Mayor Sams called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE: The Pledge of Allegiance was recited by all present.

INVOCATION: The invocation was given by Mayor Dan Sams.

PUBLIC COMMENTS: Mike Hulon addressed the City Council and Mayor about City Ordinance #220 Mobile Homes and HUD-Code Manufactured Homes in reference to lot and lots associated with 601 Cheyenne St.

Wanda Jean Dodson Bachmann of Shamrock, TX passed away on Wednesday, December 14, 2022 in Lubbock, TX at the age of 80 years, 8 months and 15 days after her valiant fight with Alzheimer's Disease. Graveside services were held at 2:00 PM on Friday, December 16, 2022 at Shamrock Cemetery in Shamrock, with Rev. Justin Green officiating. A Memorial Service was held at 2:00 PM on Saturday, December 17, 2022 in the Community Room at Crown Point Health Suites in Lubbock, TX with Chaplain Eric Chapman officiating.

Merely Mustard

Last week I spent a good number of words on a psychologist's statement that the human brain was the most complicated thing in the universe. I thought that was a fairly comprehensive statement. Then just this past week, how ironic that I learned of a word which fairly extensively limits the grandeur of the psychologist's original claim: I read something that mentioned a 'multiverse'.

For all of these years which I have been aware (not to claim any particular level of awareness), the universe was just about as big as things could get. Hence it was named in such a manner which sort of encompasses everything - everything in existence, every single atom, was contained within this solitary box we deemed the universe. And now it seems the box is not sufficient! Who knew that there was a thing as a multiverse?

Of course no one knew, but perhaps scientists decided it

must be so. And if scientists decided (and it only takes two of them to enable the usage of the phrase, "Scientists say...", or "Scientists have determined...") that there is more than one universe, who is anyone else to question? They might be rebuffed with "The science is settled." Occasionally, scientists may even endeavor to personify science itself, and deflect the questioning of their theories (or just their logic) on the basis that they are the embodiment of science itself. The irony here is that those who engage in that sort of charade actually are embodying a certain form of science: the study of the human ego.

In any case, are we now to believe that there is a multiverse? And what does that mean? And is multiverse what we are to call multiple universes? What if there happen to be multiple multiverses? We might not be able to perceive them now, but SCIENCE may proclaim

that later (making statements on discoveries they have made or believe they have made, using money that other people had made).

At some point the language becomes a farce of itself. The whole point of the concept of a universe, as far as I can tell, was simply a way to envision ONE thing that contained EVERYTHING. And logically this is exactly true and the natural conclusion one would make if he were not a scientist, or a propagandist. Consider the concept of infinity itself. Yes, infinity could be thought of as never ending, but it also, and most certainly, leaves no room for other infinities to co-exist with it. So it is with the universe. The universe is the one thing, naturally speaking, which contains all that we know and all that we don't know. If there is a universe, it is impossible that there could be more than one, and hence there is no potential for any such thing as a multiverse. Such a consideration would

be a violation of logic.

I think what might have happened is that some erudite person, maybe a professor or a scientist, decided that perhaps the universe was insufficiently large to hold the grandeur of their mind, and thus, with that mind, they had to create a whole new piece of real estate, and make the universe obsolete, in favor of their multiverse. And in a roundabout way, such a maneuver would exactly prove the psychologist's claim that the human brain is the most complex thing in the universe - only something complicated would feel a need to tamper with something so beautifully simple in concept, and then flub it up and make it sloppy, and then think they have really discovered or created something, and be proud of it.

In conclusion: the human brain is indeed the most complicated thing in the universe - I can see that, and I'm not even a scientist!
