Texas State Historian keynote speaker at chamber banquet

WINTERS- The Winters Area Chamber of Commerce is taking nominations for Man of the Year, Woman of the Year, Business of the Year, and Agricultural Fam-

O'Neal taught history for more than four decades at Panola College, which recently named its newest dormitory "Bill O'Neal Hall." For 20 years O'Neal conducted the state's first Traveling Texas History Course on a 2,100 mile itinerary across the Lone Star State.

In 2013 he was awarded an Honorary Doctor of Letters degree by his alma mater, Texas A&M University in Commerce. The chamber board is excited to have Mr. O'Neal as the guest speaker. Graduates complete approximately 200 hours of individual study over a four-course curriculum and attend eight two-day seminars for an additional

100 hours of classroom study. The curriculum includes selected texts and a number of special readings on the topics of public administration, election law, budgeting and finance, municipal law, and personnel management.

The Texas Municipal Clerks Certification Program, located at the University of North Texas, Denton, Texas, is a university-level professional education program for city clerks and city secretaries in Texas. The program is the third oldest of 33 such programs in the country.

The Certification Program is recognized and endorsed by Section 22.074 of the Local Government Code, Vernon's Texas Codes Annotated. In 1984, the College Board selected the Texas Municipal Clerks Certification Program as one of 64 exemplary professional development programs in the United

Texans at risk of tax ID theft

To coincide with Tax Identity Theft Awareness Week, the AARP Fraud Watch Network is launching an education effort to help people protect themselves from tax scams, releasing a new video, a tip sheet and encouraging people to take advantage of AARP's free tax preparation services.

Many taxpayers are putting themselves at greater risk of tax identity theft, according to a recent national study released by the AARP Fraud Watch Network in conjunction with the education campaign to help prevent scammers from stealing Texans hard-earned money.

According to the Federal Trade Commission, Texas ranks eighth in ID theft complaints. In this identity theft scheme, scammers electronically file a tax return under someone else's name to collect their tax refund. All they need is a birthdate and Social Security number, and many taxpayers make their personal information easy pickings by: Failing to lock their mailbox, leaving valuables exposed in their car, failing to destroy personal information.

To protect yourself and your family from tax identity theft mail tax returns as early in the tax season as possible, don't give out personal information unless you know who's asking for it and why they need it, shred personal and financial documents

Rains improve outlook but bring soggy fields

COLLEGE STATION- All of the state received moisture in one form or another during the last week, which generally benefited forages and crops, but slowed fieldwork, according to reports from Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service personnel.

Parts of the Central, East and Coastal Bend areas received from 3 to 4 inches since Jan. 20, according to the National Weather Service. From 1 inch to 1.5 inches was common for much of the rest of the state, even for parts of the Panhandle and Rolling Plains. The South, Far West regions and parts of the Panhandle only received 0.5 inch or less of moisture.

Hardly any agricultural producer would disparage the moisture, according to AgriLife Extension county agent reports, though the timing of the rain did make field operations difficult in some areas, including the finish-

ing of cotton harvest.

"Producers are digging out from the recent snowstorm this week of 4 to 10 inches," reported said Rick Auckerman, AgriLife Extension agent for Deaf Smith County, west of Amarillo. "The moisture is welcome, but the snow caused some travel problems, and getting feed to the livestock was challenging. The wheat crop is under the snow cover for the most part and makes an excellent insulator from the cold. The area's cotton crop is still out in the field with approximately 1,000 acres left to

"Recent wet weather has had farmers laid up," said Robert Ferguson, AgriLife Extension agent for Mitchell County, west of Abilene. "Most of them are done stripping but there are still a few who need to finish. There are still a lot of modules left in the yards; it will be a late

"We got up to 1 inch of rain on Jan. 22," said Rick Hirsch, AgriLife Extension agent for Henderson County, Athens. "Field conditions are saturated. Grazing of winter pastures were limited due to muddy conditions for some producers. Hay utilization was heavy for many

"We received anywhere from 1.5 to 2.5 inches of rain late in the week," said Heath Lusty, AgriLife Extension agent in Lampasas County, north of Austin. "It came



down fast enough to provide runoff in some parts of the county and refilled low stock tanks. Wheat and oat pastures look good and should really take off with warmer weather and sunny skies forecast this week.

The county has received tremendous rainfall in the past week, causing soil moisture levels to reach surplus in some areas where saturation was extreme." said Michael Haynes, AgriLife Extension agent for Caldwell County, south of Austin. "Pastures have begun to respond positively, and livestock conditions are also good throughout the county due to ample forage.

'Some warm, dry days permitted drying to begin but more moisture is in the near future," said Rogelio Mercado, AgriLife Extension agent for Jim Wells County, west of Corpus Christi. "Planting season is promising to be productive if farmers can get in the field to plant. Some may be behind schedule in applying fertilizer and

In West Central Texas, the region had mild days with above-average temperatures early in the week, but turning colder toward the end of the week with good rains and some snow. All areas continued to need more rain to fill very low stock tanks. Farmers were generally unable to work fields because of wet conditions. Cotton harvesting was nearly completed.




Weather Whys Q. This time of year, you hear about the "Janu-

ary Thaw." What is it?


A: It's a term that at one time was only considered folklore, but now we know there is some factual evidence to support it, says Brent McRoberts of Texas A&M University. "The 'January Thaw' refers to the period that often occurs around mid-January when cold temperatures take a break, and it is warm over much of the United States," he explains. "This is often especially true in the upper Midwest and the Northeast, when snow is on the ground from very cold temperatures in the early part of January. Dips in the jet stream and other factors make mid-January a prime time for milder, and sometimes, way above normal temperatures, hence there is a 'thaw' that occurs over much of

Texas Department of Insurance alerts of timeshare fraud

WINTERS ENTERPRISE STAFF REPORT

AUSTIN- The Texas Department of Insurance warns owners of timeshare vacation properties of a fraud scheme involving unlicensed title insurance companies. Consumers should always make sure they are dealing with properly licensed title companies and can contact TDI's Consumer Help Line at 1-800-252-3439 for assistance.

Timeshare fraud typically begins when a person contacts timeshare owners and either says they are representing a buyer or offers to help them sell their properties. The person sends the owner to work with a specific title company, but the company doesn't exist. The company address, phone number, and website are legitimate-looking but are all fake. Finally, the person asks the owner to send money to an account in Mexico and then disappears without providing any services.

"These fraudulent schemes typically involve a company that has gone by several different names, but none are licensed by TDI," said Commissioner David Mattax. "Timeshare fraud is a serious crime, which can cost consumers thousands of dollars.

TDI urges consumers to follow these tips to avoid becoming a victim of timeshare fraud:

Make sure any title company you work with is licensed or registered to sell title insurance in Texas by calling the TDI Consumer Help Line at 1-800-252-3439.

Know the company's exact name. Unlicensed companies often use names that are similar to the names of licensed companies.

Verify that the title insurance company you're using has a physical office with a real address and a working phone number. If possible, visit the office in person. Ask the buyer's representative to send you details in

writing about the services offered. Ask questions about expenses you are asked to pay up front. Seek a second opinion if the explanation is suspicious. If you are asked to transfer funds to Mexico, contact

the taxing authority in Mexico or an attorney to advise you.

The budget cuts mandated by the Budget Control Act (BCA) of 2011 pose a threat to national security and will substantially impact military pay and benefits. These automatic cuts, known as Sequestration, require that 50 percent of budget cuts come from Defense even though Defense only makes up 17 percent of the federal budget. These cuts were intended to be so punitive that Congress and the Administration would be forced to work together to find reasonable alter-

natives. Unfortunately, this has not occurred —Congress and the White House continue to be consumed with partisan bickering and have been unable to come to a long term agreement on the budget without sequestration cuts. Everyone is strongly urged to ask legislators to exclude Defense from sequestration. 
stop, the trooper discovered 29 bundles of marijuana along with the hashish in the vehicle.

THE IDLE AMERICAN America for me...

Commetary by Dr. Don Newbury

A candidate for political office — pontificating for the "umpteenth" time on the campaign stump spewed words at 200 per minute, with gusts to 250. At full bluster, he quoted the old line about "standing on the shoulders of others gone before.'

"If his shoulders are as slick as his speeches, you won't find any footprints on

'em," one critic muttered. This is, however, a great truth worth revisiting. Many shoulders of folks who've gone on — as well as those still serving in military and public service posts — have helped America "stay stitched" at a time when more values are on trial than we have enough gavels for....

Upon exiting movies recently — Unbroken, then American Sniper - I thought of this sobering quote. May God be thanked for others' shoulders on which we stand in a world where too many choose to hunker down.

"One nation under God" and other patriotic thoughts flooded. Immediately I remembered the band playing the National Anthem at a high school football game in Mineral Wells, TX, some 25 years ago. The entire stadium was pin-drop quiet. I was thankful for the reverence of the moment, and figured Fort Wolters, a long-time military base there, probably fostered this attitude of gratitude. (Mineral Wells' Vietnam Memorial Wall, with names updated annually as on the Wall in Washington, DC, attracts many visitors from throughout the state and beyond.)

A friend recently mentioned his understandable pride in his grandson, Spencer Seay. Spencer spent seven years in the US Army, including two tours in Iraq. He and wife Lauren — Cleburne resi-

dents and CHS graduates – were in Dallas for the national premiere showing of American Sniper....

Their experience warrants re-telling: Seated next to them in the sold-out theater were several teenage boys. They were boisterous during previews, and Lauren worried that they might spoil their outing.

At movie's end, she realized they had heard NOTH-ING from any of them — except for the several times they wept.

She lauded hero Chris Kyle — on whose life the movie centers — for his love of God, family and country. She recommends the book, too....

Also recalled was an organization called "Bugles Across America" (buglesacrossamerica. org). Founded in 2000 by Tom J. Day, BAA continues to expand under his presidential leadership. A Marine vet, he works passionately arranging for live buglers to play taps at funerals throughout the country. He and 7,500 other buglers play taps for burials — military or civilian — at no charge. (Day also has opened a museum next door to his

home near Chicago, IL.) Day himself has played taps at 5,500 funerals to date, starting with his drum-and-bugle corps membership at age 10. For years, alongside of him almost every time is his 32-year-old daughter who has cerebral palsy and autism.

If you want some "red, white and blue" cheer, visit the website. You'll be thrilled to learn more about these BAA patriots, ages 10-92. They are real live heroes of our Uncle Sam, even if few were born on the Fourth of July....

The first shot sounded strange. and on the second, the barrel exploded, sending the bayonet 15 feet into the air, "stabbing" the earth seconds later at the priest's feet. ("God, just help me to get taps right," Day prayed.) The rest went well. The family insisted on making photos. The priest laughed, saying he couldn't wait to get back to the rectory to tell the nuns about the bugler who almost killed


