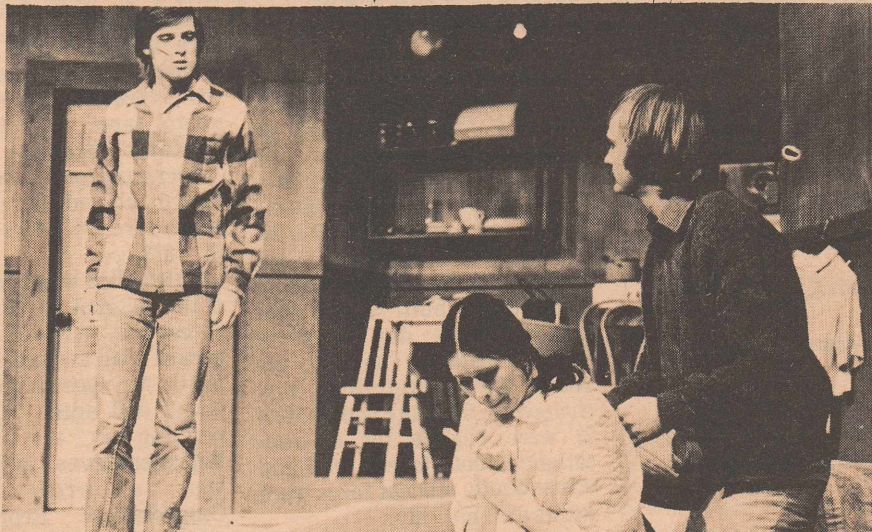

## 'Look Back' To Continue Through Saturday

Last night, WTC's theatre Arts Department opened its second production of the season, "Look Back in Anger" by John Osborne. The play will continue to run through Sat., Dec. 15. Tickets are priced at \$2 for adults and \$1 for students.

The cast and crew have labored long and hard at putting "Look Back in Anger" on the boards. It is the first intensely serious play done by the drama department. It has its moments of tenderness and of humor, but also presents bitterness and conflict.

The cast includes Jamie Boren as Jimmy, Bill Martin as Cliff, Donna Messimer as Alison, and Retha Boyd as Helena. Crew members, without whom no play would be possible, in-

clude Clayton Black, technical director; Steve Bratton, stage manager; Katie Bullock, costumes; Barry Rinker, lights; and Mike Crawford, make-up. Carol Posey also helps on make-up and Starla Vinson is in charge of props.

"Look Back in Anger" does not claim the universal appeal of a musical comedy or even of "Charley's Aunt." But to the perceptive viewer it does offer insights into the complexity of human nature.

"Look Back in Anger" is not a character study of a bitter, hateful young man, nor is it a cynical, pessimistic play. It is, however, a play about people, complete with the realism and naturalism to make it a moving appeal to the emotions.

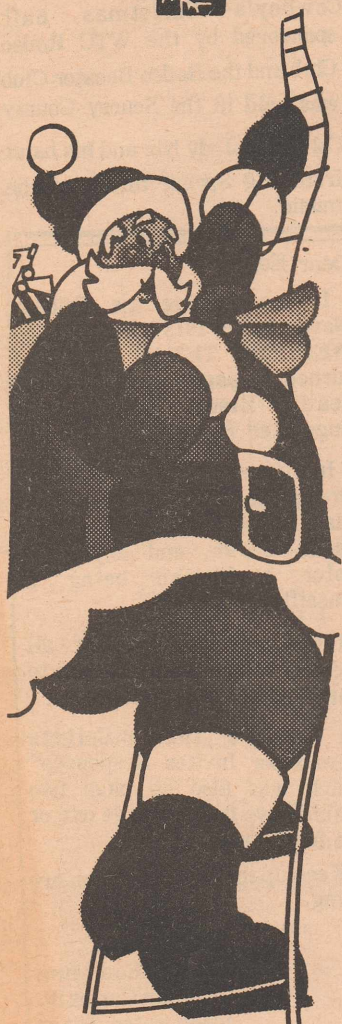

# An Open Letter To Students

Dear Youth-Student:

In recent years you have been able to avail yourselves of low cost transatlantic youth or student air fares. Transatlantic youth fares were originally available to youths 12 to 26 and student fares to students 12 to 29.

Because of United States Civil Aeronautics Board pressure to discontinue both youth and student fares due to their "discriminatory" nature, the youth fare eligibility was changed so that only youths 12 to 23 were eligible for a transatlantic youth fare in 1973 and transatlantic student fares were withdrawn entirely.

At the end of November 1973, the United States Civil

Aeronautics Board rejected a fare package which the world's transatlantic airlines submitted for approval, and singled out youth fares as totally unacceptable because of their "discriminatory" nature. The Board ordered the cessation of youth fares effective December 31, 1973.

This action was taken in spite of the fact that the United States Senate has, on November 5, 1973, passed a bill authorizing airlines to file for special fares for the young and aged. This bill is pending in the House of Representatives, and we urge you to write to your Congressional Representative asking that he-she support the concept of reduced rate air

travel for the young and the aged.

The obsession with discrimination which exists in our country today has resulted in an overreaction and, where it is in the over-all public interest to accommodate a particular sector of the population, we manage to act contrary to our own best interests.

It certainly is in the overall public interest to insure that we have a well educated populace. We are isolated enough geographically and we do not have to further isolate ourselves by inhibiting the young from international travel which is, in itself, an education.

If you want to continue to be able to travel abroad on scheduled carriers at rates which you can hope to afford, you should IMMEDIATELY write to your Congressional Representative urging that he-she support the Senate passed bill (S 2651) which would allow airlines to offer special fares to both the young and the aged.

If you are one of the American students who attend schools far from your home, the termination of domestic youth fares will add significantly to the cost of your education since your travel expenses to-from home for holiday and intersession periods will be increased.

# Christ's Birthdate Questioned

When I visited relatives in Lubbock last August, I was annoyed to see a shopping center already decorated for Christmas. I had expected it though. That store set up their trees in late September last year and October the year before. That is commercializing beyond all reasonable limits.

Reruns of old TV shows included episodes that appeared to prove that commercialism was the real spirit of Christmas. A search through the library uncovered several books harping the same point. Even parts of "A Christmas Carol" contained the same theme.

I was curious about the start of it all and checked various encyclopedias, finding some unusual facts. Very interesting is that the exact year of Christ's birth is unknown, our BC and AD system is the result of guesswork. Even more interesting, the ancient church placed his birth in the early Spring.

How was the date moved to Winter? Part of the answer may be found in Norse mythology.

All gods were doomed and fire

from their home would destroy all life on Earth. But those people that had lived and died honorably would have a new life on Earth under a new god and system.

The simultaneous destruction of the old way and birth of the great god was supposed to be on the shortest day of the year (Dec. 25 on ancient calendars). Each year on that day, there was good cheer and fellowship, great feasts were held, gifts were exchanged, mistle-toe was displayed (the signal for the beginning of the end was when a god died because of mistle-toe), and sacred trees were symbolically burned.

The early day Catholic church found it much easier to absorb this religion than to destroy it and the feast became Christ's.

The observance spread and now is the property of Madison Avenue.

That's the story behind Christmas, but it still is the celebration of Christ's birth and, when I think about it, maybe it's good to extend it the year 'round, not just for religious purposes but also for the good cheer and fellowship—after all, wasn't one of Christ's purposes to spread just that?

**History Proposes 'Commuters' Classes**

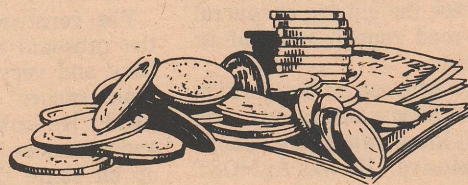

## WTC Cagers Stop Angelo State Quint, Clip NMJC In Conference Outing

Playing without the services of 6-6 forward Harold Ward, Western Texas College's basketball team whipped the Angelo State Junior Varsity 88-75 Tuesday, Nov. 27, at the WTC gymnasium.

The Westerners, playing their first game in the new gym, took a 14-point lead in the initial half with some fine shooting and rebounding.

In the second half, the WTC cagers continued to hit, increasing their margin to as much as 20 points. From there, the Rams were the hot team, pulling within two points before WTC once again took control.

Many of the Western Texas points came at the charity line late in the game, as the aggressive Angelo squad committed numerous fouls.

Concerning the game Coach Mike Mitchell stated, "Our defense was good. Our offense really wasn't bad. We just had that one period when we couldn't seem to hit the basket."

Danny McDaniel was the leading scorer for WTC and the leading scorer in the game with 28 points. Norman Barnes and

Greg Hill each totalled 13 points.

Western Texas pulled down 38 rebounds in the contest. Eugene Harris, who sustained a knee injury in the game, led in this department with 11. Brian Minor grabbed 9 and Barnes snatched 8.

J. Elder paced the Rams in scoring with 24 points. D. Holtsclaw meshed 18, and E. Clark pumped in 14 points.

The victory left WTC with a 6-1 record.

Western Texas College's basketball team captured its first conference victory of the year Monday, Dec. 3, as the WTC cagers slipped past New Mexico Junior College, 87-75, at the Scurry County Coliseum.

The lead changed hands several times in the initial period, with the Hobbs squad holding a one-point margin, 45-44, at the half.

The contest remained close through the majority of the second half, but with five minutes remaining, NMJC had pulled out to an eight-point lead.

From there, the WTC cagers rallied for the victory, stealing passes and blocking shots to go along with their accurate shooting.

Danny McDaniel was the leading scorer in the game with 28 points. Brian Minor pitched in 14, Harold Ward netted 13, and Norman Barnes added 11.

New Mexico was led by Ricky Gibson, who tossed in 26 points. Donnie Jackson and John Monitt were also in double figures, hitting 22 and 13, respectively.

The Westerners, who are now 1-1 in conference, controlled the boards in the contest Barnes pulled down 17 rebounds which is high for a WTC player this year.

Minor, McDaniel, Ward, and Eugene Harris each had six.

Concerning the game, Coach Mike Mitchell stated, "I was really proud of the way the players worked in the last five minutes. They worked real hard on defense and showed poise offensively to convert the New Mexico turnovers into baskets."

New Mexico is now 6-4 for the year.

Under the direction of their new coach, Miss Leslie Loyd, the netters had their best showing in their final tournament of the year at Amarillo College.

WTC captured third place Nov. 1-3 with Amarillo, Howard County Junior College, and Seward College of Liberal, Kansas being the other participants in the round-robin team tournament.

Against Seward, the Westerners won four of five singles matches and both doubles. Jon Moore defeated Rinehart, 6-0, 6-2. Bob Christian whipped Keller, 6-2, 6-2. Weaver of Seward fell to David Martin. Mike Milner crushed Brown, 6-0, 6-0.

In doubles, the No. 1 team of Brian Otterness-Moore defeated LeeLum-Rinehart, 3-6, 7-6, 6-2. The second set was a tie-breaker and Western Texas came out on

top, 5-2. Keller and Weaver of Seward fell to WTC's No. 2 team of Milner-Christian, 2-6, 5-7.

The WTC netters had tough going against the other two schools, picking up only a singles and doubles match from HC.

Otterness defeated Johnson in singles, 4-6, 6-3, 6-1. Otterness was involved in the other victory as he and Moore teamed up to down Box and Johnson, 6-0, 6-4.

In their initial outing of the season, the Westerners journeyed to Kerrville, Sept. 27-28, to participate in the Schreiner Invitational Tournament, a single elimination tourney.

In singles, Otterness won over Boles of Howard County, 4-6, 6-3, 6-2 in the first round. Moore also won in the first round, downing Davenport of Schreiner, 7-5, 6-3.

Milner-Martin won their first round match in doubles over Dougherty and Cervenka of McLennan College, 6-1, 6-1. The No. 1 doubles team, Ot-

terness-Moore, won their first round from a San Antonio duo, 6-0, 6-1. They proceeded to win the next round from a pair at San Antonio College, 6-4, 6-2, but fell in the third round.

Otterness-Moore also took wins from HC and Schreiner, but lost to their opponent from AC. Besides these tourneys, the Westerners also participated in several dual matches with teams from Howard County and Hardin-Simmons University.

Concerning the fall season Coach Loyd stated, "The team over-all did an adequate job, but I believe they will do much better in the spring due to the experience obtained this fall, as the team has only two returning
