## Burglaries, Robbery Plague Talco

The capitol building, Austin, Texas. A magnificent building, handsome, typical Texas...a little bigger than it has to be...just the way we Texans like it!

On our way back from Canyon Lake over the Labor Day weekend recently we decided that it was time for our friend's kids, now that they were old enough, to tour the state's capitol.

As we wandered through the halls and stared upward at the rotunda I began to realize that there was something very familiar about the "atmosphere" in the place.

As we progressed further I kept asking myself: Was it old granite? Was it old, polished wood? What was that elusive scent that pervaded the huge structure that was so familiar?

We trekked down to the basement in search of rest rooms. It was in the basement that the strangely familiar scent became strong enough for me to identify. Our state's capitol building smelled of Pine Oil Cleaner! I have no doubt that our nation's capitol smells the same way. This building smells exactly like very courthouse I've ever been in.

No, I haven't made a habit of appearing in court at the courthouse over the years. No unpaid parking tickets, no fines, no charges.

However we've stopped to wander through a lot of the historic and magnificent old structures throughout the nation.

Invariably, there are several scents that remain the same. That peculiar blend of pine oil cleanser, chalk dust (where does that come from?) dusty paper, old stone and carved wood.

It is very similar to the smell of school halls. Schools smell of chalk, pine cleanser and gym shoes. Even though many schools are new, brick and glass structures, they still have the same not-unpleasant aroma. Since chalk use is down, I'm not sure where that comes from.

But, I digress. My friend and I began to discuss this phenomenon as we left the stately building.

Where is it decreed that ALL courthouses and capitol buildings, and schools shall use only pine oil cleansers?

Is it some vast government contract extending from the smallest county in the smallest state all the way up to Washington D.C.'s buildings?

Or is simply coincidence that this particular scent of cleanser seems the most satisfactory for "institutional" use?

Or is it really cleaner? Perhaps

deep in the darkest, least accessible corner of the basement there is an enormous "air freshener", one of those waxey things that last for months in houses. This one would be magnified to gigantic proportions, in keeping with the size of the buildings?

Maybe when these buildings were built they took all the pine branches trimmed from the lumber and pitched them under the foundations?

Whatever the reason, it's almost a comfort to discover this pungent, if peculiar, form of continuity among our nation's most formal state buildings!

No matter how magnificent, no matter how overwhelming they may be, that subtle, common scent of pine trees is there. It reminds us that such buildings have to be cleaned and cared for.

I'd still like to know just who decreed it, though!

Over the Labor Day weekend, Talco Magneto was broken into and the person or persons attempted to break into the company safe. The dial on the safe was ruined but nothing was stolen. The thieves also broke into a coke machine, not knowing it had not been in use. Police are investigating the incident.

Saturday, Sept. 10 between 12 and 12:30 a.m., a winch truck was stolen from the yard at Hale Electric in Talco. At present, no report has been made of recovery of the vehicle. Police are investigating.

Also on Saturday night, a motorcycle was stolen from Mr. and Mrs. Jerry Russell's yard. Russell said the thieves apparently ran out of gas, as the motorcycle was found in the ditch in front of Hale Electric. Sometime between Friday and Sunday night, the Talco School Cafeteria was also broken into. The person or persons stole cases of ice cream, potato chips, Fritos, doughnuts and weiners. They also set off a fire extinguisher, leaving a huge mess for school workers. Principal Billy Joe Vickers said "Policeman Ricky Pool has some

leads on this and will be investigating." The thieves shot out a night light on the east side of the school and then broke a window in order to get in.

Also on Saturday night between 9 and 9:30 p.m., Mrs. Ocola Morris of Talco was robbed. Her grandson was in the back room asleep and it is common for her other grandchildren to come over. According to reports, someone knocked on the door and Mrs. Morris said, "Who is it?" Someone said "Troy" (which is the name of one of her grandchildren) and she asked again "who". This time no one

answered so Mrs. Morris asked "Is that you Lafayette?" and the person said "Yea." Mrs. Morris opened the door and someone put something over her head and said "Hand me that money." Mrs. Morris struggled with what she said was a young, black male with no shirt on. The man or boy

said "You want to die?" Still struggling, Mrs. Morris finally got breath enough to call for her sleeping grandson, Anthony. The intruder ripped off the pocket of Mrs. Morris' duster, which contained her car keys and \$500.00. While trying to get out the door, the thief dropped the car keys

but not the money. Grandson Anthony ran after him but only saw that he was a black boy or may wearing no shirt and had on blue jeans. The thief disappeared into the night. The police were called.

There have been several people in the area complaining of phone calls that, when answered, no one speaks, but hang up instead. This may be children playing with the telephones, but most of these disturbing calls have happened late at night. Everyone in the area should be aware of any suspicious activities at the local business or neighbor's homes, since there is no local police officer.

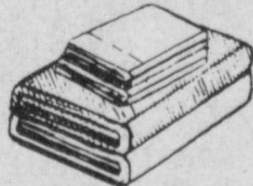

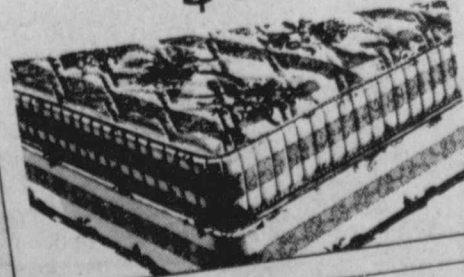

The Daughters of the Republic of Texas District III Workshop was held at the Holiday Inn in Sulphur Springs on September 10.

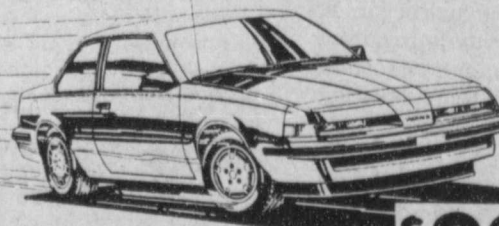

# Rebels Suffer Defeat At New Diana

Every football game has a pivotal point, a key play upon which the outcome of the contest hangs. In the Rivercrest Rebel-New Diana Eagle encounter Friday night, the swing play was a perfectly executed "flea-flicker" by the young, speedy and highly talented Eagle squad with 12 seconds remaining in the first half. The 44-yard score gave the Eagles a 20-6 advantage, and bruised the spirit of the Rebels, who had just closed the margin to a lone touchdown a minute earlier with a 70-yard march.

The Eagles controlled the ball most of the second half, and went on to defeat the Rebels by a 35-6 score.

Save for that single drive midway through the second quarter, the Rebels offense was severely hampered due to the absence of senior tailback Scooter Brown, who was sidelined with a toe injury. Three of the Rebels four first downs on the night came in that no-huddle drive, and sixty of their 111 yards rushing was accumulated then. The score, however, came on quarterback Bradley Wood's ten yard pass to wingback Jimmy Lewis with 1:27 left to play in the second

quarter. Senior David Stansell's first ever PAT attempt was just wide of the uprights. The running of fullback Marcus Savage and a 15-yard rumble by sophomore Shane Beers, set up the touchdown toss.

"We knew it was going to be a tough game," commented Rebel Coach Terry Giddens. "And that flea-flicker was a thing of beauty—and luck, because our defense had Crowe (Eagle receiver) upside down when he pitched to Jeffrey."

Giddens was not disappointed in the overall performance by the Rebels, and had high praise for the scrappy defense. An indication of just how tough the Rebels' defense made it on the Eagles is the fact that four of the Eagle scoring plays—three touchdowns and a field goal—came on fourth down situations.

Outstanding defensive play by the Rebels front line, especially Kevin Beene, and linebackers, particularly Craig Easley, both of whom were unofficially credited with seven tackles each, was offset by the length of time they were forced to play defense. Junior Jeremy Abshire, assuming the punt-kickoff return duties, had

excellent runbacks of 27 and 26 yards, in addition to his work at free safety. While senior Justin Roach also had an outstanding defensive game.

Asked about the injury to Brown, Giddens replied, "We are working with the trainer at ETSU to get him ready for this week. The toe will probably hurt him the rest of the season, but Scooter being a senior, really wants to play. We will just have to test it under game conditions; we will plan to use Brown when necessary."

The Rebels will travel to nearby Mt. Vernon Friday night to face the winless Purple Tigers, who were crushed by Hooks 41-0 last week. "The Tigers are more like Prairieband (the Rebels first game opponent) and we should match up better against them," Giddens stated in planning for the contest.

An interesting sidelight for the 8 p.m. contest will be the appearance of the Southern Methodist University 85-piece marching band. The group will perform on the square in Mt. Vernon at 6 p.m. at a "Tiger Tailgate Party", to which Rebel supporters are invited. The band will perform at half-time and will play in the stands after the game.

Tickets to the Mt. Vernon-Rebel game are on sale in the Rivercrest High School principal's office.

The Junior Rebels of Talco-Bogata will open their season at home Thursday night, coached by Shane Wilson and Ronnie Ross, at 5:45 p.m. The JV unity will do battle after completion of the junior high game.

The Rebel JV team won over the Honey Grove team last Thursday. The score was 24-6.

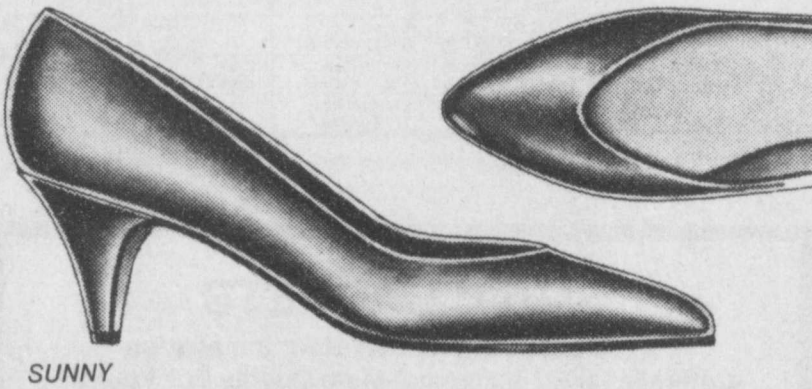

growth fund will be managed by a board of trustees consisting of four members appointed by the Governor and one member from and elected by the membership of each of the following: The Board of Regents of the University of Texas System; The Board of Regents of the Texas A&M System; The Board of Trustees of the Teacher's Retirement System of Texas; The Board of Trustees of the Employee's Retirement System of Texas; and the State Board of Education. The trustees may set the investment policy of the fund, enter into investment contracts, and take any action necessary for the creation, administration, and protection of the fund. The amendment authorizes the Board of Regents of the University of Texas System and the State Board of Education, in managing the permanent university fund and the permanent school fund, to acquire, exchange, sell, supervise, manage, or retain any kind of investment, including investments in the Texas growth fund. The fund will be phased out after the tenth anniversary of its creation, but the Legislature may create a second growth fund by a two thirds vote of each house.

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows: "The constitutional amendment to provide for the investment of the permanent university fund, the permanent school fund, and public employee retirement systems in the Texas growth fund created by the amendment, which will directly create, retain, and expand job opportunity and economic growth in Texas."

### PUBLIC NOTICE

BRIEF EXPLANATORY STATEMENTS OF PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS GENERAL ELECTION NOVEMBER 8, 1988

#### PROPOSITION NO. 1 ON THE BALLOT

Senate Joint Resolution 8 proposes a constitutional amendment providing that when the federal government reimburses the state for expenditures of state funds dedicated to acquiring rights-of-way and constructing, maintaining, and policing public roadways, such federal funds must also be used for those purposes.

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows: "The constitutional amendment and/or clarification providing that federal reimbursement of state highway dedicated funds are themselves dedicated for the purpose of acquiring rights-of-way and constructing, maintaining, and policing public roadways."

#### PROPOSITION NO. 2 ON THE BALLOT

House Joint Resolution 2 proposes a constitutional amendment to establish an economic stabilization fund in the state treasury. The fund would consist of one half of the unincumbered balance of general revenues at the end of a biennium and three fourths of the difference between the net oil and gas production taxes received in a fiscal year and the net oil and gas production taxes received in the 1987 fiscal year. During any fiscal biennium, the amount in the economic stabilization fund could not exceed 10% of the total deposited in general revenue in the preceding biennium.

The state comptroller and the state treasurer could decide to trans-

fer monies from the fund into the general revenue fund to alleviate a temporary cash shortage in general revenue. The legislature could make appropriations from the fund on approval by a three fifths vote of each house to make up the difference between anticipated general revenue and appropriations. On approval of two thirds of the members of each house of the legislature, the legislature could appropriate monies from the fund for any purpose.

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows: "The constitutional amendment establishing an economic stabilization fund in the state treasury to be used to offset unforeseen shortfalls in revenue."

#### PROPOSITION NO. 3 ON THE BALLOT

House Joint Resolution 5 proposes a constitutional amendment that establishes the Texas growth fund. All investments of the Texas growth fund must be directly related to furthering economic growth and employment opportunities in Texas. At least 50 percent of the fund must be invested in equity and/or debt security for the initial construction, expansion, or modernization of business or industrial facilities in Texas. Not more than ten percent of the fund may be invested in venture capital investments. Of the funds available for venture capital investments, not more than 25 percent may be invested unilaterally, and the remaining investments must be matched at least equally by funds from other sources. 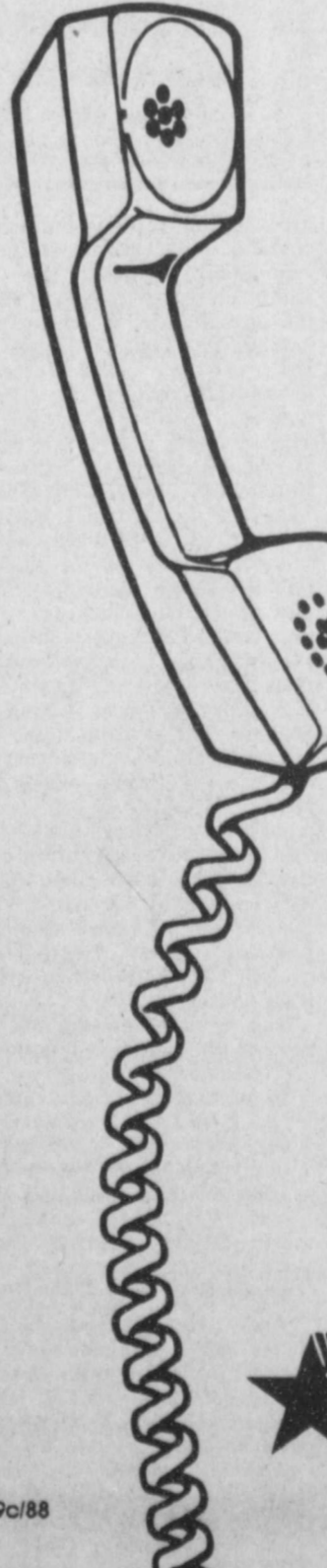



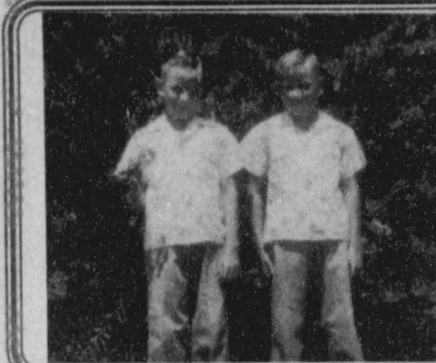
