Last week I wrote of slumps and valleys, which we all encounter from time to time. As I was writing it occurred to me that much of the world has been in one of these troughs for at least a year and a half, since the outbreak of the coronavirus contagion, whatever it might be called. The travails of the past year and a half, with all of the death, sickness, concern, financial

disruption, despair, and need-less suffering that occurred are enough to put anyone into a slump. It is worsened by the discovery that many bedrock institutions which we may have thought we might rely upon, also revealed their faces during this time frame, and presented evidence sufficient to conclude they are not interested in legitimately supporting the public good, and

worse – some seek to undermine or injure the public for the sake of their own power and enrichment.

Such a severely-stacked deck might cause the concept of emerging from the slump to be impossible for any individual. And in the natural sense, it is impossible for an individual to overcome the things described in the preceding

paragraph. What can one person do? The natural answer is we are merely spokes in a wheel. But if we leave the confines of the natural and enter the realm of the supernatural, hope is within reach.

I have observed that among the most helpful ways to emerge from a slump like this is to draw from the well of spirituality — to reinvigorate the pursuit of spiritual enrichment, which is to say the pursuit of God himself. When the other institutions showed their colors, nothing was left to aid the common man but God himself. The concept of God almighty is what can imbue an otherwise dire circumstance with hope. It is what allowed people to stand, individually, against the hell on earth which was known as the Soviet Union. Hell on earth bears many other names and figures at the moment, but belief in God is still the antidote and is what can empower a person to be free enough to hope, and to live the truth amidst the tyranny of pervasive falsehood. Inversely, this is why the atheistic, secular humanists cannot tolerate believers, especially those who believe enough to hope in virtue, justice, and mercy in the face of tyranny and brutality.

I spoke to someone not too long ago who suggested that the collective malaise many have observed in our country is because we have moved away from God. I found the verdict resonated with me. But a country can make no such move, toward or away from God; nor toward virtue or toward depravity. It is individuals who move, and when enough move in a certain direction, the general trajectory changes accordingly. Regardless, I found this person's statement to be both convicting and inspiring for me, as I am guilty of drift from the divine, but I still am on the path and have been re-calibrating my instruments accordingly. To the extent I do, I find that I make progress climbing out of the valley. I am hoping that I find many other people on the ascent as well.

d. DSH (Disproportionate Share Hospital) Year 2018 Recoupment - This is related to a court case with a children's hospital saying they were not paid correctly on uncompensated care. A judge agreed that they were not paid correctly, and the hospital wants their back pay. We will owe \$87,969.

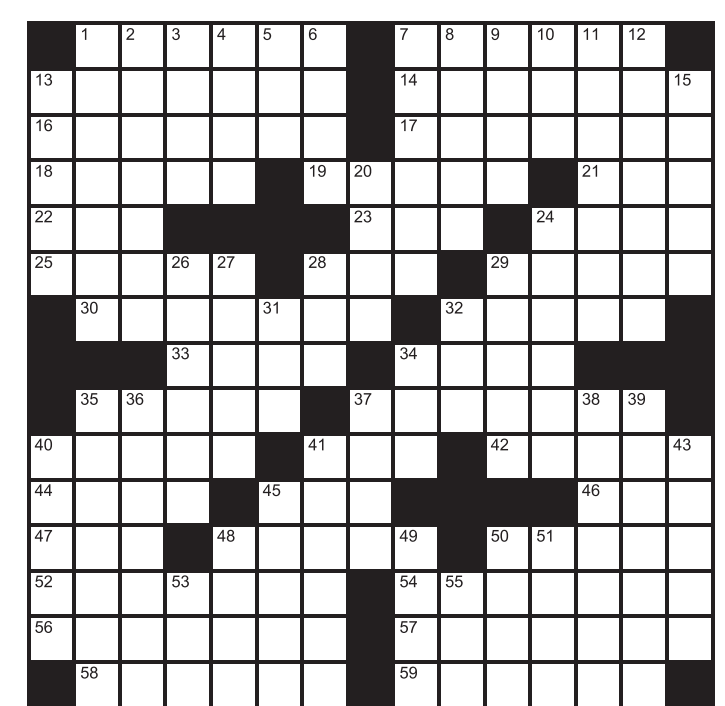

## Tex. State Sales Tax Is \$3.4 Billion

Texas Comptroller Glenn Hegar today said state sales tax revenue totaled \$3.41 billion in October, 25.2 percent more than in October 2020. The majority of October sales tax revenue is based on sales made in September and remitted to the agency in October.

Year-over-year increases for most tax revenues continue to be affected by base effects: Year-ago revenue collections to which this year's collections are compared were suppressed by the pandemic. Compared to October 2019, sales tax collections were up 20.9 percent.

"October state sales tax collections again strongly surpassed pre-pandemic levels, reaching a new monthly high," Hegar said. "Tax receipts from most major economic sectors were up by double-digit percentages from a year ago, indicating continued brisk spending by both businesses and consumers."

"Collections from the oil and gas-mining sector more than doubled from a year ago, while exploration and drilling activity remains at a pace little more than half that of the pre-pandemic months. Strong construction, manufacturing and wholesale trade sector receipts persist despite ongoing supply chain issues."
