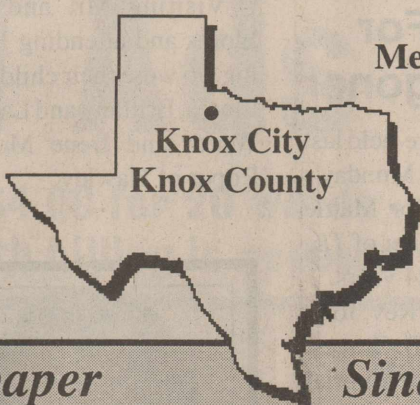

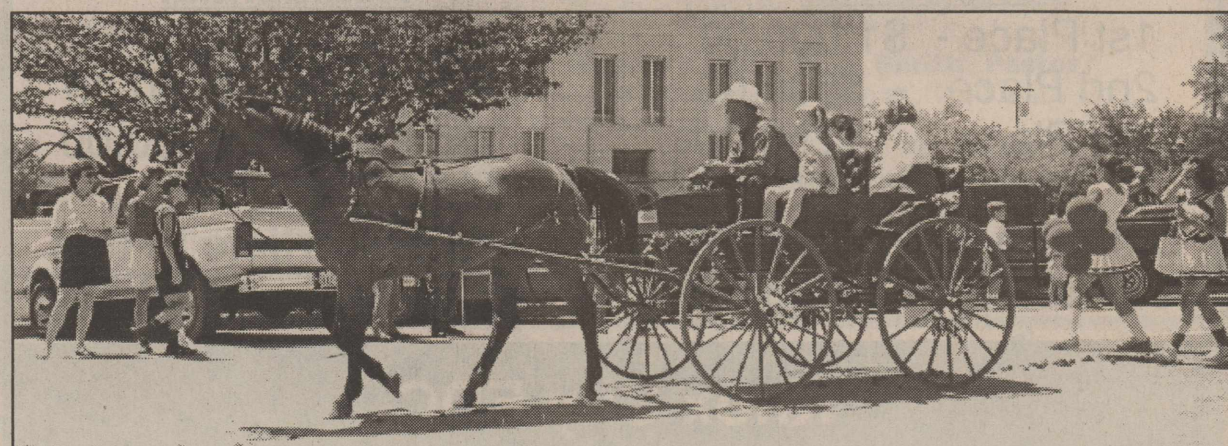
Although there has not been
