I am loath to give that term the dignity of being printed, because in my opinion it is inane, but to be fair, that is part of what caused me to write about it. If it were totally sensible, I might have just given my assent, but as it is disagreeable to me, I decided to condense in writing some of my thoughts about it. I am not opposed to the usage of portmanteaus, and have taken pride when I have developed some that were not previously in use, as far as I was aware. But when they are merely banal, as I think this one is, I find them irritating. What does nappuccino mean? It is a portmanteau based on the combination of the words "nap" and "cappuccino", and that is about where the logic ends. I believe it was coined (or at least popularized) by the author Daniel Pink, who has some good ideas, the usage of this word not being one of them. The idea is to consume a cup of coffee just before taking a nap, with the caffeine taking effect as you rise from the

Local COVID-19 Antibody Testing

People who have fully recovered from COVID-19 have antibodies in their plasma that can attack the virus. This convalescent plasma is being evaluated as treatment for patients with serious or immediately life-threatening COVID-19 infections, or those judged by a healthcare provider to be at high risk of progression to severe or life-threatening disease. Differentiating the Difference Between Antigen and Antibody Testing for SARS-CoV-2 (COVID-19) Virus

Immunology testing for some viral disease processes are sometimes difficult to understand even for medical professionals. Covid-19 is one such viral disease as it is a new disease with little known information for diagnosis and treatment.

What we do know is the Covid-19 antigen (infection) replicates rapidly when a patient's immune system is a susceptible (willing) host. The test for the Covid infection (Antigen test) is performed several ways through the mucous membrane of the mouth and nose. At Parkview Hospital we currently perform a nasopharyngeal (nose) swab for Covid-19 testing. For patient's that meet the CDC requirements for suspected Covid-19, the test is sent to the state laboratories in Lubbock. Specimens from patients who

have no symptoms and/or do not meet the CDC requirements for suspicion of having the virus are sent to LabCorp in Amarillo.

Testing for suspicion of a patient who possibly was exposed and had mild to no symptoms is called Antibody Testing. There are 3 antibodies that we can screen to see if a patient was infected and has built up immunity antibodies for the Covid-19 virus. The 3 antibodies are IgG, IgM, and IgA. Mostly IgG and

But does it need to be cappuccino in order to be effective? And does one take a nappuccino or drink it? A further complication is the fact that in order to make cappuccino, you need an espresso maker. Since very few people have such a thing in their homes, it would require a trip out, and I wish anyone luck in finding a place that will simply prepare a cappuccino without additives such as caramel or some other detrimental ingredient that diminishes the taste of the drink, while increasing

its price. Further, if you are tired enough to nap, is it optimal to be driving to get your specialized pre-nap coffee? And if you do drive to obtain the coffee, wouldn't the act of getting out and procuring it cause you to become alert

Social Life at the Turkey Track Ranch and Old Mobeetie ~ 1880's

Mrs. George (Mollie) Montgomery, wife of Mobeetie, Texas, postmaster described a "Big Dance" at the Turkey Track Ranch, (near historic Adobe Walls) which Mobeetie young people attended. They spent the first cold night at Miami, since the ranch was too far away to make the trip in one day. The Turkey Track cowboys quickly maneuvered the rigs across the Canadian River with their ropes:

"and took us across that river in record-breaking time and on a run up to the ranch house door where host and hostess, Mr. and Mrs. C.B. "Cape" Willingham, waited with a warm welcome for all with western ranch hospitality that made everyone feel at home. Did we have a dance? Just two days and nights. And

did we eat? We had Delmonico bested two to one, for our chef was none other than Billy Dixon, noted scout, Indian fighter and hero of Adobe-Walls fight.

Romance was in the air so it was quite natural one of the handsome Turkey Track boys should toss his loop over one of our prettiest girls; wedding bells were ringing shortly after for two couples at least who were at the party.

When we got home, we maybe looked and felt like the last petal of the last rose of summer in late twilight of a stormy day, but we wouldn't have missed it for anything."

The two-day celebrations on the 4th of July in early-day Mobeetie were famous in the Panhandle. As reported by

Mrs. Jud H. (Maggie) Bishop of Amarillo:

"The Fourth of July was a special time back in the late 1800's, equal in importance to Thanksgiving and Christmas. Folks from all around would go to Old Mobeetie in buggies. Mama would make me such pretty clothes for those times, and we'd dance and dance until we were all so tired.

The young men too, were impeccably dressed and held silk handkerchiefs in their hands while dancing to keep from ruining the women's new dresses with perspiration.

Everyone took lots of "eats" for the marathon dance sessions held in the Mobeetie courthouse. Lemonade was prepared in brand new cattle tanks bought especially for

the occasion and was kept cool during the hot summer days with 100-pound blocks of ice. And the ice cream - it was almost like a custard-tasted awful good too.

The jailhouse became a dormitory for the women on the nights of July 3rd and 4th, and the boys slept somewhere else while the girls giggled and talked their way into the wee hours of morning on these occasions."

Differentiating the Difference Between Antigen and Antibody Testing for SARS-CoV-2 (COVID-19) Virus

Immunology testing for some viral disease processes are sometimes difficult to understand even for medical professionals. Covid-19 is one such viral disease as it is a new disease with little known information for diagnosis and treatment.

What we do know is the Covid-19 antigen (infection) replicates rapidly when a patient's immune system is a susceptible (willing) host. The test for the Covid infection (Antigen test) is performed several ways through the mucous membrane of the mouth and nose. At Parkview Hospital we currently perform a nasopharyngeal (nose) swab for Covid-19 testing. For patients that meet the CDC requirements for suspected Covid-19, the test is sent to the state laboratories in Lubbock. Specimens from patients who have no symptoms and/or do not meet the CDC requirements for suspicion of having the virus are sent to LabCorp in Amarillo.

Testing for suspicion of a patient who possibly was exposed and had mild to no symptoms is called Antibody
