it tends to discourage its undertaking. But there have been, and occasionally there are, instances in which I simply say to myself, "It is this way — so be it. Let's get to work." I would note that I often can't control when I have this surge of practical motivation but that it simply occurs less frequently than I'd like and, what's more, that if I could bottle it, I think I could retire from work and still manage to have all of my duties handled appropriately.

But on these rare occasions where I simply start working on the right thing and then, having completed it, move to the next right thing, I generally

find that there was sufficient time to handle everything which mattered. This outcome occurs frequently enough when the aforementioned conditions have been met, but they are met seldom enough that when the outcome does occur, it leaves me somewhat stupefied each time. But this astoundment is gentle and leaves me peculiarly satisfied and not feeling like a failure for not acting in this manner each time, each day, each moment of decision. It is a slow but convincing lesson, administered infrequently (or perhaps administered regularly, it is just that some of us don't attend class with regularity) but clear and consistent — some would call that a kind learning environment. And it is my hope that in spite of all my tardies and truancies, I earn a passing grade one of these days, after all.



If you have a dog or a cat, then you know just how quickly your house can become overrun with animal hair. And even more frustrating, sometimes the vacuum fails to pick everything up. To make the chore easier, get a squeegee with a long handle and use it as a "hair rake." The rubber squeegee will help loosen the hair embedded in the carpet or furniture fabric, and will also help clump the hair together. Then you can just pick or vacuum it up.

**Post Cards From The Panhandle**

Notorious Old West gunfighter, Clay Allison and his brothers owned a ranch outside of Old Mobeetie in Wheeler County, Texas.

In 1874, he and another gunfighter, Chunk Colbert, raced horses, and Colbert invited Allison to dine with him at the Clifton House in Colfax County, New Mexico. He agreed and after the meal, Chunk Colbert went for his gun, but hit the barrel on the underside of the table. Allison drew his revolver and fatally shot Colbert in the head. Allison was asked later why he dined with a man bent on killing him, and he responded, "I didn't want to send a man to hell on an empty stomach."

In 1878, Allison rode upon a homestead in Wheeler County being raided by Comanches. After the U.S. Cavalry refused to help Allison, he gathered local ranchers to fight the band of Comanches. They successfully ran off the band and saved the family. One Comanche was killed during the fight.

Clay Allison was a man between the borderline of good and bad. He rode his horse through Old Mobeetie while drunk and naked except his gun belt and revolver one time.

Later in his life, he moved to Pecos, Texas, and established a ranch there. On July 1, 1887, Allison was taking supplies to his ranch, when a sack shifted off his horse-drawn wagon. Allison went to catch it, but fell under the wagon. One of the wheels ran over his neck, breaking it and killing him.

He was rumored to have killed 15 men during his times in Texas, New Mexico, and Colorado. The inscription on his grave says, "He never killed a man that didn't need killing."
