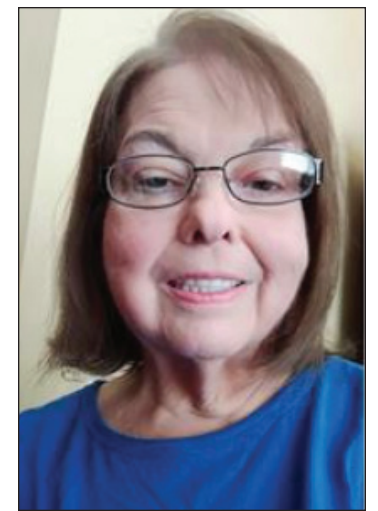

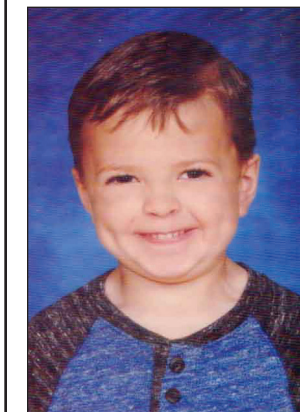

(from Page 1) been plenty of opportunities over the past several months, in which I could have slowly chipped away at processing the items in the box. I think the problem is that it looks so harmless, and frankly, neat, in the corner of the desk, which is out of reach unless I lean pretty far, that there seems to be no urgency, or any incentive to go through the box when the opportunity presents itself. It is a case of a great idea being implemented, without the

plan and procedure that would lead to realizing the benefit the great idea has to offer.

Why don't I have the habit of accessing the box and working my way through it? There are any number of ideas, and like many first-person dilemmas, the full answer is probably hidden from my view. My guess is that one of the chief causes is too much clutter in the surrounding area. For instance, there are items of immediate importance that never make it to the box, and it is a good thing they don't, given

my propensity of forgetting to access the box. These occupy their own pile on the desk, along with things that won't fit in the box, either physically or conceptually, that is, they are not the sort of thing for which the box is intended (here it might be worthwhile to consider thinking outside the box, with respect to the box.)

The reason this came up at present is because I sat down with the intention of dealing with the items on my desk, beginning with the immediate, and, after those were handled, moving on to processing some of the items in the box. That is, I sat down for the purpose of decreasing the volume of the box's contents, and wound up having written this piece (which happens to be as bland as the faded shade of brown that the cardboard box is made of) — the box justifies its presence again.
