The second set of parts came in and still the. lights were not operational.

Working like professionals, the cast and crew set about to refocus the play and change scenes to work without light controls. Friday night the play would open as scheduled.

Meanwhile, a person was to be sent from San Antonio to repair the light controls to arrive Saturday or Sunday.

Friday, Jim Rambo Associate Professor Drama/Speech offered an explanation to the audience about the lights not working and not being able to separate daylight and dark without stage lights.

Frank Burns, State President of the National Association for the Advancment of Colored People (NAACP), was the featured speaker at the local NAACP Banquet held on Feb. 24 at Western Texas College Student Center.

The theme of the banquet was "Onward and upward. If there is no struggle, there is no progress."

Burns spoke on the struggle that he says is still going on, not only in the Black community, but in all communities in America. He said this struggle is against unfair policies in education, housing and economic practices. Burns emphasized that the NAACP is not to be feared because it is an organization that


has been in the struggle for justice for the past 80 years.

Burns closed the meeting by asking each newly elected officer to do the best they could with their newly appointed office.

Burns, a Mississippi native, has been a member of the NAACP since 1964 and state president for the last two years. Commenting on how he became involved in the organization, Burns said "It seems that I have been in it all of my life"

Florida JC has twelve players going into the game with WTC.


After a close contest against Florida JC the Dusters went down 74-78, in the final minutes.
