TAC's driving simulator creates real-world driving conditions in a high-tech environment that replicates situations drivers may actually encounter while on the road. Since its launch in 2000, more than 25,900 county drivers in over three-quarters of the state's counties have used it to enhance their ability to make life-saving, split-second decisions in often dangerous driving conditions.

"Studies have shown that driver-training programs effectively reduce risks while educating drivers on safe-driving measures," Courtney said. "Even professional drivers can slip into bad habits behind the wheel. The simulator training reinforces good driving habits that help improve employee safety and make them better prepared for the unexpected."

Merely Mustard

One of the things I learned concerning time, in the course of the time experiment, is the need for quality. This was not a direct lesson from the experiment, more like a sort of adjunct discovery, the kind that experiments are prone to produce.

It occurred to me, with the help of my most trusted advisor, that to produce, achieve, enjoy, a certain standard of quality demands a certain expenditure of time. And this expenditure of time is one which is worth making. It seems to me that often, perhaps gen-

erally, the tendency in our society, which also tends to creep into our personal lives and routines, is to forfeit the concept of quality in favor of the concept of "getting the job done". And if this is true, it is a mistake.

Failing to take the time to do something, anything, in a quality way is dissatisfying. Practically, it often guarantees the future need for the further expenditure of time in a way that producing quality work does not — the adage, "If you don't have time to do it right, you will find time to do it

again," comes to mind. Having to revisit something you have already done is the just reward for doing something poorly.

But failing to ensure quality is also dissatisfying in the same way that doing something wrong is dissatisfying. It tugs on the conscience and subconscious like a nagging pest which can't always be identified, and which is sometimes so small that it is hardly felt at all, directly, but accumulates and gathers mass until it simply is perceived as a cloud of negativity or mal-

aise, whose reasons for existence are not fully apparent.

On the contrary, to take the time to do something in a quality way is the most practical thing to do, in part because of the psychological benefits it bestows. There is more to say about this, but, ironically, I do not have time to explore this further right now. If, when time avails itself, the muse has not departed from me, I would like to expound on this topic.

During the annual sales tax holiday, qualifying items can be purchased tax free online or by telephone, mail, custom order or any other means (including in-store purchases) when either:

- The item is both delivered to, and paid for by, the customer during the exemption period; or,

- The customer orders and pays for the item, and the seller accepts the order during the exemption period for immediate shipment, even if delivery is made after the exemption period ends.
