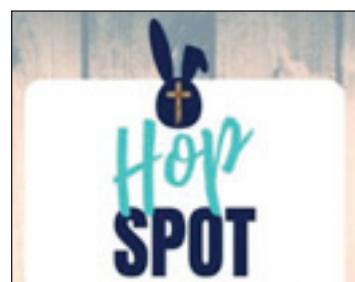

Grants Available For Fire Damage

USDA Makes Grants Available to Help People in Rural Texas Repair Their Homes Damaged By Fires in 2022 .

U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Rural Development Texas State Director Salerno today announced the availability of grants to help people repair their homes that were damaged by fire in 2022.

The homes must be located in presidentially declared disaster areas. People living in Bosque, Eastland, Hood, Somervell and Taylor counties in Texas may be eligible for the funding.

Merely Mustard

It seems that everything is on a timer of some sort – the daily schedule, the alarm clock, the body with its own daily rhythms; the seasons, the rhythm of nature, the weather, festivals; the sun, the moon, the tides of the sea...I wouldn't necessarily call it synchronized, but it certainly bears the element of “scheduled.”

My initial thinking was, “Who wants to live under the rule of a timer?” I often find

a desire to rebel against the demands of time schedules, and yet that rebellion is as futile of throwing a rock into the air directly over my head and saying, “I choose to live free of the law of gravity.”

In my mind, this desire to rebel against what can be viewed as the tyranny of time is no different than a child who wishes to break free and to overthrow the tyranny of “time out”, and being compelled to stand in the corner

(or, put his or her head on the desk, as was one of the customs during my school days) until the timer beeps – until the alarm sets them free only to serve what is perhaps the more loathsome sentence of discussing their behavior, and comparing their behavior to the standard of proper (and maybe even unattainable) behavior.

This is one of the most exhilarating and perplexing thoughts about the concept

of eternity – the absence of timers. On one hand, that is a dreadful thought, because timers bring about in one form or another the end to a certain suffering or discomfort, only they often simply usher in another form of discomfort or undesirable activity. But if the eternity were blissful – can we even imagine? A life without timers – the eternal “now”? Or, put in child talk: a never-ending “time in.”

to our communities and to the places we call home," Salerno said. NOTICE OF COMPLIANCE TARIFF FILING

Southwestern Electric Power Company (SWEPCO) filed with the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Commission) on March 21, 2023, its Petition requesting approval of its proposed Military Base Surcharge Tariff.

Section 36.354(a) of the Public Utility Regulatory Act (PURA), at Texas Utilities Code § 36.354, provides that each electric utility in an area where implementation of full customer choice has been delayed by the Commission in accordance with PURA Section 39.103 shall discount charges for electric service provided to a military base. Section 36.354(b) of PURA establishes the discount to be provided to military installations as a 20 percent reduction of the base commercial rate that the electric utility would otherwise charge the installation.

Section 36.354(c) of PURA provides that the electric utility may assess a surcharge to all its Texas retail customers to recover the difference in revenue between the revenues from the discounted rate for military bases and the base commercial rate. SWEPCO's Tariff Sheet No. IV-16 provides the Military Base Adjustment Factor per billing kWh as reflected below:

SWEPCO has requested that the tariff become effective with the first billing cycle of June 2023. The Petition has been assigned Tariff Control No. 54778. 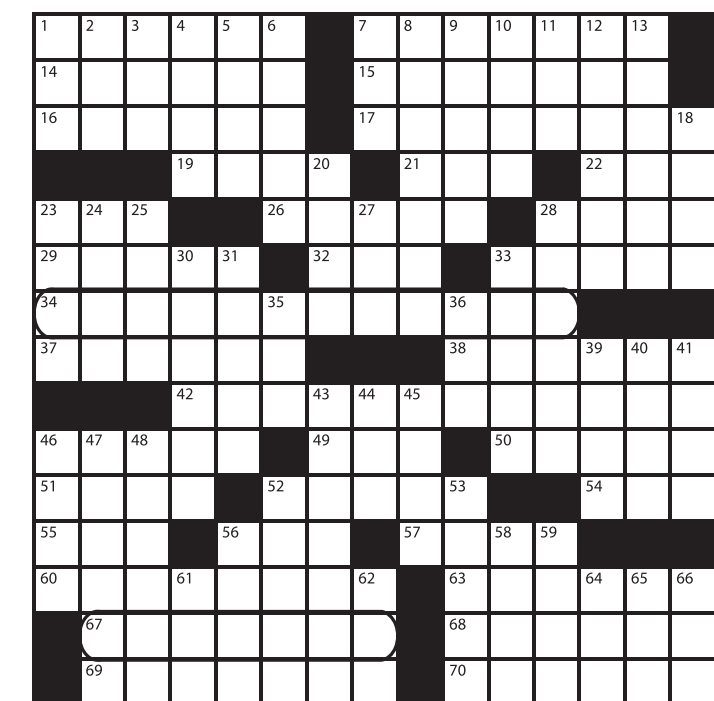


