The Commissioners' Court of Wheeler County, Texas met in regular session on Monday, August 22, 2022, at 9:00 a.m. in the Commissioners' Courtroom of the Wheeler County Courthouse at 401 S. Main Street, Wheeler, Texas to consider prior bills and discuss matters of mutual concern and to take action on the items on the agenda.

Commissioners held the Budget Hearing.

The Tax hearing was held. Court was reconvened at 10:00 a.m. to discuss the 25 items on the agenda.

The court accepted the reports presented by the county officers.

The budget amendments presented were approved.

The line item transfers presented were approved.

No revisions for the Wheeler County Policy Manual were presented.

Merely Mustard

If I am not mistaken, LED (light emitting diode) light bulbs are marketed based on how long they are supposed to last – how much greater lifespan they offer than the traditional incandescent bulb. I've used them, alongside incandescents, in the bulb rotation in my house for several years and I have not found the claim written on the LED bulb's box to be true, even once.

Presently I have an LED bulb in the room in which I am

writing, and an LED strobe light in the adjacent room. I don't have a light fixture that is designed to pulse on and off like a strobe, but I do have an LED bulb in the fixture that is well under the advertised ten-year lifespan, which is now flickering on and off like a disco club – not that I have ever been to one; I am relying on the disco club stereotype to illustrate the dynamic lighting environment which I can perceive with my peripheral vision.)

Yes, I've found that LED bulbs do not live up to the hype or the promise that their marketers would like for us to believe. I also have not found the light they emit to be particularly palatable to the eyes, either. I find the "daylight" version, which emits a blue light, to be much too harsh to my eyes. This is particularly true at night. Further, I believe it is counterproductive to sleeping or resting – I think the blue light gives the appearance

of an industrial site, and gets the brain fired up, rather than being conducive to rest. I have even read that fruit flies that were exposed to blue LED light aged more rapidly than those exposed to natural, i.e. solar light.

So generally I prefer the "soft white" LED bulbs over the "daylight" offerings. But I still find the soft white LEDs to be less pleasant than soft white incandescents. But it seems that incandescents

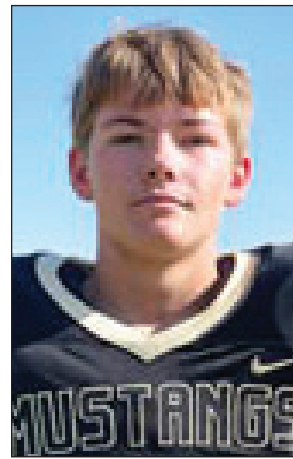

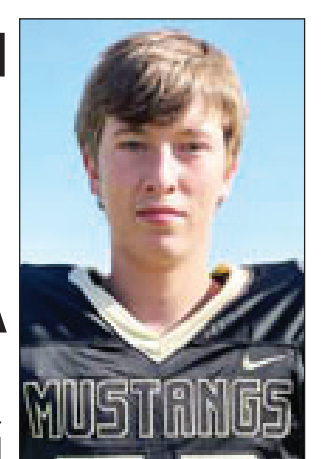

"You had knobs on a TV?" he asked. I explained that in the late 20th century, a viewer adjusted knobs to enhance the picture. There was the on-off switch, plus additional knobs that controlled brightness and color intensity, Station choices were from channels two through 13.

"Wow," he said, "you didn't have many selections. And what if you wanted to stream a movie, or record something to watch later, or show a DVD?"

I explained that those options weren't available. Back in the really old days BBC (Before Basic Cable), viewers received real-time broadcasts from giant towers that sent signals to an antenna on top of their roofs.

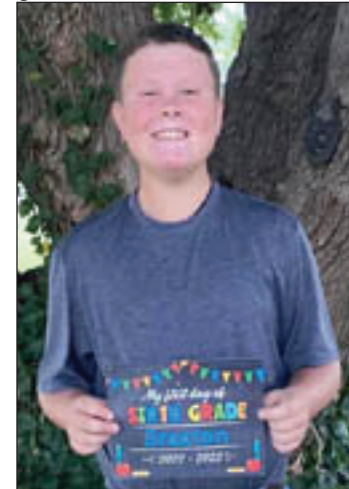
