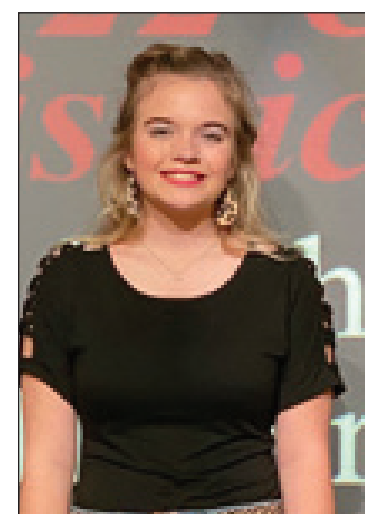

She married Donald Eldon "Donnie" Smith on January 16, 1970 and they made their home in Vega. They had two



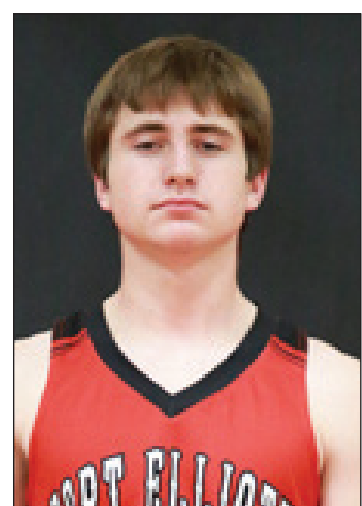

Brief Explanatory Statements of Proposed Constitutional Amendments Special Election, May 7, 2022

Proposition Number 1 (SJR 2)

SJR 2 proposes a constitutional amendment authorizing the legislature to provide for the reduction of the amount of a limitation on the total amount of property taxes that may be imposed for general elementary and secondary public school purposes on the residence homestead of a person who is elderly or disabled in order to reflect any statutory reduction in the maximum compressed rate of the maintenance and operations taxes imposed for those purposes on the person's homestead from the preceding tax year.

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows: **"The constitutional amendment authorizing the legislature to provide for the reduction of the amount of a limitation on the total amount of ad valorem taxes that may be imposed for general elementary and secondary public school purposes on the residence homestead of a person who is elderly or disabled to reflect any statutory reduction from the preceding tax year in the maximum compressed rate of the maintenance and operations taxes imposed for those purposes on the homestead."**

Proposition Number 2 (SJR 2)

SJR 2 proposes a constitutional amendment increasing the amount of the residence homestead exemption from property taxes for public school purposes from \$25,000 to \$40,000.

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows: **"The constitutional amendment increasing the amount of the residence homestead exemption from ad valorem taxation for public school purposes from \$25,000 to \$40,000."**

They are not the same thing. Or perhaps they are similar things, the inverse of one another: one given by a deity and one given by an anti-deity... Nevertheless, these objects all have screens, and the screen is the great distractor in our lives most days. I suppose former techniques to accomplish the same objective of distraction were billboards, radios, and mailers, and yet more archaic methods such as carving attention-grabbing signs in rocks or in wood being a possibility during the Stone Age. So the problem is ancient enough, it is just that the modern technology makes the attempts at grabbing a person's attention much more effective. And I don't know that attention-defense methods or technology have kept pace with the advancements in attention-grabbing methods and technology. Perhaps the human was simply not created with the capacity to defend itself from having its attention purloined. I am not sure about that. But I know that in my case the most effective defense is to not enter the arena of contest. Practically speaking, that means not turning on a 'device' with a screen, or, if it must be turned on, doing so with a specific intent or purpose, and endeavoring to limit the use of the device to said intent or purpose.

Such is the state for modern man. I not complaining, even if I am making a sort of lament. The flipside of the coin is that the world is there for the taking for those who manage to avoid the sort of distraction I have described herein. If a person can keep his focus on his objective, he is so far ahead of the pack which is typically bogged down in what people are saying on Facebook and the like, success seems as though it would be unavoidable. Sadly, I don't know. I manage to fall into the borrow ditch plenty of times, but those times when I am able to keep the vehicle between the lines, life sometimes comes together as though by magic, and, lo and behold, I might have an original thought for myself, rather than giving nourishment to someone else's intended thoughts for me, which often come with the 'payment due upon receipt', payable in the form of my time, attention, and money.

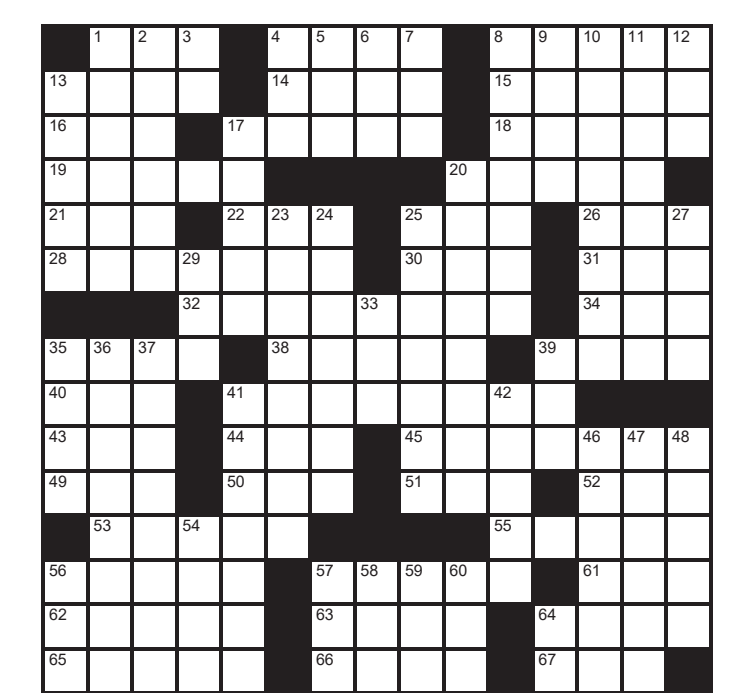
