A Wheeler Chamber of Commerce meeting has been called for Thursday, March 24th at noon at the AgriLife?

Visual Art Scholastic Event, VASE and only 45 artworks advanced to State. VASE is a UIL equivalent contest much like TMEA All-State Music. The students may enter one or two pieces of original artwork that they prepare for the contest by matting and composing a written response to six statements. At the event, students meet with a qualified judge where they will be interviewed on their concept and artistic decisions (this was done virtually this year). The judge then rates the artwork and the student's artistic knowledge and content according to TAEA standards. Students receiving the highest rating will be awarded regional medals and their work will be judged again in the Area Contest at the conclusion of the regional judging.

Area winners will also receive an area medal and their work will go on to compete at the State Visual Arts Scholastic Event on April 29-30, 2022 at San Marcus High School in San Marcus, TX.

This is an exciting and valuable educational experience for high school art students throughout the Panhandle.

Merely Mustard

I read somewhere that March is the month of optimism. I think this was an official designation that was needlessly proclaimed (as are most such official designations) by some body who claims the purview, whether bestowed by others or by itself, to make such designations. It is not necessary for any body to dignify the month of March with the title "the optimism month" — it engenders optimism quite naturally. And my philosophy is when a good wave arises, without any cause on our part, we may as well ride it until it breaks.

I savor the optimism that the turning of the calendar, from February (which I used to view as the bleakest month, a distinction which has since been claimed by December) to March can convey, if one allows

it. And even if one doesn't grant their assent to such a psychological reframe, nature insists upon it and, if humans have learned anything over the past few millennia, it should be that nature will have its way, whether we like it or not. The sunlight feels a little warmer; the birds awaken from their winter torpor (or their self-induced state of mutism); the air occasionally bears the invigorating smell of moisture, a smell which engenders the promise of life, received like a salve after the dry, dormant, apparently dead season of winter...all of these aspects of nature, and more which I have failed to describe, penetrate the walls of a human's psyche, which had been closed in on itself over the months of winter, and breathes new life into his spirit, making his steps a little lighter, and giving the sense that he can, in fact, stand up

straight again. So it is, and so it has been for thousands of years. I suppose I am revealing my geographic bias toward the northern hemisphere, as those who live in the southern hemisphere are experiencing the inverse of all of the things I described. They can now

Each of the students received a Rating 4 on at least one of artworks they entered, which is the best rating you can get. From the 4 rated entries three Kelton ISD students are advancing on to State VASE. The students that didn't go to state Mrs. Harless is also very proud of because they were just as much apart of the competition as the rest and handled it well.

Jurors will look for originality of concept, technical expertise, understanding of the Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills (TEKS) for visual art, and the interpretation of the student's stated intent. Jurors will evaluate student artwork using the following standard:
 Rating 4 Superior
 Rating 3 Excellent
 Rating 2 Average
 Rating 1 Below Average
 Students compete on four different experience levels depending on the credits in art that the student has received at the time of the

regional event:
 0 to 1 credit in art are juried on the Division I level
 1.5 to 2 credits in art are juried on the Division II level
 2.5 to 3 credits in art are juried on the Division III level
 3.5+ credits in art and/or AP are juried on the Division IV level
 Medals are awarded to those students receiving a Superior (Rating 4) rating in each division at the regional event and medallions are awarded to those students receiving a Superior (Rating 4) rating at the state event.

Brief Explanatory Statements of Proposed Constitutional Amendments Special Election, May 7, 2022

Proposition Number 1 (SJR 2)

SJR 2 proposes a constitutional amendment authorizing the legislature to provide for the reduction of the amount of a limitation on the total amount of property taxes that may be imposed for general elementary and secondary public school purposes on the residence homestead of a person who is elderly or disabled in order to reflect any statutory reduction in the maximum compressed rate of the maintenance and operations taxes imposed for those purposes on the person's homestead from the preceding tax year.

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows: **"The constitutional amendment authorizing the legislature to provide for the reduction of the amount of a limitation on the total amount of ad valorem taxes that may be imposed for general elementary and secondary public school purposes on the residence homestead of a person who is elderly or disabled to reflect any statutory reduction from the preceding tax year in the maximum compressed rate of the maintenance and operations taxes imposed for those purposes on the homestead."**

Proposition Number 2 (SJR 2)

SJR 2 proposes a constitutional amendment increasing the amount of the residence homestead exemption from property taxes for public school purposes from \$25,000 to \$40,000.

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows: **"The constitutional amendment increasing the amount of the residence homestead exemption from ad valorem taxation for public school purposes from \$25,000 to \$40,000."**

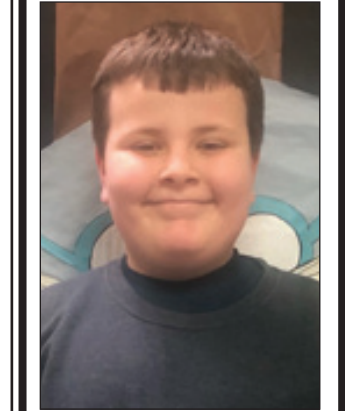

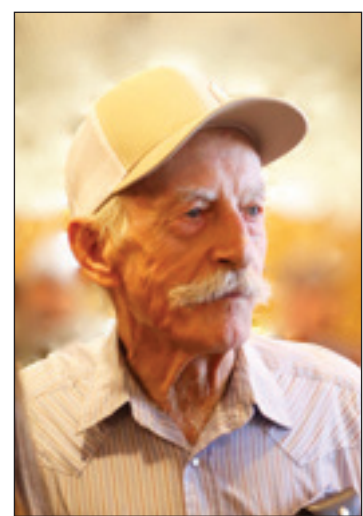
