

City police are now enforcing South Fork of Deep Creek, 55 the new limits.

A limit of 30 mph was extended farther north up College Ave. from downtown, eight blocks to 17th St. instead of only two blocks mph; to 23rd, but motorists will be allowed to drive 40 mph between Aves. V and Z on U.S. 180, or the Lamesa Hwy., where they had previously been allowed to go only 35

The most restricted speed is limited to central Snyder, where speeds of 30 mph are mandated.

City officials said in announcing the new limits Friday that motorists should take care in trying to observe the new signs.

Company fights bankruptcy

the small company that financed two Academy Award winning movies, may be forced into involuntary bankruptcy by investors who have filed petitions seeking repayment of more than \$2.5 million.

The petition filed by MVenture Corp., NCNB Texas Venture Group Inc. and InterFirst Capital Corp., asks that the company be liquidated under Chapter 7 of the U.S. Bankruptcy Code, said Attorney Arthur Finley III. The movie company announc-

DALLAS (AP) - FilmDallas, ed Wednesday that five of its top executives, including chief executive Sam Grogg, would resign by March 1 if an alternative to the liquidation cannot be found.

Grogg said Wednesday his company has been struggling financially in recent months, but had met with investors in an attempt to come up with a survival plan.

"We're very surprised, and so were our other investors and board members," he said of the petition. "Our counsel will be responding, and my gut initial

feeling is our response will be converting to Chapter 11."

Grogg said that his company is drafting a plan to convert the Chapter 7 petition, which was filed in U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Dallas, to Chapter 11, which would protect it from creditors and allow time for reorganization. The company has until the first of the year to file for reorganization.







The National Association of Investors Corporation (NAIC) an organization that fosters and promotes investment clubs, offers investors valuable information through its publication, Better Investing.





Tim Dacus, a native of Hermleigh and an employee of Sun Pipe Line for the past eight years, believes that light is the proper way to symbolize the spirit of Christmas.

For the past several years, he has been decorating his front yard with a wide assortment of Christmas type characters and symbols-each colorfully outlined in moving patterns of light.

This year's display, which never fails to draw the attention of anyone driving by his home at 411 Dunn in Hermleigh, features a family of snow people complete with a "mom" and "pop" and two "children." An assortment of different colored lights are sequenced at different speeds so that it looks as if the arms on the snow people are moving and that the two children are tossing snowballs at each other.

In addition, Dacus also has a small replica of Rudolph the Red-Nosed Reindeer in his front yard. Various colored lights are also placed on the shrubbery around his home.

The display was judged the best entry in the lighting category in the annual Snyder Jaycees Christmas Lighting contest this year.

Last year Dacus' display consisted mainly of only one large snow person and a bell which, when the lights were sequenced, looked at if it were ringing.

Dacus said he constructed his snow people out of 3-H rebar which is used for reinforcements when cement is poured. He wrapped poultry netting or "chicken wire" around the 3-H rebard to give his family of snow people form and substance.

After he constructed each of the snow creatures, he said he then fitted each with lights. The two smaller figures used eight

This year, he began work on his snow family in September. He utilized after-work hours to construct the units and install them in his yard.





Semidry or sun-dried dates, the most common, are sold in their natural state. Dry dates contain very little moisture when ripe and keep the longest of any dates. Soft date varieties are very moist and often are dehydrated before packaging. Chopped pitted dates

also are available. Store any type of dates, tightly covered, in the refrigerator.

Criminal path is set by home life

CINCINNATI (AP) - Growing up in a single-parent or broken home is not likely to lead to juvenile delinquency, according to a study by a University of Cincinnati criminal justice professor.

The professor, Patricia Van Voorhis, says she found that poor quality home life is what leads to delinquent behavior, regardless of whether the family is intact.

Van Voorhis found that physical abuse, conflict, lack of affection, minimal supervision and little enjoyment in the home lead to delinquency. Lack of affection and supervision, she notes, are factors in drug and property offenses, while abuse leads to violent behavior.

"Broken homes are related to ed Florida for Spain in 1513. status offenses, such as running away from home and truancy, but they do not appear to predispose youths to commit property offenses, drug offenses or violence."

Van Voorhis' study was conducted among high school students in a small midwestern town. It was co-authored by Francis Cullen, also of UC's criminal justice department, and Richard Mathers and Connie Chenoweth Garner of Western Illinois University.



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SAFE TURKEY DINNER A whole, golden-brown roasted turkey is the crowning story of many a holiday meal - and one of the most common causes of food-borne illness.

Turkey is not an inneren dangerous food, but the circumstances under which it's prepared make it a prime candidate for creating a food safety problem.

Turkey is a protein food, which means that it naturally contains bacteria which will rapidly proliferate if the bird isn't kept at below 40 degrees or over 140 degrees Fahrenheit.

Yet the special conditions created by holiday meal preparations often place the turkey in the temperature "danger zone" of 41 to 139 degrees.

In spite of explicit package directions to thaw the turkey in the refrigerator or under cold water, consumers often let it sit for hours on the kitchen counter.

Tradition has it that the whole turkey should be stuffed. That makes it very dense and even more difficult to keep hot in the middle.

After the turkey has been cooked, it may sit out on the table or kitchen counter until someone gets around to cleaning up or it's time for late night turkey sandwiches.

All this adds up to an increased likelihood of bacterial growth and someone getting sick.

Consumers need to follow a few - Use nature by opening all simple guidelines to make the extra care in preparing a whole window shades to let in the sun's holiday bird safe as well as good turkey.

to eat: -If you want a fresh turkey, buy it no more than two days before cooking it. Hold the raw turkey in the refrigerator until

cooking. Tt's best to than a from turkey in the refrigerator. But a small bird can be thawed in a microwave oven. Follow the oven manual carefully and be ready to cook the bird as soon as it's thawed.

-You can also thaw a turkey in the sink. Put the turkey, still sealed in its plastic wrappings, in the sink. Cover the bird with cold water, and change the cold water every 30 minutes, until the bird is thawed.

-If you plan to buy a stuffed, cooked turkey at the deli or grocery store, order it in advance and bring it home to serve immediately.

-If you must pick up a stuffed, cooked turkey the day before, remove the stuffing and meat from the bird and refrigerate it in small containers. A cooked, stuffed turkey is too big and dense to cool down quickly enough in a home refrigerator to prevent bacterial growth. It may not look as pretty as a whole bird when served, but it will be safe to eat.

The stomach ache, cramps and flu-like symptoms of food-borne illness are unpleasant at best and can be dangerous for young children, the elderly and the ill. That's the best reason for taking
