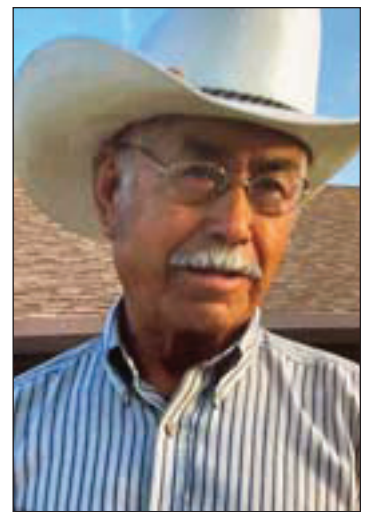

Merely Mustard

I have noticed for a while that the contemporary popular style of writing is a bit different than how I remember being taught. I recently read from a web site where the author/purveyor had posted something he had written. There were some attributes that irked me – not the least of which was the writer's style, which was so heavily-coated with a casual tone, and language which appeared so desperate for inclusivity that it

couldn't have been meaningful: anything of value necessarily forces a division, that separates the things of value from the things that are not of value. To appeal to both the valuable and the non-valuable is a fraudulent attempt at playing both sides of the line between right and wrong, between truth and lies, in the name of inclusion. The good, in such a scenario, is sacrificed in a vain attempt to justify the bad. Borrowing from

an adage, it is akin to throwing out the baby with the bath water. A secondary complaint is that the author employed contemporary (i.e. new-age) writing techniques that I found made the vapid content difficult to wade through. Having judged such methods, without having tried them, I have determined I will give them a try to see if I have mis-judged the style.

temporary writing is styled?
 Almost every sentence is its own paragraph, and is separated by the preceding sentence by a double-space.
 The same technique applies for non-sentences, that is, clauses that are meant to act as sentences but are not really anything, except some amorphous collection of words.
 Because they lack the essential components that comprise a sentence.
 A subject and a verb.
 You see.
 I was taught a paragraph must contain at least two sentences, and that a sentence must contain both a subject and a verb.
 Guess not.
 The preceding was not an imperative sentence, and should be interpreted as "(I) guess not," rather than "(You) guess not."
 I suppose each sentence needs to be its own paragraph

to highlight the importance of each individual statement.
 The problem with this approach is that not every sentence bears the same weight, and by isolating each sentence as its own, independent claim, it makes it increase the difficulty for the reader to distinguish those that do possess gravity from those that don't.
 Or maybe the piece I was reading had no gravity at all.
 Maybe the double-space technique is for the purpose of filling blank space, to give the appearance of having written a large amount.
 Like pouring a slab of concrete, where half the volume of the form was filled with bags of air.
 I am now concluding this exercise.
 I feel the novelty of having tried something contemporary, and dissatisfaction from its lack of substance.
 My apologies to the trees who suffered as a result of this.

Elimination of the Pronghorn Experimental Season

In March, the TPW Commission voted to eliminate the experimental pronghorn buck season in the northern Panhandle and replaced it with the general pronghorn season that was expanded from 9 to 16 days statewide.

Staff proposed the cancellation of the experimental pronghorn buck season because of deleterious effects from the intensive buck harvest for eight hunting seasons that caused unnatural sex ratios and buck age structure. In addition, landowner and hunter favorable opinions regarding the experimental season declined through time. With the elimination of the experimental pronghorn buck season, TPWD staff will return to issuing buck permits to landowners or agents based upon survey and harvest data from each herd unit. Therefore, landowners or agents within the past experimental areas must now apply for pronghorn

permits in the new Land Management Assistance (LMA) online application.

To apply for pronghorn permits in LMA, interested applicants must create a user account on the LMA website <https://lma.tpwd.state.tx.us/> and then register your property. Please contact your local biologist if you need any assistance with applying for pronghorn permits.

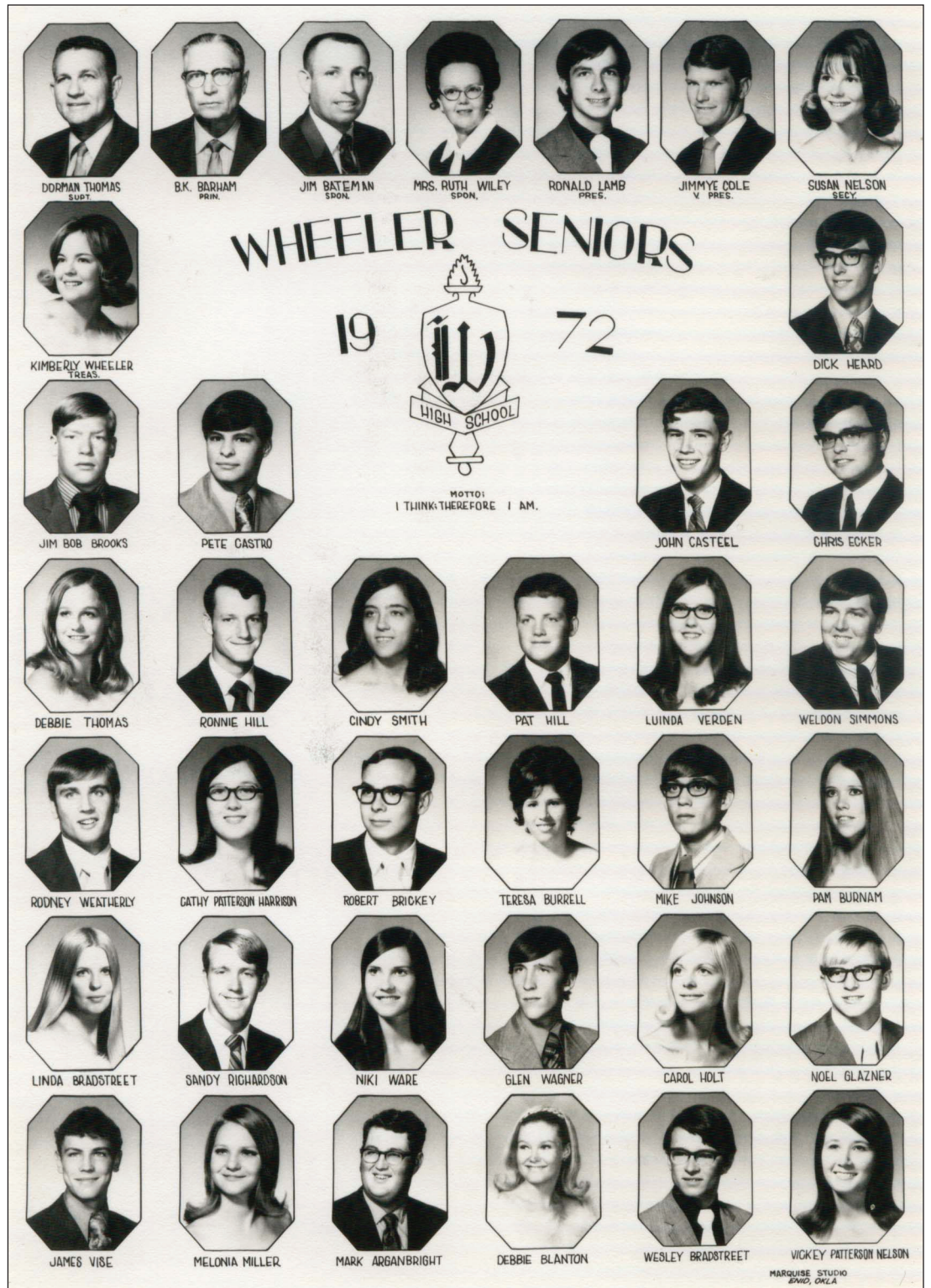
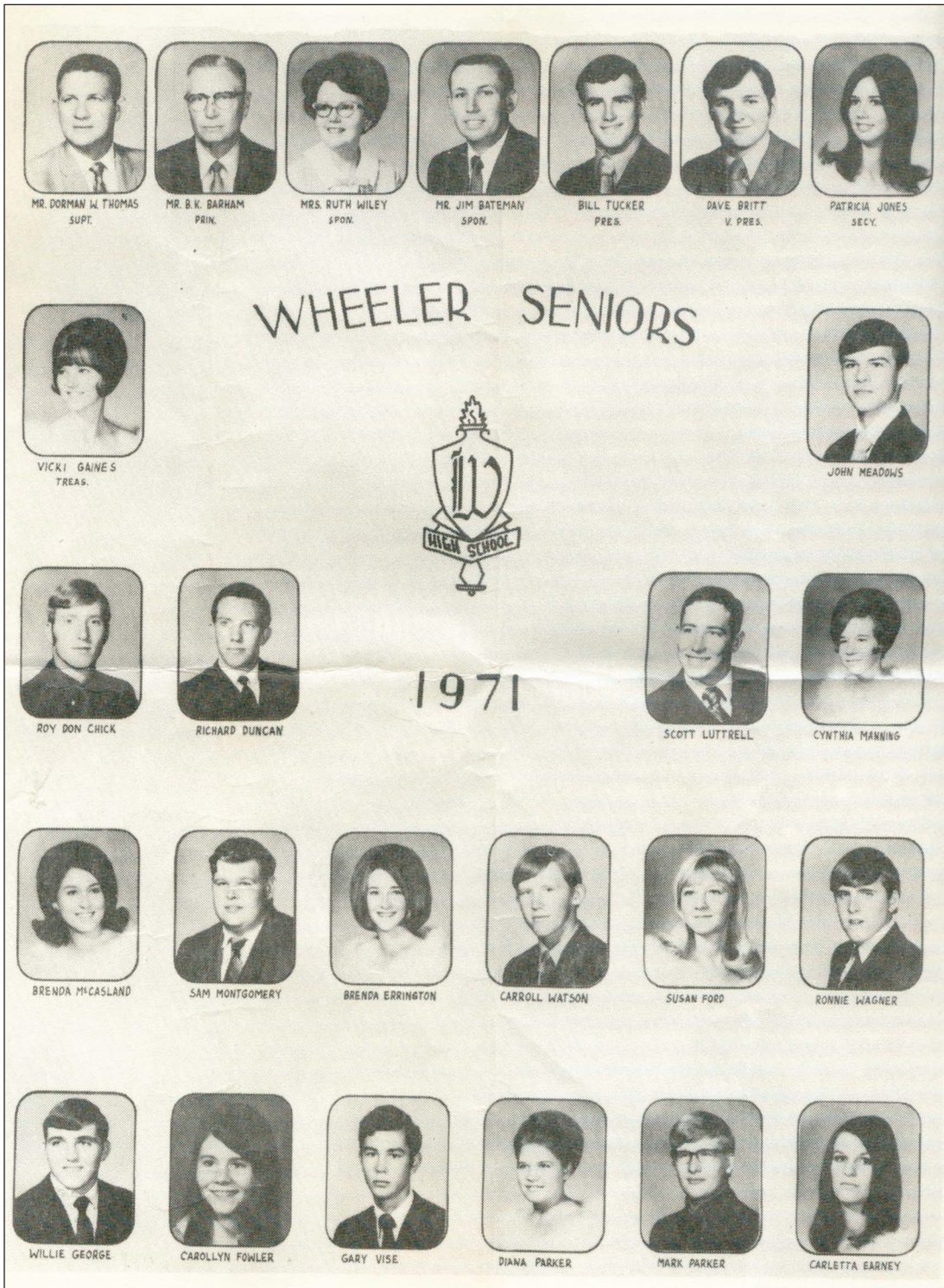
