

Grain producers and handlers are warned that any food or leed grains contaminated with eastor beans or pieces of beans will be graded sample grade with a corresponding drop in

During the past few weeks several carloads of grain sorthum coming from areas where las been given the sample grade. Extension Agronomist Ben R. Spears has been told by W. J. Funchess, Federal grain supervisor for the USDA's Galveston District, that grain ininstructions on grading such contaminated lots of grain.

Their instructions are . . . "If a lot of grain contains castor beans or pieces of castor beans hen the lot should be graded sample grade." Funchess stated further that an inspector or supervisor would need only to be assured of the presence of the castor beans or pieces to down-grade the lot of grain. Castor beans contain a deadly poisonous protein and a very potent allergen.

Spears says the alkaloid poison is known as ricin and is found not only in the beans but also in the stems and leaves of the castor bean plant. Therebe allowed to contaminate feed usual.


