Yoakum County Commissioners call for bids on auto and fuel

Yoakum County Commissioners met Dec. 5 in special session. Present were Dallas Brewer, County Judge; and commissioners John Avara, Bob Thurston and Jim Barron. Also present were Ruby Bruton, Hazel Lowrey, Gary Walker, David Bruton, Jimmie Rice, Toni Jones and Cesar Beltran. Commissioner Macky McWhirter was absent.

Walker gave a report on the operation of the landfill for November, introducing David Bruton, who was recently hired as System Manager at the landfill.

Bids were opened Friday, Dec. 2 at 10 a.m. for a new heavy duty truck for Precinct 2. Thurston made a motion to accept the lower bid in the net amount of \$28,399. from Permian Mack Sales of N.M., Inc. Motion was seconded by Avara and carried by a unanimous vote of members present.

Barron made a motion to advertise for bids on the purchase of fuel for the Sheriff's Department for 1995, using

the same specifications as last year. Thurston seconded and the vote was unanimous.

Barron made a motion to advertise for bids for one new automobile with police package for the Sheriff's Department and trade in a 1992 Chevrolet Caprice. Bids must be received by Dec. 27 with action to be taken Jan. 3. Thurston seconded, motion carried.

The following securities were released effective Dec. 10 on a motion by Thurston, second by Avara and a unanimous vote: Federal National Mortgage Association, \$500,000 Safe-keeping #270, Matures 12/10/1999, Called 12/10/94.

Lists of disbursements and part time salaries, as filed with the clerk, were unanimously approved for payment.

Barron made a motion to pass an Order Adopting the Texas County and District Retirement System's Annually Determined Contribution Rate, Plan 2, with COLA, Option D. Motion carried.

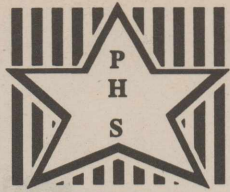

Everyone is invited to attend.

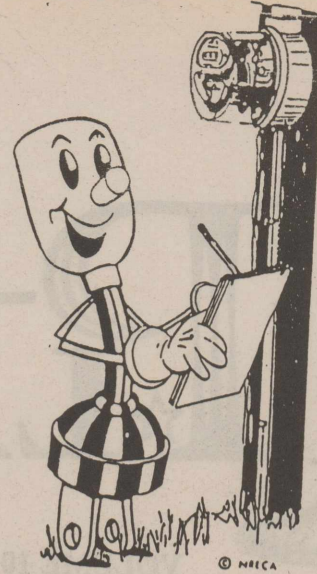


Student of the Week

six weeks of this year, Veronica Ponce."

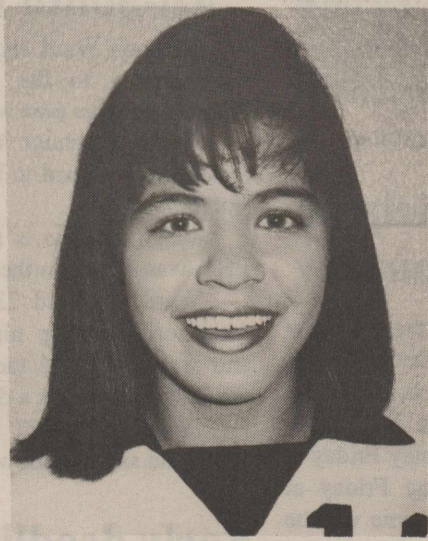

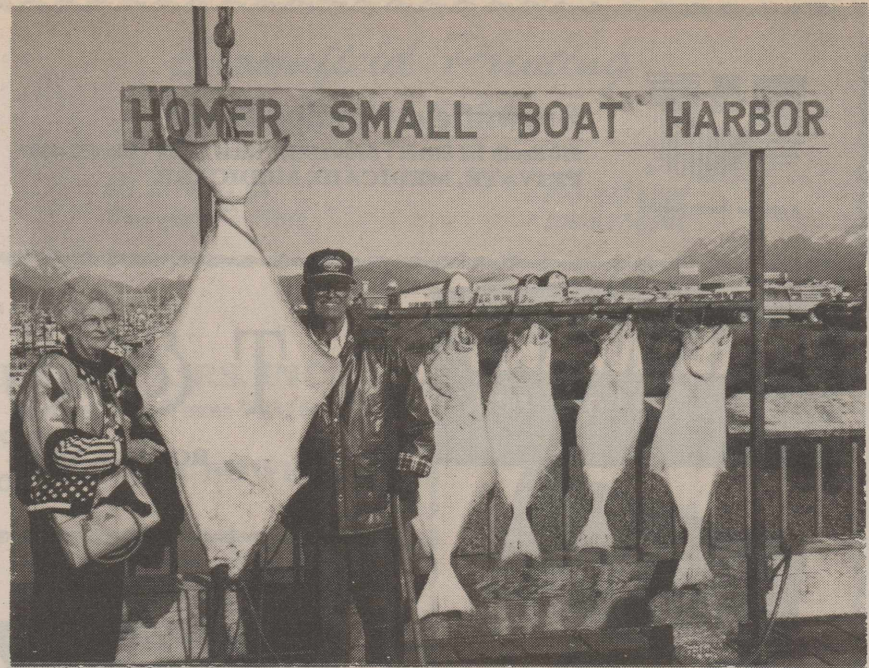

Commenting on their experience, Gallegos said, "If you have a goal or dream and if you work at it, it will come true." He said he enjoyed meeting new people during the workshop.

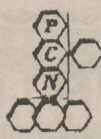
Sigala said that he learned to help others with their problems and also learned how not to let drugs interfere with life's dreams and to avoid the people who "do drugs."

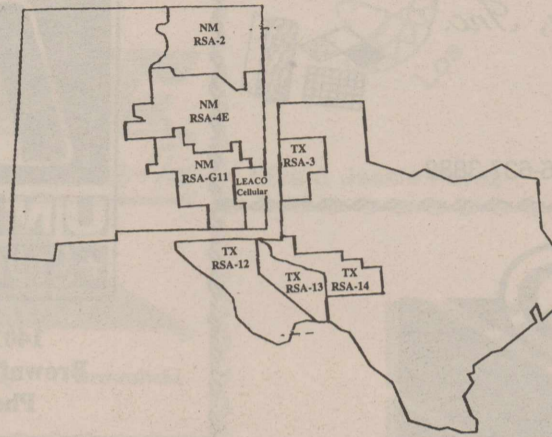
