Camden motioned to table this request until June meeting as an action item, Tracy seconded. The motion carried with 4 in favor, 0 against, 1 absent, and 0 abstaining.

Lisa McCasland and Bree McConnell addressed the Council about water aerobics class at the City Pool. They wish to continue their class this summer and had open discussions with the Council. Council discussed their concerns about Liability. A committee was formed of Tracy and Camden to verify statutes and rules through TML risk pool. Committee to schedule discussions with Lisa, Bree, and the Pool manager once liabilities of the city have been verified.

Paul gave updates on the maintenance of the City. He discussed additional costs of the construction at the Library due to unforeseen issues. Informed Council that the new trash truck should be here in November. There were no decisions made on the purchase of the County truck. Council asked Paul to order AED for the pool.

Kristen gave EDC and Chamber updates. She reported that Ecolomondo will be here next week having meetings with Shamrock EDC and herself. She also reported that there is spray paint on the sidewalks on West Texas Street. She'll get it cleaned off, but would like to consider fines for vandalism — check for ordinances pertaining to vandalism.

Tracy motioned, seconded by Kelli to approve payment of monthly bills. The motion carried with 4 in favor, 0 against, 1 absent, and 0 abstaining.

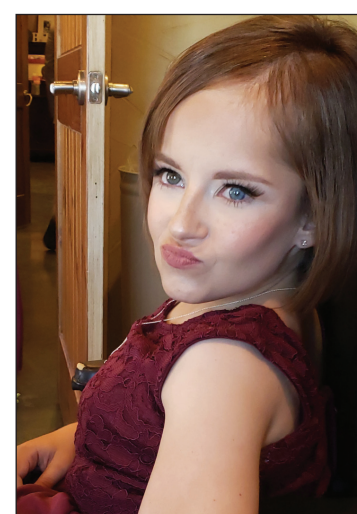

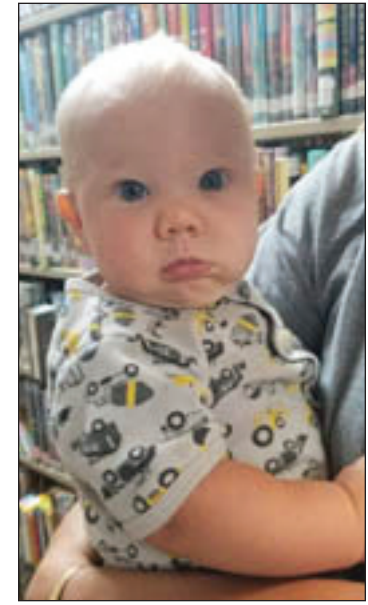
WHEELER LIBRARY SUMMER READING PROGRAM
