Merely Mustard

Some sheets of paper are just not large enough. And when they are not, what are you to do with the inadequately-sized paper? I would not enjoy a paper which were unbearably large, but those which are too small are simply not very effective.

Sometimes I make notes - of things I need to do, things I had forgotten from earlier in the day, ideas, etc. Often I scribble these notes on the

3" x 3" stacks of paper we call "sticky pads" or "sticky notes". And generally these sticky pads can hold about three items comfortably - trying to write more than that tends to become the game of "how small you can write", a game which got me in trouble in junior high and high school because I was so skilled at it.

There is value in being succinct and in condensing or simplifying what needs

to be said, what needs to be written, and what needs to be remembered, but just as some houses are simply not large enough to accommodate some families or lifestyles, so it is with pieces of paper. And how does a too-small paper allow you to deal with the experience of ideas flowing once writing begins? It is a phenomenon which is common enough but at the

same time tends to surprise – that once you begin writing something down, additional ideas, or edits to your original idea, continue to flow, leaving the paper which was too small at the beginning, now woefully inadequate.
I think if I had to choose between a paper too small and a paper too large, I would choose a paper too large – I think I would rather condense the paper by folding it, than I would condense the ideas that are being written on the paper. I suppose Goldilocks had it right – the optimally-sized paper is what I am after. Presently, I am writing on a “virtual” paper – a word processing program on the computer. It is endlessly large – not absolutely, but effectively – larger than I would ever need, I believe. And as such, I, or anyone else, could write almost forever. And all that largess makes me feel like stopping.
