Unemployment down in Runnels County

AUSTIN Texas employers expanded their payrolls in December with the addition of 24,900 seasonally adjusted nonfarm jobs, marking the tenth month of job increases for Texas in 2015.

Texas' seasonally adjusted unemployment rate increased to 4.7 percent in December, up from 4.6 percent in November, and remained below the national average of 5.0 percent.

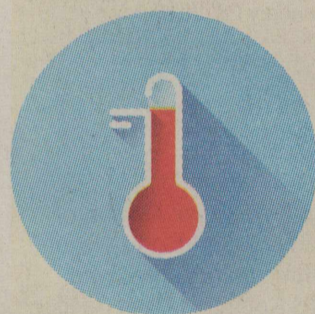
Unemployment in Runnels County went down from 3.7 percent in November to 3.4 percent in December.

The Amarillo Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA) recorded the month's lowest unemployment rate among Texas MSAs with a non-seasonally adjusted rate of 2.9 percent, followed by the Austin-Round Rock and Lubbock MSAs each with rates of 3.1 percent in December.

Man found with suspected meth lab

A Winters man who has been reportedly hiding from authorities since a suspected meth lab was found where he was living, was arrested Friday in Ballinger according to Sgt. Carl Squyres of the Runnels County Sheriff's Office.

On Friday Jan. 22, deputies with the RSCO received information from a property caretaker that a trespasser was believed to be in the residence located at 201 Hillcrest Ave. just outside Ballinger.

Runnels County deputies received information several days prior that the suspect involved in the suspected methamphetamine lab found in Winters on Jan. 8 had been staying at an unknown location in Ballinger to avoid detection.

On Jan. 8, Runnels County authorities located a suspected meth lab in the garage of a home in the 100 block of Jones Street. Upon arrival at the location that day, officers detected an odor emanat-

ing from the garage of the residence and ultimately found a slow cooker filled with sludge and items commonly used to manufacture meth.

Runnels County Sergeant Carl Squyres, deputies Steven Gray, David Sellers and Ballinger P.D. officers Willie Covington and Travis Baird converged on the location and after entering, located the suspect hiding in a bedroom in the rear of the residence.

Hundreds of students and parents converged on Ballinger High School Saturday, Jan. 23 as the Texas Computer Education Association hosted the regional Lego Mindstorm Robotics Competition there.

Throughout the day, students competed by showing their robots, which had specific functions, during the tough competition on the gymnasium floor at BHS.

The Intermediate Arena contest consisted of 76 teams from students grades 4-8. The winning teams for Area 15, were: Team Manual, Ozona Middle School, first place; Team Bert, Ozona Middle School, second place; Early #Power, Early Middle School, third place; M & M's Winters Junior High, fourth place; Early Thunderstruck, Early Elementary, fifth place and Early Taste da Rainbow, Early Middle School, sixth place.

There were 36 teams from students grades 9-12 in the Advanced Arena. The winning teams included The BranMuffins, Wall High School, first place; StormTroopersPlusPlus,

Superintendent apologizes for undercooked chicken

Students reported that undercooked chicken was served during lunch Thursday at the Winters ISD cafeteria.

On Friday, Winters ISD Superintendent Bruce Davis issued statements on behalf of the district apologizing for the food mishap.

"On Thursday, January 21 there was an incident in the cafeteria that occurred during our secondary lunch," Davis posted on the district's Facebook page. "It was discovered by students that the chicken served was undercooked. Upon discovery of the situ-

ation an announcement was made to students to not eat the chicken and to exchange the meal for another meal. This situation was isolated to the secondary lunch and a few students. Steps are being taken to ensure ...that this never happens again."

Davis insisted that the incident was isolated to the high school lunch, however, several parents posted that their elementary age children had complained of receiving the undercooked chicken.

Later on Friday, Davis issued a second statement.

"This batch of chicken was only served to the high school students,"

County hires new contractor for HOME project

Earlier this month, Runnels County Commissioners voted unanimously to hire a new contractor to complete the HOME project which began over a year ago in Ballinger.

The program is administered through the Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs and allows entities like Runnels County to assist in rebuilding affordable housing for residents.

The county hired Robbie Brewer of San Angelo to complete the project for \$47,000, said Runnels County Judge Barry Hilliard. The project is located at 705 11th St. in Ballinger.

James Joseph Mueller died peacefully at home surrounded by family on Jan. 20, 2016 in Ballinger at the age of 81.

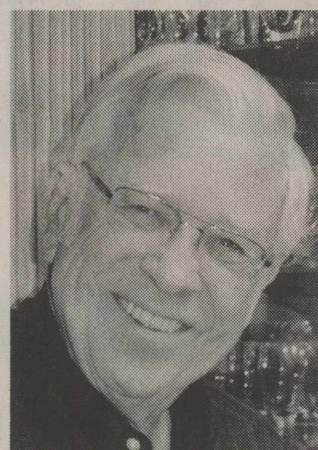

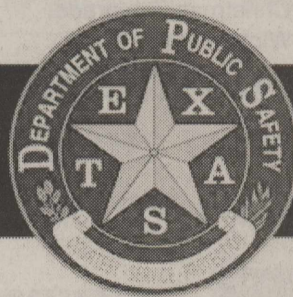
At a press conference in Albany, New York, U.S. Senator Kirsten Gillibrand (N.Y.) announced a new push to pass bipartisan legislation to ensure thousands of Navy Vietnam veterans are eligible to receive the disability and health care benefits they have earned. These "Blue Water" vets were exposed to the powerful toxin Agent Orange (AO) while serving off the coast of Vietnam and are currently ineligible for VA benefits for medical conditions related to AO exposure. Gillibrand is rallying support for the Blue Water Navy Vietnam Veterans Act (S. 681) legislation, which would clarify existing law so that blue water veterans would be fully covered by the VA if they served within 12 miles of the Vietnam

shoreline. Several local TV stations and local print media covered the event. Currently, veterans must prove they had "boots on the ground" in Vietnam or served on the "brown water" rivers of the country before the VA will presume they were exposed to the herbicide and provide disability benefits for diseases related to that exposure. Gillibrand's bill, introduced with Senator Steve Daines (Mont.) would presume exposure for blue water vets, allowing the VA to process their claims for service-connected conditions and alleviate a portion of the VA's backlog. Texas 10 Most Wanted fugitives captured in 2015

January designated as Crime Stoppers Month

AUSTIN - The Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS) announced today that 29 fugitives sought through the Texas 10 Most Wanted Program - including a record-breaking 20 sex offenders - were arrested in 2015 by DPS and other agencies. In addition, \$79,000 in rewards was paid for anonymous tips that resulted in arrests last year.

"The Texas 10 Most Wanted Program has proven to be a force multiplier in law enforcement's efforts to get offenders off the streets and solve crimes - thanks to the tremendous work by local, state and federal law enforcement entities," said DPS Director Steven McCraw. "The success of this program also depends on tip information from the public, and we are grateful for the vigilant citizens who continue to take a stand against criminals and sexual predators in their communities."

The 20 apprehended sex offenders are the most ever apprehended in a year for the Texas 10 Most Wanted Program, exceeding the previous record of 19 set in 2013. Other notable accomplishments in 2015 include:

- The \$79,000 paid in rewards is the second-highest total payout in a year.
- Arrests in 16 of the 29 total apprehensions were the result of tip information provided by anonymous tipsters.
- Three of the fugitives apprehended were sexually violent predators who were currently part of the state's Civil Commitment Program. (A fourth absconded sexually violent offender committed suicide before being apprehended.)
- Of the 29 fugitives apprehended, two sex offenders were extradited from Mexico, and three fugitives and four sex offenders

were extradited from other states.

■ Six of the fugitives apprehended were gang members from the following gangs: Texas Mexican Mafia, Crips, Bloods, Raza Unida and Texas Chicano Brotherhood.

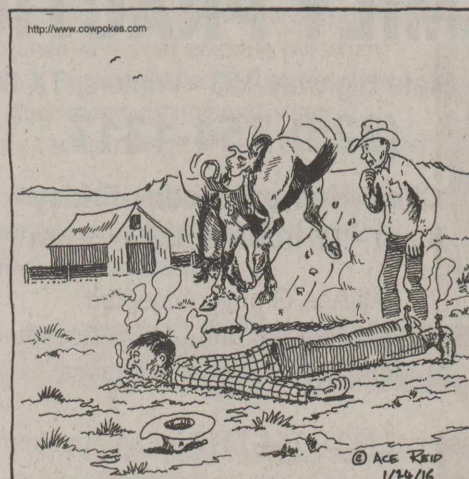

Davis posted. "This mistake was caught very early in the cafeteria run. There were only 10 servings that were actually served. An announcement was made in the cafeteria to return the chicken and to get another meal. Steps have been taken to ensure that all meats and items served are safe for our students. There

is a difference between in products and serving sizes for high school students versus junior high and elementary students. Elementary and junior high students were not exposed to undercooked chicken.

"As superintendent of Winters ISD, I accept the responsibility for the system failure and apologize for the incident," Davis continued. "Every step will be reviewed and a plan developed to ensure this does not happen again."

second extension from the TDHCA today in Austin. If the four-month extension is approved, work can begin to complete the home.

"Brewer said he can finish the job by May 4," Hilliard said. "I am confident he can do the work."

Currently, plumbing, insulation, floors and the roof must be completed.

"No matter what we've got to start working on that house and complete it," Hilliard said Tuesday.

In late October, Commissioners were informed that the contractor for the project would not be completing the project. The contractor, Jerry Reiner of Ameriway Construction of Kerrville, was the lone bidder for the project, which was to cost no more than \$80,000 according to the contract, Reiner signed with Runnels County Feb. 1. The first deadline for the house to be completed was Oct. 5. The county was granted an extension in November by the TDHCA and it was up Jan. 6.

In a letter to the TDHCA dated Oct. 2, 2015, Ryan Neville, representing Ameriway said the company could not complete the job due to there being only one house in the project and that subcontractors had to travel to work on the project and were not willing to work within the budget.

"...we have in fact gone substantially over our intended budget already in order to complete as much as we have," the letter stated.

Neville also expressed the company's willingness to complete the project upon the availability of contractors but said he would respect the county's decision.

According to the Runnels County Auditor's office, a total of \$63,986.50 has been spent on the project so far, which includes \$61,126.50 to Ameriway Construction.

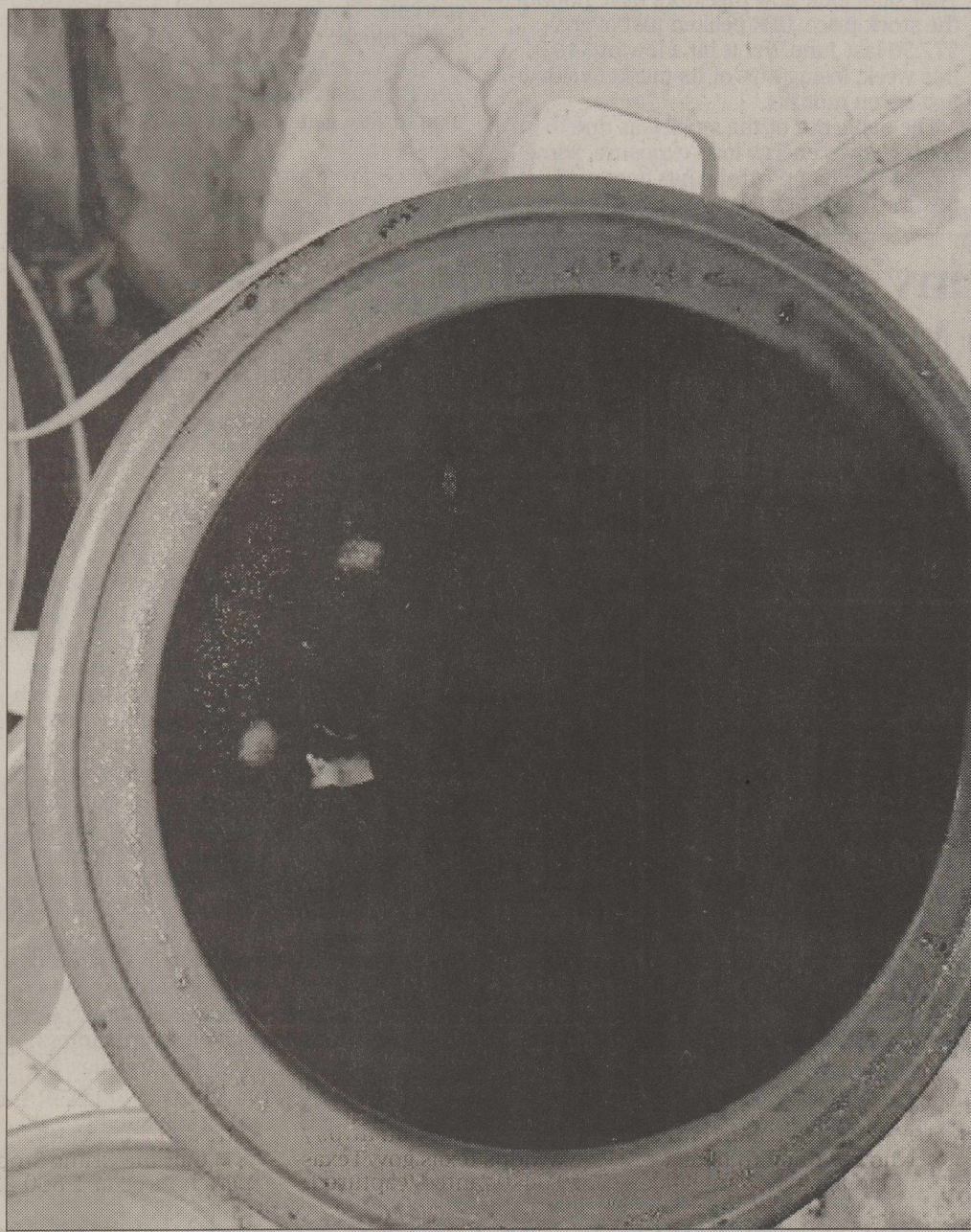
The Jan. 12 Commissioners agenda included a discussion on possible litigation on the case, but the item was tabled until a later date. However, Hilliard said the county's attorney Jim Allison of Austin, who is general counsel for the County Judges and Commissioners Association of Texas has sent a letter to Ameriway officially severing the county's relationship with Ameriway regarding the HOME project.

The county approved participation the HOME program a year ago, which allows for a resident homeowner to apply to get assistance in the reconstruction of their home. The homeowner must qualify for the program via income requirements and there must be no taxes owed on the property. If necessary, the homeowner may be required to participate in the construction providing sweat equity. Plus the homeowner is required to pay for the utilities during the reconstruction project. Plus, the homeowner must agree to live in the home for 10 years and pay the taxes, then the deed is turned over to them free and clear.

On Jan. 12, commissioners approved a resolution prohibiting open and concealed carry weapons at the Runnels County Courthouse. Signage has been ordered to inform the public of the court's decision.

In other business in January commissioners:

- Approved a contract between Runnels County and the Miles Preservation Authority.
- Approved a Dispatch Services Agreement between Runnels County and the City of Winters.
- Approved a fire fighting agreement between Runnels County and the City of Winters.
- Accepted donations of from the county's senior citizen centers.
- Approved budget amendments.
- Approved a request to trade in the Runnels County Sheriff's Office van.

Investigators also found another suspected meth lab and items associated with the manufacture of the illegal substance, Squires said.

The suspect, 24 year old Justin Hollis of Winters, was arrested and charged with burglary of a habitation, which is a second degree felony, bond was set at \$100,000. Hollis remains in custody at the Runnels County Jail.

Items relating to the manufacture of methamphetamine were collected from the residence and will be sent to the Abilene Crime Laboratory to be analyzed.

Additional charges are expected on both this case as well as the case from Jan. 8, once the lab results are received.

Supply and demand does not determine energy prices

Schulmberger Loses \$1 billion, slashes 10,000 jobs

Union Pacific Feels the Pain of Oil Slump

Southwestern Energy Shed 40% of Workforce

It costs lots of money to hire and train skilled workers and even more money to lay them off as they will collect unemployment benefits which are eventually charged to the company. But a trio of firms is bucking the trend.

Pioneer Natural Resources, Diamondback Energy (you gotta love a firm with the symbol FANG), and Parsley Energy raised \$1.8 billion during the falling stock market the past few weeks. I was reluctant to recommend embracing energy shares last week and then what I expected to happen, did just two days ago.

Oil prices dipped under \$28 and today (Friday) are trading at \$31.64. That is a whopping 15% jump. Our best trend indicator suggests we need a daily close over \$34 to reverse the daily trend. It would take a close over \$44.58 to reverse the

weekly trend from down to up. So we cannot be certain this last week was THE low.

But wait, how was this reversal possible? Iran was coming on stream, the Saudis would not curtail production, all the emerging economies which produced oil were still doing so, debt strapped US companies could barely pay interest on loans at such low prices so furious production continued. Yet oil turned on a dime and rallied the last two days.

The explanation is simply that supply and demand do not determine prices of financial commodities. Prices of financial instruments are determined by endogenous changes in social mood. Yes most of the so called analysts continually cite over whelming supply as the reason for lower prices. But they are helpless to explain an immediate trend change which is obviously not linked to a change in supply or demand. That is the fallacy of relying on supply and demand for oil as a basis for analysis. By

the way, such analysts overlooked the fact that oil was way over priced at \$100 when there was no lack of supply then either. Gee, economists claim more supply drives prices down. But oil prices stayed persistently high for a couple of years, an event this column began warning about over a year ago.

One can see the extreme mood when only 8% of the entire S & P 500 stocks are above their 50-day moving average, which is where that indicator bottomed this week. I rather imagine stocks will rally until that indicator reaches at least the 50% level. This is the same thing that happened after the August 24 low in stocks when the 50 day MA indicator had reached that same extreme.

Another case in point is the share price of perhaps the best managed bank in Texas, Cullen Frost CFR. By the way I bank at Frost and admire the company very much. That said, look how investors have pounded the stock price. CFR peaked just over \$77.50 last June. Yet it hit a low of \$43.91 this week, losing 46% of its market value in just seven months.

The panic out of the stock was due to concern over energy loan exposure. Some 16% of the loan portfolio has energy exposure. CEO Dick Evans on CNBC no less

stated the bank had examined its potential exposure and was not overly concerned. Well this past week Frost finally raised its loss reserves to a mere \$34 million on a total loan portfolio of \$11,248,577,000 yes that is \$11.2 billion. So the loss reserve is about 2.8% of total loans which seems perfectly reasonable.

But investors knocked the share price all the way back to, yes, the book value of \$44.32. Book value is literally assets minus liabilities divided by the number of shares out, what the company has paid itself to acquire what it owns. So the market over reacted. I suspect CFR at book value represents a fine value. But the shares could well fall again as bearish sentiment will return to the overall market. But this demonstrates what happens in severe bear markets. Stocks are trashed amid negative social mood.

Expect a relief rally for a couple of weeks and then more bearish activity to the downside for the general stock market.
