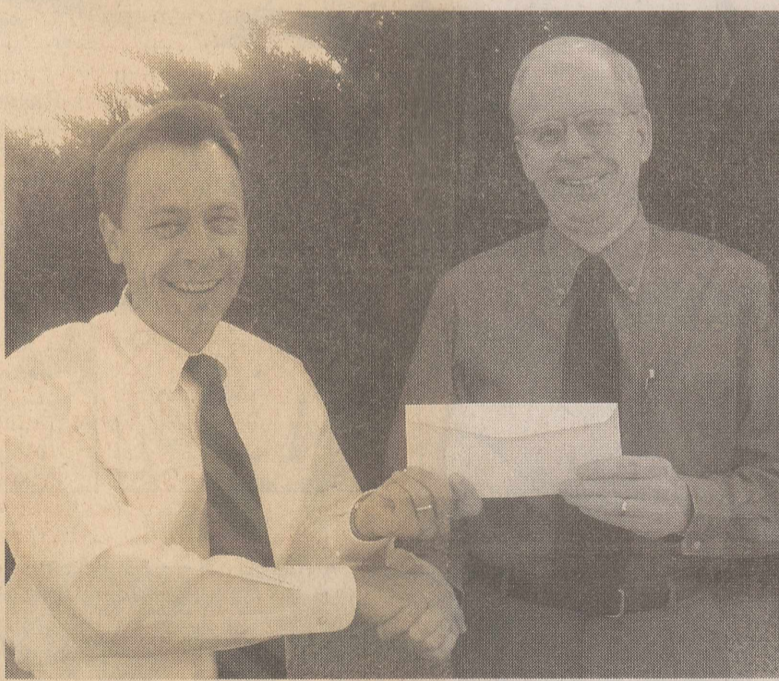

Thanks to all of you, we'll be able to open up our facilities this fall to little leaguers all the way up to collegiate athletes and say: "PLAY BALL!"



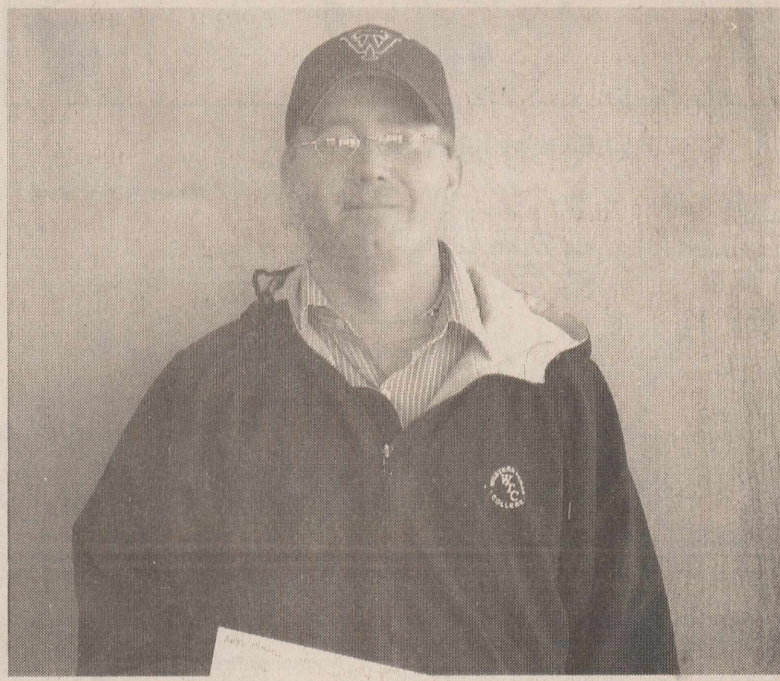
AND THE WINNER IS...
