Hounds Play Hard In Roby Contest, Fall Short 14 - 10

Paducah's Here Friday Night At 7:30

Knox City's Greyhounds traveled to Roby Friday night and played hard until the contest's end but fell short to the host Lions by the score of 14-10.

The Hounds drove to Roby's 10-yard line twice in the second half but could only get three points for their efforts.

The last chance came in the game with six minutes to play when David Dudensing returned a punt 12 yards to the Roby 19. Three running plays netted eight yards.

On fourth down, Lance Dever, who rushed for 130 yards was met by the middle of the Roby line. Dever lunged for as much as he could get, but came up about eight inches shy of a first down and Roby took over.

There was 4:33 left to play and then came the test for Roby's offense. The unit had made only two first downs in the second half and had been pushed back 28 yards to its four on the previous series, 10 coming on a holding call.

Roby's offense responded and picked up four first downs to run out the clock for the Lions' sev-

enth victory of the season and third in district play. The Greyhounds are now 2-1 in district action.

Knox City drove from its 29 to the Roby 10 the first time it had the ball in the third quarter and settled for a 27-yard field goal by Duane Toliver.

The Hounds took the opening kickoff and went 61 yards for a touchdown in 10 plays.

The big decision was a fourth and two from its 47 and Dever got the necessary yardage plus two more. He carried eight times in the drive for 58 yards including a one-yard plunge for the score.

The Lions went 60 yards to tie the score on a 13-yard run around

left end by Michael Brown. A key was a five-yard run by Kelly Heflin on a fourth and one from the Greyhounds' 34.

The Hounds didn't threaten again in the first half, but Roby got to the Hounds two only to see the play rubbed out because of a holding call.

Brown broke the tie when he started to the left, cut back to the middle and raced 61 yards for his second touchdown 2:59 before halftime.

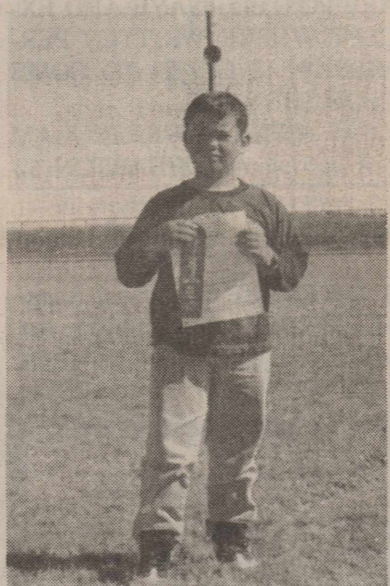
The Lions got the ball back and got to the Knox City 32 as the half ended.

This week, the Hounds will host the Paducah Dragons at Greyhound Stadium at 7:30 p.m.

Seven Youth Qualify For Section NFL Gatorade Punt, Pass & Kick

Saturday, November 11, At Rose Park - Abilene

Greyhound Stadium was the site for the NFL Gatorade Punt, Pass & Kick local competition, Saturday, October 28.

Youth competed from Knox City, O'Brien, Benjamin, Munday, Guthrie and Rochester in this year's event which was sponsored by the Knox City Lions Club.

Seven youth won the right to advance to the Sectional Contest, Saturday, November 11, at 10:00 a.m. at Rose Park. Sectional winners will be entered to be chosen to compete in the Team Championship in conjunction with the Dallas Cowboys vs. Washington Redskins game on Sunday, December 3, at Texas Stadium.

Earning first place honors in their respective age groups were

These points were cumulative total of one punt, one pass and one kick.

Along with these seven youth listed above, one other youth from Knox City will be participating during the Sectional competition in Abilene. Dustin Johnson had a point total of 191' 2" and took first place honors when he competed in the 8 year old division of the

Abilene local competition. Because he will represent Abilene in the 8 year old division, he will be competing with an 8 year old classmate, C.J. Bruce, who will be representing Knox City.

Several of the adults present with their children on Saturday were overheard commenting on what an outstanding job the Knox City Lions Club had done in promoting and producing this "first annual" event in Knox City.

NFL Gatorade Punt, Pass & Kick is a football competition that allows youngsters to showcase their talents in punting, passing and place-kicking with scores based on distance and accuracy.

A number of current NFL players have competed in Punt, Pass & Kick, including Buffalo quarterback Jim Kelly, Philadelphia's Randall Cunningham, Miami's Bernie Kosar and Dan Marino.

Wyman Meinzer Book Signing Set For Sunday In Benjamin

From 1:00 to 5:00 P.M. At Burnett House

Wyman Meinzer, Benjamin, Texas, resident and nationally known wildlife photographer, will be honored by Knox County friends, Sunday, November 5, with a book signing party at the Burnett House Bed and Breakfast in northeast Benjamin from 1:00 to 5:00 p.m.

Coyote, with text and 104 color photos by Meinzer, is a natural follow-up to his first book, *The Roadrunner*, which was also published by the Texas Tech University Press.

Wyman's roots in the Wichita River country that he has made famous as "The Texas Badlands" go back to the 1880s, when a great-grandfather helped drive a herd of cattle to Knox County. Wyman grew up on a ranch between the South Fork of the Wichita River and the Salt Fork of the Brazos, and has lived with the sound and sight of coyotes all his life. Twenty-some years ago he studied coyote habits as a professional hunter and trapper, but now he only shoots them with a camera.

Those of us who only glimpse coyotes darting across country highways to disappear in country which looks as if it has no hiding place may well wonder if Meinzer used some magic to achieve the photographs in this book. His family has a tradition of Indian ancestry. Did some ancient magic flow

through his blood to enable him to peer so closely into the lives of the coyote? There are Indian myths of men who become coyotes, and you almost wonder if a certain photographer was, for a while, a camera carrying, befurred member of the pack.

Whether it was magic, luck or skill, Wyman Meinzer has produced a book that so impressed the Zoological Society of Houston that he has been invited to
