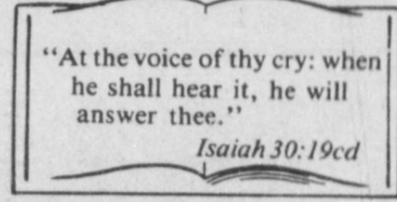

chairman; Clyde Slusher, Eugene and Geneva Norwood, and Charles and Leona Williams.

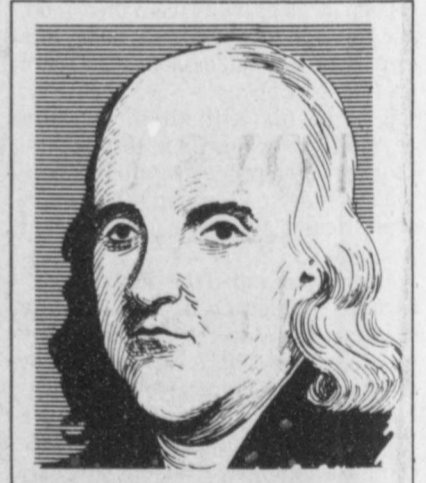

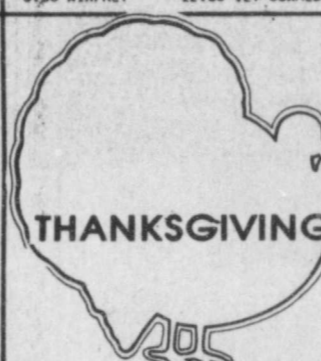

Dr. Jack Troutt, Years As A Community Leader

Dr. Jack E. Troutt, longtime professional and civic leader of Bogata still "whistles while he works" at his dental clinic on Main Street in Bogata. Due to the success of his practice, Dr. Troutt has been able to cut back on the hours he works and spend time enjoying several recreational hobbies such as fishing, golfing, quail hunting and working in his yard at his home on Highway 37 North.

This success that he has attained has been achieved by hard work, dedication and perseverance. "I'll have to give Mable a lot of the credit for my success," Troutt says with a grin. Mabel is his wife of 41 years. She was the former Mabel Theford. They have two children and a son, deceased. The oldest son, Jack E. Troutt, Jr. lives in Garland and is employed by the Dallas County Environmental Protection Office. He and his wife have two children. Their daughter, Janet

Troutt Weiler, lives in Paris and is a dental hygienist, working in her dad's office. Janet and her husband have one child. Leslie Troutt was killed in an automobile accident in 1975 on US Highway 271, southeast of Bogata. The tragedy was a great hurdle for the Troutt family, "and", says Dr. Troutt, "it was a long time before I could even talk about it, but time eases some of the pain."

Dr. Troutt grew up in the Powderly and Blossom areas and graduated from Paris High School in 1941 and from Paris Junior College in 1943. After his college graduation, he went directly into the army. During this time, his parents moved to Bogata and in 1945 he returned to Bogata from the service and married. Because of rating the highest score on an army test, Dr. Troutt was accepted at West Point. He attended there for a while, but left to pursue his education to be a dentist. In 1950 he

graduated from Baylor University College of Dentistry and served the next two years as a Captain in the Army in France as a dental surgeon for the NATO build-up, covering one third of France with his services.

In 1953, he set up a practice in the clinic with Dr. Brooks and worked there for two years. In 1955, he joined the Air Force and served the next three years at Eglin Air Base, Fort Walton Beach, Florida, with the rank of Captain, as a dental surgeon.

Dr. Troutt returned to Bogata and resumed his practice here in the latter part of 1958. He built the new clinic where he now has his practice in 1971.

Dr. Troutt has always been a dedicated civic and church leader. He has served on the school board for eight years, serving as president several of those years. He has served on the city council for ten years and is presently serving in that capacity. He has been a member of the executive board of the Boy Scout NETSEO Trails Council and served as the council president for two years. He was a Scout Master for twelve years, during which time 12 boys made Eagle Scout. He and his wife are members of the United Methodist Church in Bogata where he has served as chairman of the board two different times, he has served as Sunday School Superintendent, Lay Leader, and has taught Sunday School classes for 21 years. Dr. Troutt also served for two years as a president of the First District Dental Society.

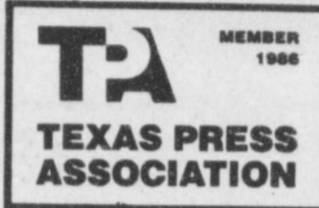

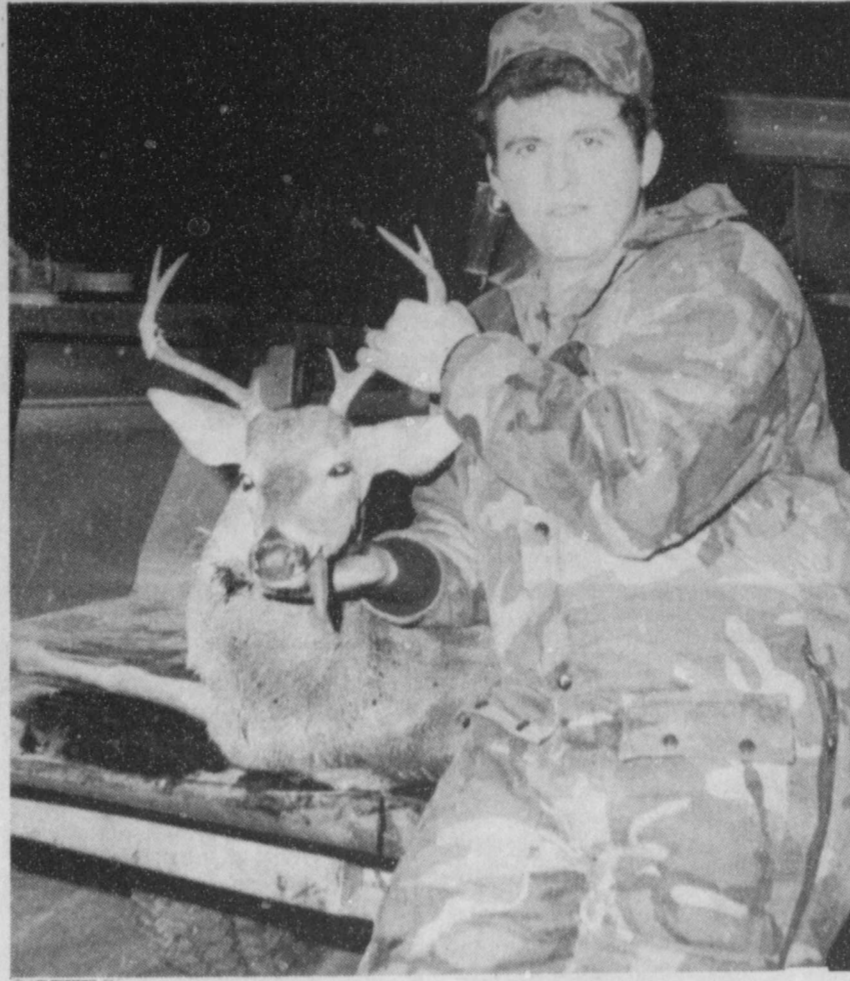

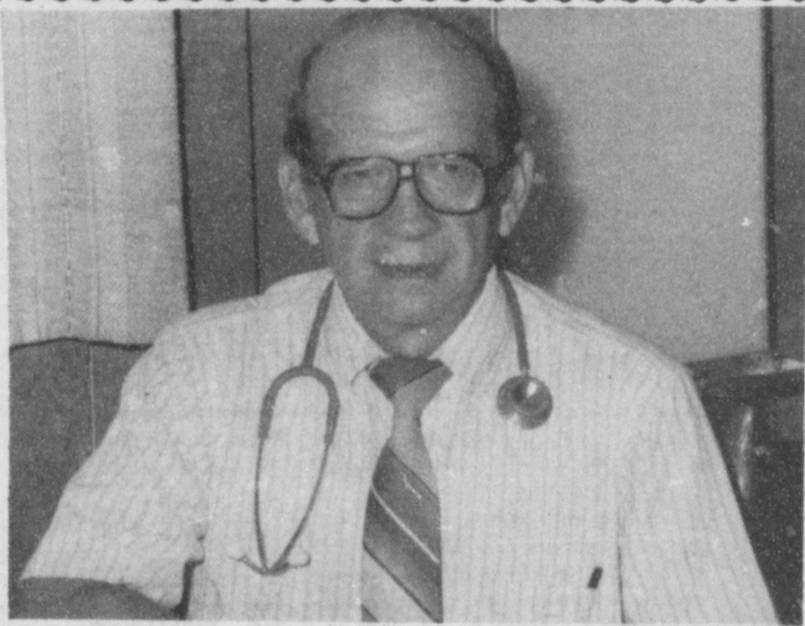
