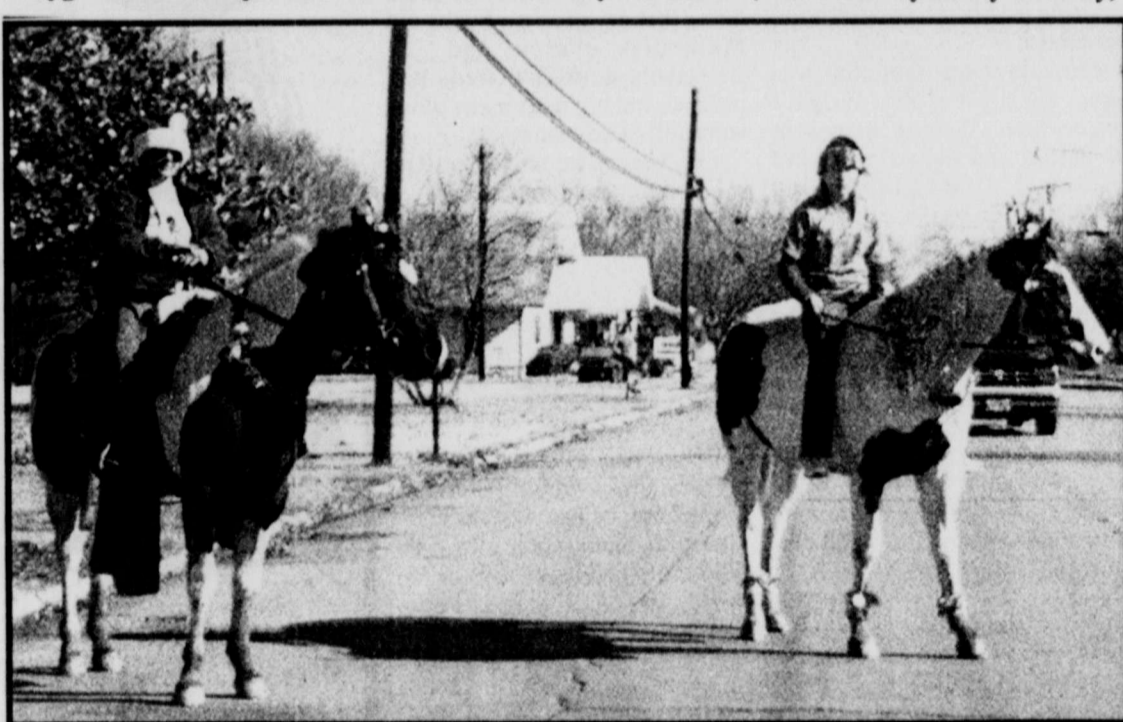

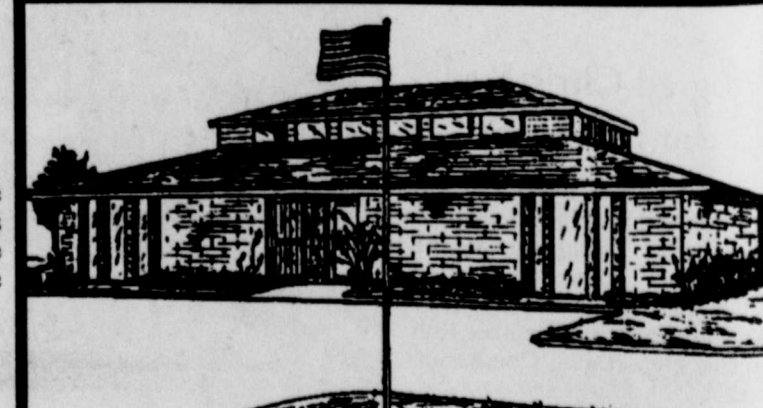
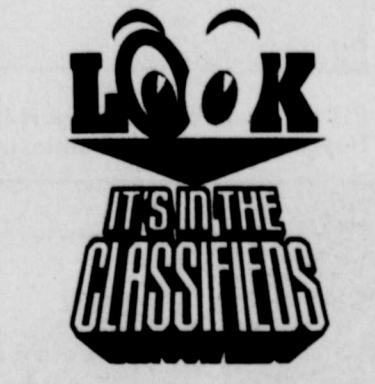
**Maurine Hill Nash dies December 6**

**Thursday, December 12, 2002 Christmas Cookie Recipes**

- Cashew Meringues**  
4 egg whites  
1 teaspoon vanilla  
4 cups sifted powdered sugar  
1/4 teaspoon cream of tartar  
2 cups chopped cashews or mixed nuts  
12 vanilla caramels-unwrapped  
2 teaspoons milk  
In large mixing bowl, allow egg whites to come to room temperature for 30 minutes. Meanwhile, grease cookie sheet and set aside. Add vanilla and cream of tartar to egg whites. Beat with mixer on medium speed until peaks form. Gradually add powdered sugar, about 1/4 cup at a time, beating on medium just until combined. Beat for 1-2 minutes more or until soft peaks form. Do not continue beating to stiff peaks; gently fold in nuts. Drop egg whites by teaspoonsful about 2 inches apart onto cookie sheet. Bake at 325 degrees for 15 minutes. Cool. In small saucepan heat caramels and milk. Place cookies on waxed paper and drizzle mixture over tops of cookies. If desired sprinkle with finely chopped nuts.
- Peppermint Meringue Cookies**  
2 egg whites  
1/8 teaspoon cider vinegar  
1/8 teaspoon salt  
3/3 cup white sugar  
1/3 peppermint candy canes-crushed  
Preheat oven to 225 degrees and line cookie sheets with foil sprayed with Pam. Whip eggs, vinegar and salt to soft peaks. Gradually add sugar while continuing to whip until stiff peaks form. Fold in 1/3 of crushed candy and reserve the rest. Drop by teaspoons onto cookie sheet. Remaining crushed peppermint may be sprinkled on tops.
- Peanut Butter and Candy Cookies**  
1-3/4 cups all purpose flour  
1/2 cup granulated sugar  
1/2 teaspoon baking soda  
1/4 teaspoon salt  
1/2 cup butter  
1/2 cup creamy peanut butter  
1/4 cup honey  
1 tablespoon milk  
24 miniature chocolate-coated caramel-topped nougat bars with peanuts  
In large mixing bowl, stir together flour, sugar, baking soda and salt. Using pastry blender cut in butter and peanut butter until mixture resembles coarse crumbs. Using wooden spoon, beat in honey and milk until combined. For each cookie, pat 1 tablespoon of dough into a 2-inch circle. Place 1 piece of candy in center of circle. Shape dough around candy to form ball. Place 2 inches apart on ungreased cookie sheet. Bake at 350 degrees for 12-15 minutes.
- Sesame-Pecan Wafers**  
1 cup butter  
2/3 cup sugar  
1 teaspoon vanilla  
1-3/4 cup all purpose flour  
1/2 cup sesame seeds  
1/2 cup ground pecans or almonds  
2 ounces semi-sweet chocolate  
1/2 teaspoon shortening  
In large mixing bowl beat butter with electric mixer on medium to hi speed for 30 seconds. Add sugar and vanilla; beat until combined. Beat in as much of the flour as you can with the mixer. Stir in remaining flour, sesame seed and nuts. Divide dough in half and chill. On lightly floured surface, roll half of dough to 1/8" thickness. Using cookie cutters, cut into desired shapes. Place 1" apart on cookie sheet. Bake at 375 degrees for 7-8 minutes. Cool. In saucepan combine chocolate and shortening; heat to melting and drizzle over tops of cooled cookies.
- Frosty Snowballs**  
1 cup butter-softened  
1/3 cup granulated sugar  
1 tablespoon water  
1 teaspoon vanilla  
2-1/4 cups all purpose flour  
1 cup chopped nuts  
1 cup sifted powdered sugar  
colored sugar crystals  
In large mixing bowl beat butter with electric mixer on high for 30 seconds. Add sugar and beat until combined. Beat in water and vanilla until combined. Beat in as much of the flour as you can with mixer. Using wooden spoon stir in any remaining flour with chopped nuts. Shape dough into 1-inch balls and placed on ungreased cookies sheet. Bake at 325 degrees for 20 minutes and cool. Place 1/3 cup of powdered sugar in small bowls and mix with sugar crystals. Roll cookies in desired colors.
- Chocolate-Covered Cherry Cookies**  
1-1/2 cup flour  
1/2 cup cocoa  
1/2 cup unsweetened butter  
1 cup sugar  
1/4 teaspoon salt  
1/4 teaspoon baking powder  
1/4 teaspoon baking soda  
1 egg  
1-1/2 teaspoon vanilla  
10 ounce jar maraschino cherries-drain and reserve juice  
6 ounce package semisweet chocolate pieces  
1/2 cup sweetened condensed milk  
In mixing bowl combine flour and cocoa and set aside. In large mixing bowl beat butter with electric mixer on high for 30 seconds. Add sugar, salt, baking soda and baking powder. Beat until well combined. Add vanilla and egg; beat well. Gradually beat in flour mixture. Shape dough into 1-inch balls and place on ungreased cookie sheet. Press down center of each and place cherry in center. In small saucepan combine chocolate and milk and heat until chocolate is melted. Stir in 4 teaspoons reserved cherry juice. Spoon about 1 teaspoon frosting over each cherry and spread to cover cherry. Bake at 350 degrees for 10 minutes; cool.

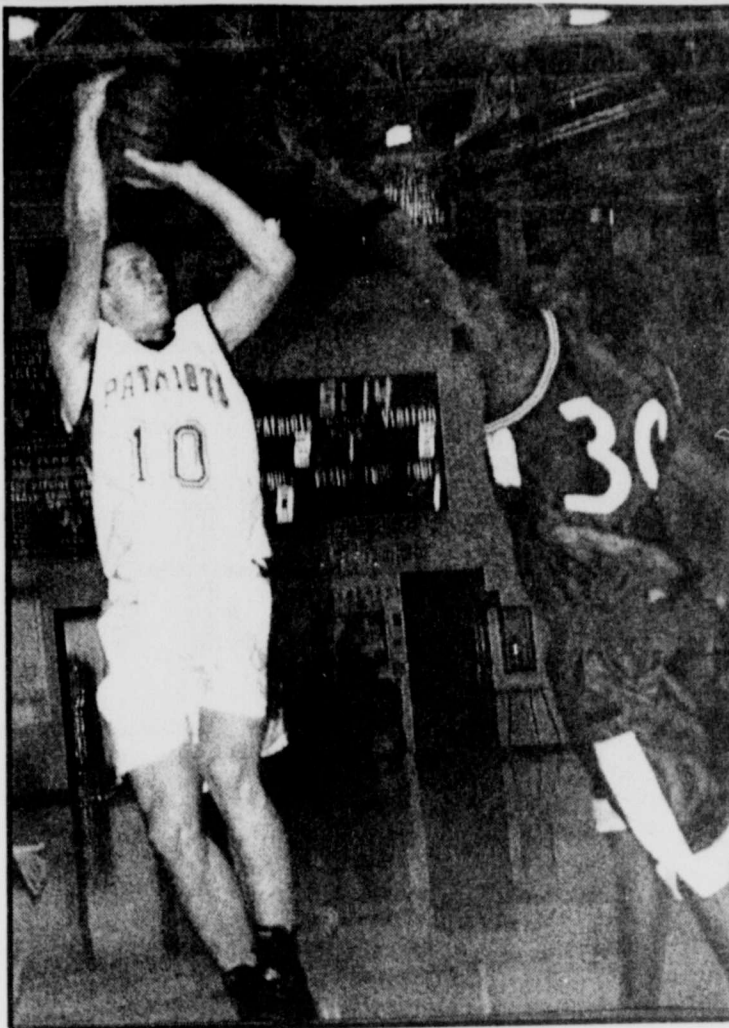

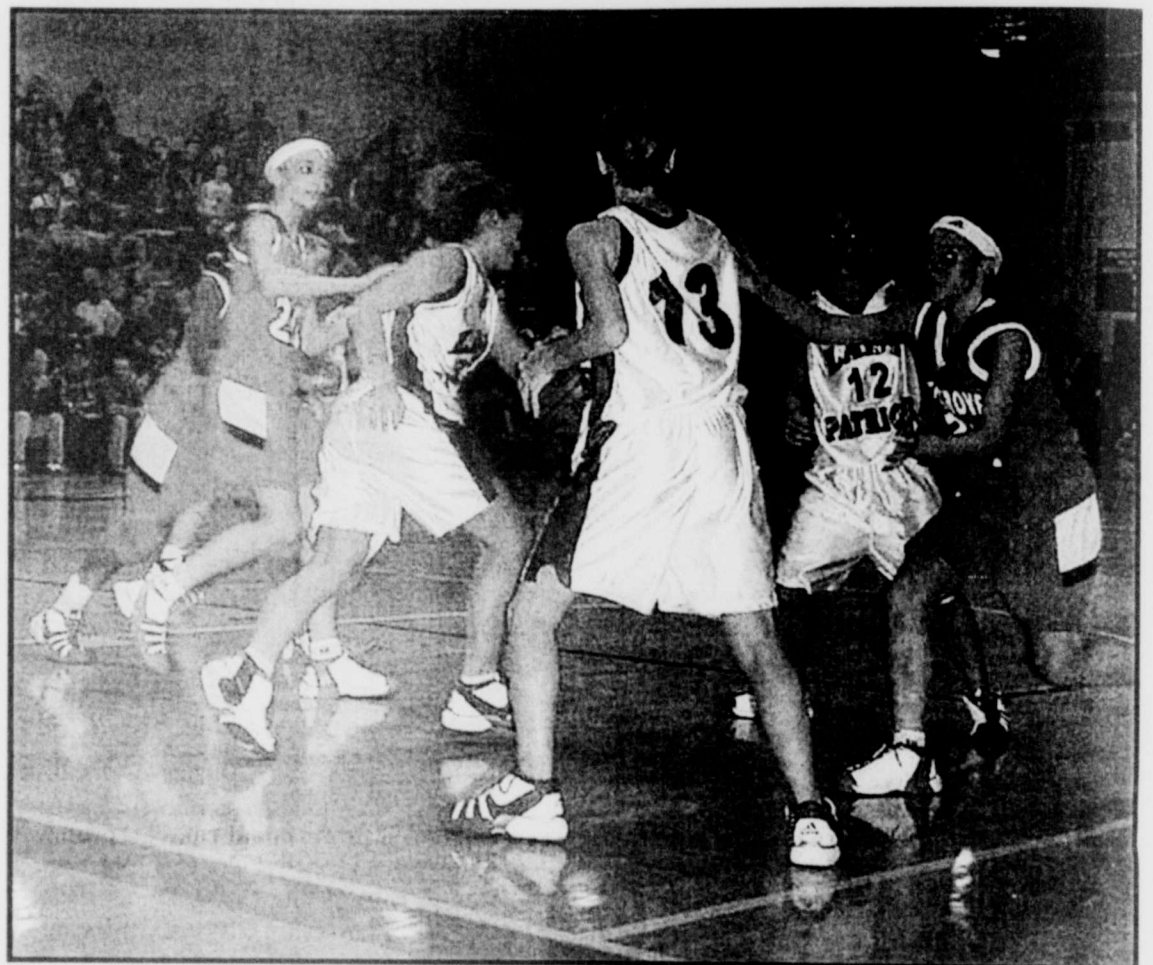
