## Co. Tax Rate Increase Approved By 3-2 Vote

The Commissioners' Court of Wheeler County, Texas, met in regular session on Monday, August 23, 2021, at 9:00 a.m., in the Commissioners' Courtroom at 401 Main Street, Wheeler, Texas, to consider prior bills and discuss matters of mutual concern and to take action on the

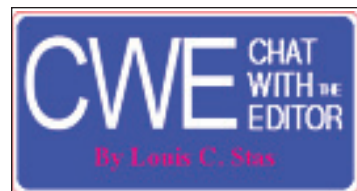
items on the agenda. At 9:00 a Zoom meeting was presented with Grantworks, regarding American Rescue Plan Act Grant. At 10:00 court was reconvened to address the 24 items on the agenda. There were no minutes. The treasurer's reports

were accepted as presented. There were no Budget Amendments. There were no Budget Transfers. There were no Line Action Transfers. Number 12 on the agenda was moved forward. It was the following change in the

Wheeler County Policy Manual: A change was approved by the commissioners in the Wheeler County Policy Manual. No action was taken on the Burn Ban. Troy Potts, Shamrock City Manager, requested the court

release a piece of property in Shamrock which was taken off the tax rolls several years ago, when it did not sell in a Sheriff's Auction. The proposal was voted down as the property had not been put up for bids. Sherri Jones, District Clerk was given permission

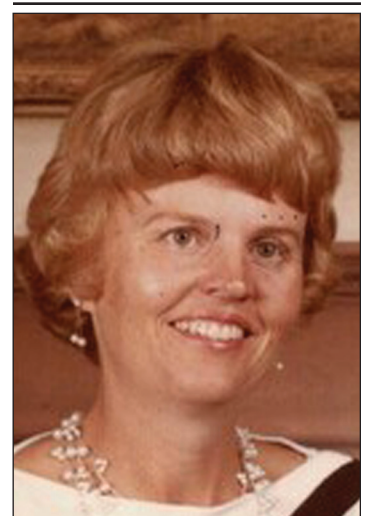

is a handy way to encourage people to buy a new non-supported, soon-to-be-obsolete, made in China but priced in America product. And to that I say, "No thanks." There are many other manufacturers than Apple – many times you could buy two or three of their competitors' products for the price of an Apple product. And if Apple will hang its customers out to dry after a few years, I see no benefit to owning one of their products.

I took solace that my non-functional computer was acquired at roughly an 85% discount. It was a second-hand, or perhaps a third or fourth-hand device that had been used by others (reputable owners – I would recommend never purchasing a secondhand device that was going to be connected to the Internet or a cellular data plan without knowing and being comfortable with the prior owners) before I acquired it. And it served me well for the duration it functioned for me – I enjoyed it quite a bit. But until Apple changes a number of its practices, I do not intend to purchase any of their products. Just like I never intend to buy a Macintosh apple, in my view the least appealing of all the varieties of apple, but that is more for taste and texture reasons than association with the tech company du jour.

- Approval was given by the court to purchase a software/license from Vista Solutions Group LP in the amount of \$12,600 for use by County Auditor and Treasurer for additional space to keep county records.

- Julie Boydston was moved from a part-time employee in the Sheriff's Department to a full time employee at a salary

of \$3284.46 monthly, effective 9/1/2021.

- Brandy Haynes was added to the payroll of the Wheeler County Sheriff's Department as a part-time Jailer/Dispatcher, effective 8/26/2021 at an hourly rate of \$15.00/hour.

- LeighAnne Cook was added to the County Sheriff's payroll as a part-time Jailer/Dispatcher, effective 8-23-2021 at a hourly rate of \$15.00/hour.

- Sheriff Johnny Carter was given permission to transfer \$4,500 from supplies to uniforms.

- The Sheriff and Constable service fees will remain the same for 2022.

- The meeting was open for discussion on the Budget. The county auditor went over the proposed budget. There were no comments from those in attendance and the budget was passed.

- No raises are to be given county employees. The budget for salaries will be \$70,095.00; the increase allowing for employee longevity and number of employees.

- The Tax Rate was raised to 0.56152. A protest to the increase was presented: "With our \$13 million in reserves (drawing no interest) what is the need to raise the rate?" It was pointed out that the rate was not raised last year, causing over a million dollars to be used of the reserve. And the reserve is for cover unforeseen expenses, lawsuits and uncollected taxes. After a long pause John Walker, commissioner Pct. 4, made the motion to approve the increased tax rate and Bob Hink, commissioner, Pct. 2, seconded. Jackie Don May, Commissioner, Pct. 1 and David Simpson, Commissioner, Pct.3, voted against raising the tax rate. Judge Carol Porton voted in favor of the motion, breaking the tie. Voice votes were recorded in the meeting's minutes.

- County Clerk Margaret Dorman informed the court of the consolidation of County Voting Boxes for the upcoming Constitutional Amendment election. Shamrock will be holding a Bond Election at this time. The consolidations will be announced as a legal notice prior to the election.

- The court approved the agreement with AirMed Care for air ambulance benefits available for employees and their immediate families.
- The court voted to pay the bills in the amount of \$113,185.20.

Commencing in March 2020 and continuing through the current date, the Covid-19 Pandemic has posed an ongoing public health concern, putting at risk Wheeler County employees who perform essential functions and tasks to ensure the continuation of services and public access to these services through continuous operation of governmental offices/departments within the Wheeler County operational system. Wheeler County recognizes that all county employees, in each department, are essential for the continuing operation of government essential functions and infrastructure, and as such, it is the purpose of this policy to recognize and designate the following department employees and supervisors as essential workers. to all essential workers regardless of race, creed, religion, gender, or sexual orientation, and Wheeler County will ensure that such premium pay prioritizes compensation of those lower-income eligible workers who provide essential duties.

Premium payment allocations and timeline for payment of such premium pay will be determined by the Commissioners Court prior to issuance of such payments and upon input and supporting documentation from each department supervisor, as may be required by the Court, to confirm eligibility of each worker for such premium payments. The Commissioners Court may amend and update this policy as needed to provide the most equitable distribution of the premium pay program to all eligible Wheeler County employees. (08/23/2021)

Premium pay to eligible essential workers may be paid retrospectively (commencing April 1, 2020) for prior work performed, as well as prospectively for current or on-going work.

Wheeler County is an equal opportunity employer and will provide such premium pay in an equitable and fair manner pursuant to the guidelines provided in the American Rescue Plan Act, with such premium payments provided

In addition, the above-designated essential worker positions will be eligible for premium pay per the provisions of the American Rescue Plan Act, with such premium pay compensation to be determined by the Commissioners Court, with input from each department supervisor, per the terms set forth in the Act, including but not limited to the following:

1. Premium payments of \$13.00 per hour that are paid to eligible essential workers, in addition to wages or remuneration the eligible essential worker otherwise receives for all work performed by the eligible worker during the Covid-19 public health pandemic.
