Board of directors and credit committee members will be elected by credit union members attending.

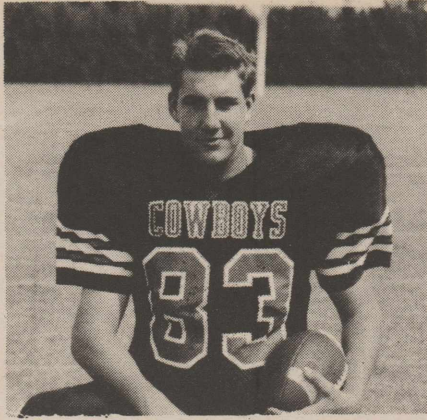
Mayor & two council seats to be decided Saturday, May 7

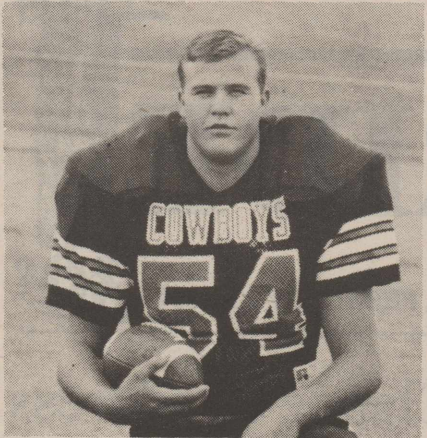
Those with expiring terms are Mayor T.J. Miller and Council members Kent Welch and Steve Jones.

Mrs. McGinty added, "Great helps in organizing your life are a large calendar, stick 'em notes and a schedule."

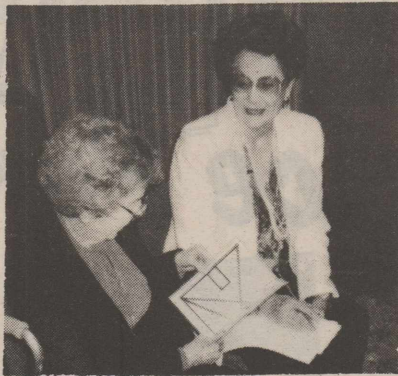
She stressed the necessity for communication skills including expression and listening skills and assertiveness in overcoming barriers to communication.

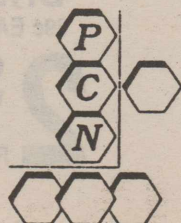
