Wheeler County Commissioners' Court

\$75,227.51 Paid In Overtime For 20-21

The Commissioners' court of Wheeler County, Texas met in regular session on Monday, September 27, 2021, at 9:00 a.m., in the Commissioners' Courtroom of the Wheeler county Courthouse at 401 Main Street, Wheeler, Texas, to consider prior bills and discuss matters of mutual concern.

Court was reconvened to take action on the 20 items on the agenda.

- The treasurer's report was accepted.

- There were no budget amendments.

- There were no budget transfers.

- The line item transfers were approved.

- No action was taken on the Wheeler County Policy Manual.

- Stage One of the Burn Ban remains in affect.

- The court approved the employee compensatory hours and comp time payouts for September 30, 2021. Of the \$75,227.51 paid out for overtime, \$38,949.33 was for the Sheriff's office and \$22,641.60 was for the Jail. The remainder was Road and Bridge.

- The court approved distributions of the Annual Supplement for FY 2021-2022. The amount of \$132,00 is for groups and organizations

Consent Agenda. Janie VanZandt seconded the motion; vote was unanimous.

3. EMS REPORT – Ray Jennings - Ray reported that several communities are struggling to have enough Medic Units as well as EMT's and Paramedics. Also, there are issues with the national and international supply chain. Medical facilities are experiencing significant staffing shortages. The Ferno iNX stretcher for Medic 3 will be installed this week. Promoting the GROW YOUR OWN philosophy, Tandy Drake is starting Paramedic School, and Ray is searching for someone to send to EMT school. He reported that they are trying a 30-day free trial with Tango, a cellular push to talk system. It provides a cradle point cellular radio which is connected to one of our mobile radios. Medics 1 and 2 are getting older and having some issues. Tyler Pitman is leaving to move to Houston, being closer to family. Ray indicated that he wants to keep the positive trajectory as the EMS team continues to grow personally and professionally. He stated that the Ambulance

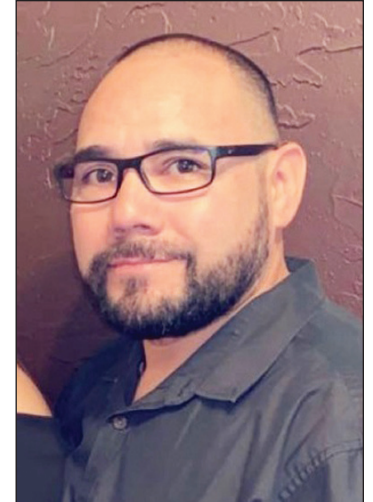

The article stated that we are currently in the harvest phase of the year, when fruits and grains are naturally abun-

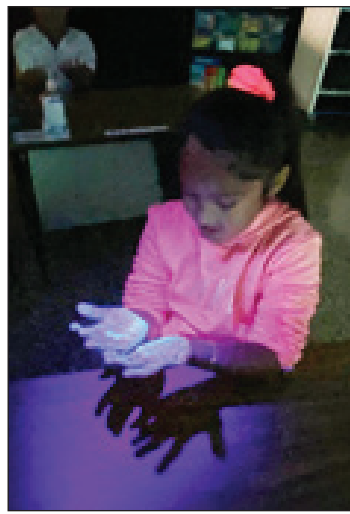

8. NEW BUSINESS:

- a. Education - Level IV trauma center criteria - Monica distributed information on the criteria for Trauma Center Levels. Parkview Hospital is currently a Level IV trauma center, but the criteria are changing, making it stricter. She also distributed information about the different types of hospitals, including their functionality and size. Parkview is a Critical Access Hospital. Monica indicated that as an Advanced Trauma Life Support (ATLS) facility, we get reimbursed \$70,000 from the Tobacco Settlement, plus \$5,625 from Un-compensated Trauma (UC) care. The latter will pay for our fees (\$500 application fee plus \$5000 for the survey to verify that we meet the criteria). Roger Brown made the motion to apply for Level IV Trauma Center. Pam Hibler seconded the motion; vote was unanimous. The governing body empowers the trauma medical director and the trauma program manager with the authority to lead the program. Dr. Lonnie Miller will be the Trauma Medical Director, and Carissa McCarter will be the Trauma Program Manager.

Grazing Lands Conference Dates

Grazing Lands Focus of Upcoming National Conference
Early Registration ends
October 15, 2021

September 27, 2021 -- Early registration for the 8th National Conference on Grazing Lands, hosted by the National Grazing Lands Coalition (NatGLC), will end on Oct. 15, 2021. Attendees for the Dec. 6-9 conference in Myrtle Beach, South Carolina, can register for \$395 prior to Oct. 15 and \$475 after that. To register for the conference, visit <https://cvent.me/4BMkbg>.

Featured speakers at the conference include:

- Rep. Glenn Thompson (invited) of Pennsylvania, ranking member of the House Agriculture Committee
- Meredith Ellis of G Bar C Ranch, Rosston, Texas

The second day will begin with a panel discussion on mental health in agriculture. Three agricultural producers will explain how to recognize the signs of distress and how to get help. Panelists are Ryan Sexton, rancher from Nenzel, Nebraska; Jessica Peters, dairy farmer from Meadville, Pennsylvania; and Terri Hawbaker, dairy farmer from Pewamo, Michigan.

Participants can also choose from more than 60 concurrent sessions that cover a wide range of grazing lands issues.

On Dec. 9, participants have training and tour options available:

- Regenerative Grazing: A Deep Dive presented by Dr.

Allen Williams, farmer from Winston-Salem, North Carolina, and founding partner of Grass Fed Insights, LLC.

- Grazing 101, Record Keeping and Soil Testing Training will occur at the Thompson farm in Conway, South Carolina.
- Agrotourism presentation at the Thompson Farm and a beef cattle operation tour.
- Social Media Training
- Hopswee Plantation in Georgetown, South Carolina.

NatGLC is also making two scholarships available, the Lynn Myers and Hezekiah Gibson Memorial Scholarships. Each scholarship will provide \$500 to cover conference attendance costs; application deadline is Oct. 15. The scholarships are supported by proceeds from the silent auction. growing season before having to scrounge over the winter. This seems particularly true for herbivores and omnivores.

I find the concept to be easy to grasp, but in practice it is a

bit less clear. With grains and fruits being available year-round because of the practice of sourcing them from the southern hemisphere as needed, or growing them in hot houses, a natural break in the availability of these foods is no longer present. So if one

wished to practice this method of eating, it would require more of an intentional effort, when compared to our ancestors thousands of years ago.

I didn't examine the feasibility of my following the seasonal eating concept on a personal level, but I used it to

justify my consumption; in the past 24 hours I've enjoyed oats with berries, pancakes and butter; a bacon and chicken sandwich followed by goulash (which seems to be something that may have been served in a gulag; I don't believe gulags possess any bearing concerning the derivation of the name goulash - it may be just the phonetic similarities, in conjunction with my general feelings toward the dish, but that is what it is evocative of to me) and watermelon; pizza, salad, and more watermelon; and four eggs, two muffins with butter and olive oil, and a whole bunch of pistachios.

I am a bit mortified to consider this column has become a food diary, although it may be that a food diary is more enlightening than some of the dross that has been printed under this banner; nevertheless it seemed appropriate, or at least not inappropriate, that conformity with the seasonal eating concept be demonstrated, if I were to bother writing about it. Or perhaps it is a retrospective rationalization. Regardless, enjoy the harvest.

September Is National Food Safety Education Month; Illness, Poisoning

September is National Food Safety Education Month. Foodborne illness, or food poisoning as it's more commonly known, affects roughly 48 million Americans every year, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. Food poisoning can affect anybody, but older adults, children, pregnant women, and those who are immunocompromised are more likely to suffer from a foodborne illness.

Food poisoning can pose a serious risk to you and those around you, so what can you do to keep everyone safe? The Food and Drug Administration (FDA) offers four simple steps you can follow to prevent foodborne illnesses:

- Wash hands and surfaces often. Washing your hands, cooking utensils, countertops, and fresh produce can help prevent foodborne illness. When preparing a meal, you should clean each item that was used with warm water and soap to get rid of any bacteria that might be left behind. For canned goods be sure to clean the lid before opening.

- Separate raw meats from other foods. In order to stop cross-contamination before it even happens keep your raw meat and fresh produce separate at all times. When shopping, keep meats, poultry, and seafood in separate parts of the cart and in separate bags for the journey home. Keep raw food away from produce in the refrigerator and when cooking always use different cutting boards and utensils for raw food and produce.

- Cook to the right temperature. The best way to eliminate bacteria in food is to heat it up. When cooking raw meat, poultry, or seafood, use a meat thermometer and follow the FDA's minimum internal temperature guide to ensure your food is safe to eat. Eggs should only be eaten when both the whites and yolk are firm, and recipes with uncooked egg should be avoided. If you're using a microwave, make sure the dish is rotated and stirred during cooking, and soups, sauces, and gravy should always be boiled before eating.

- Refrigerate foods promptly. Before and after cooking food should always be refrigerated or frozen to keep it safe to eat. Raw meats should be refrigerated within two hours of cooking or purchasing, and an appliance thermometer can help you make sure they're chilled to the right temperature. When you need to thaw food, choose methods like the microwave or cold water, rather than thawing at room temperature; and always marinate your meats in the refrigerator.

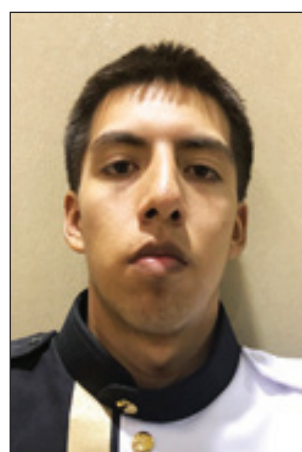

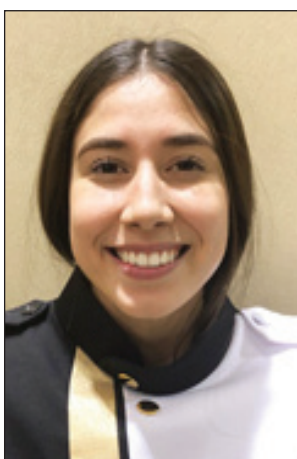

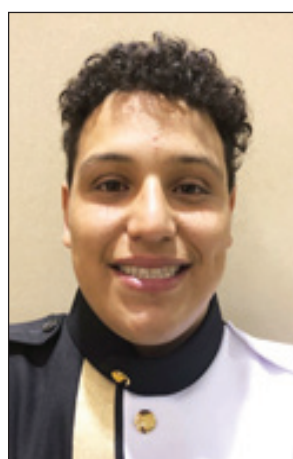
