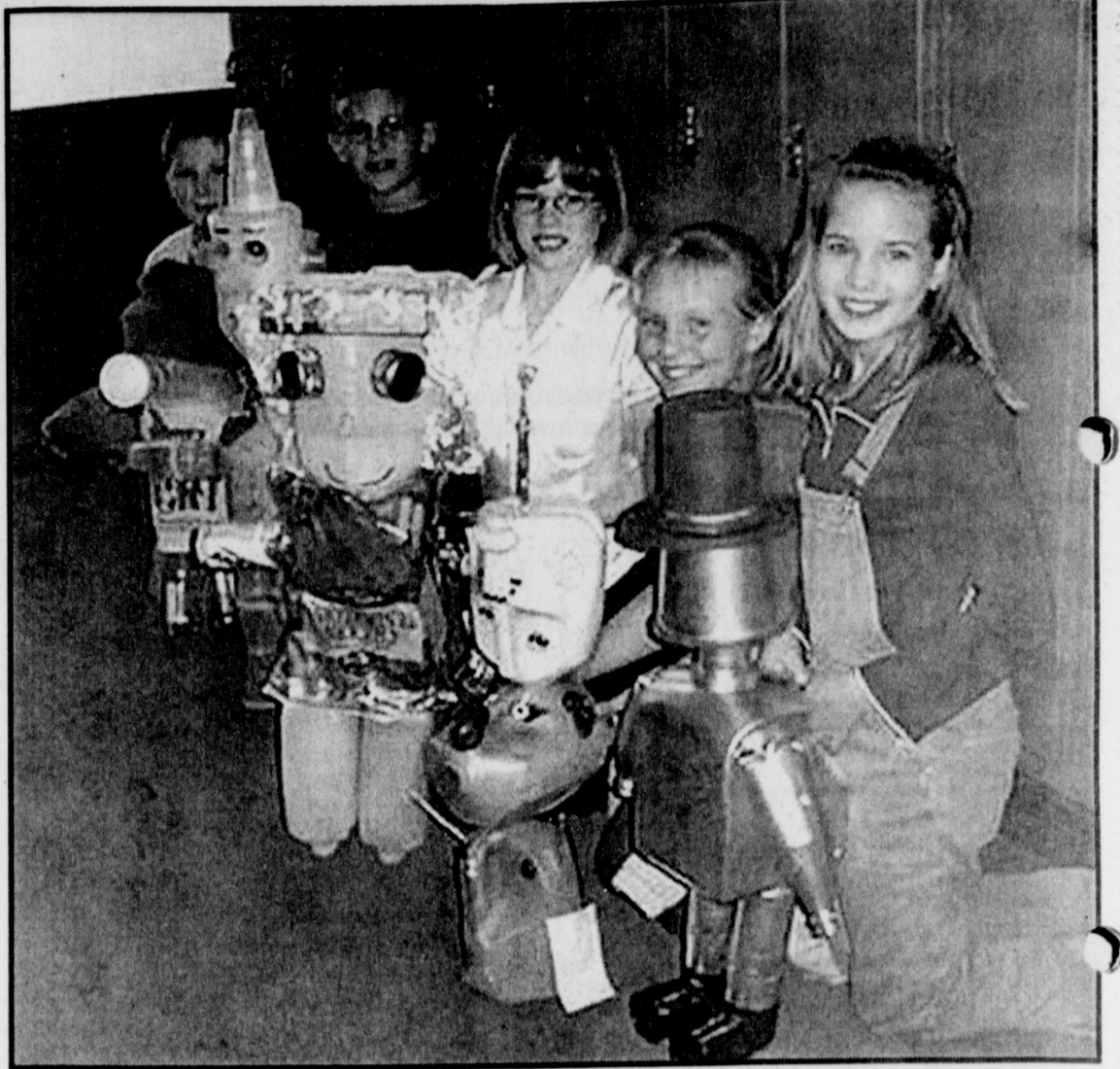
