



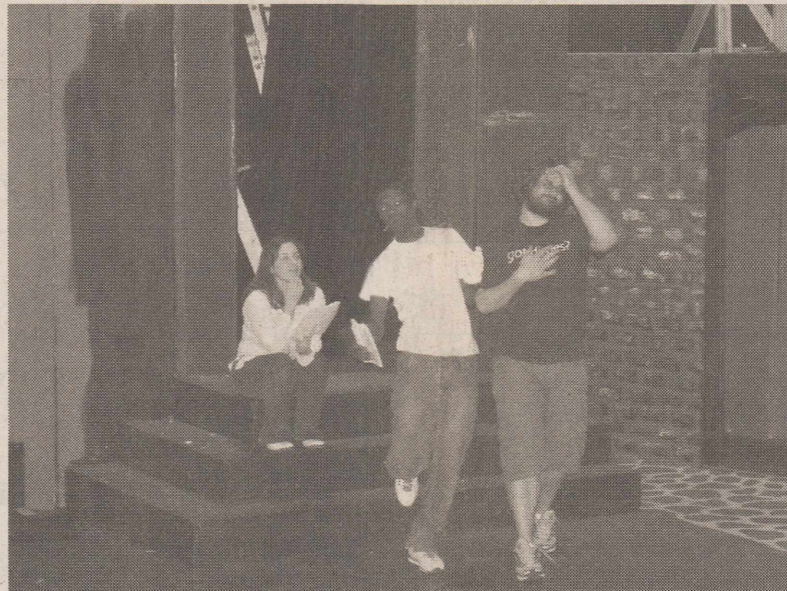

## Theatre Department Presents 'The Two Gentlemen of Verona'

WTC Theatre Department will present *The Two Gentlemen of Verona* by William Shakespeare. The play is about two youths, Valentine and Proteus, who make their way from Verona to Milan. Valentine's father is sending him to take a position in the Duchess of Milan's court. Both young men fall in love with the Duchess's daughter, Silvia, who is betrothed to Thurio, a wealthy courtier. Proteus betrays Valentine and gets him banished, and Silvia is confined to a jail. Valentine joins a band of outlaws. Silvia escapes Milan in search of Valentine. Proteus and Thurio set off to rescue her. Valentine encounters them as Proteus makes the case for his love to Silvia. The Duchess and Thurio arrive upon the scene, but Thurio backs off his claim to Silvia when challenged by Valentine. As the play ends, Valentine gets Silvia with the Duchess's approval. Performances are set for April 22-24 at 7:30 pm and April 25 at 2 pm in the WTC Fine Arts Theatre. Ticket prices are \$5 for Adults, \$3 for Seniors and Students, and WTC faculty, staff and students are admitted free.

## Upward Bound Students Tour ASU Campus

Students with the WTC Upward Bound program visited the campus of Angelo State University Saturday, April 3 to learn more about the campus and get a preview of university life. High school students from Snyder, Rotan, Sweetwater, and Colorado City attended the College Days event, where they were treated to an opening session with ASU President, Dr. James Hindman, followed by a campus tour and lunch.

Upward Bound participants make a big commitment when they enter the program by giving up six weeks of their summer and spending several Saturdays during the

school year at academies on the campus of WTC and other colleges.

Even with all this work there is still time for fun, with students participating in cultural field trips and visits to theme parks, sporting events, and other attractions.

Upward Bound is an academic enrichment program funded by the U.S. Department of Education. It is one of three original Title IV (TRIO) programs which were implemented following the Higher Education Act of 1965.

There are now seven programs, all of which assist students in enrolling in and completing a college education.

The Upward Bound staff works closely with students and school administrators and staff to help participants achieve their highest potential in high school so that they will be better prepared when they enter college.

The program provides instruction in math, laboratory science, composition, literature and foreign language.

Other services include:  
 •Instruction in reading, writing, study skills, and other subjects necessary for success in education beyond high school;

•Academic, financial, or personal counseling; exposure to aca-

demic programs and cultural events; tutorial services;

•Mentoring programs;  
 •Information on postsecondary education opportunities;

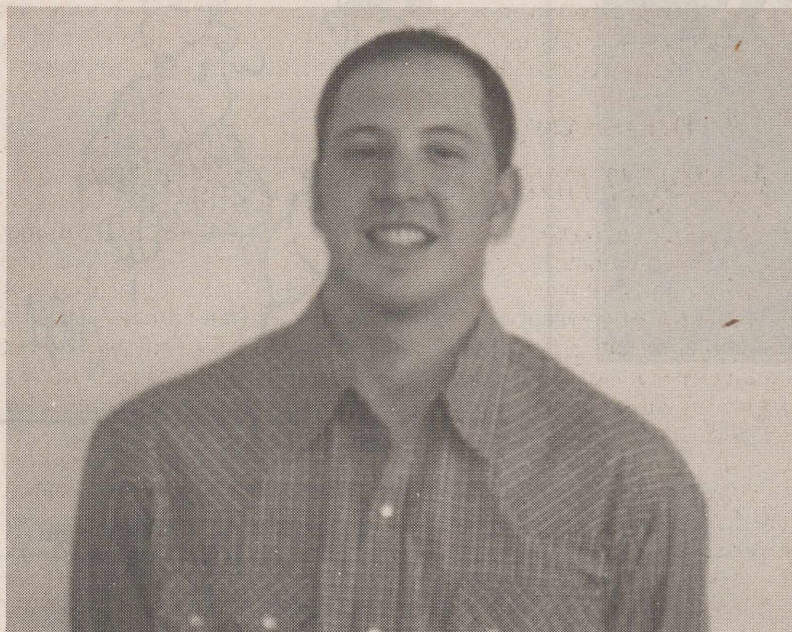
•Assistance in completing college entrance and financial aid applications;

•Assistance in preparing and paying for college entrance exams; and,

•Work study positions to expose participants to careers requiring a postsecondary degree.

## Jason McAden Hired as Women's Volleyball Coach



Jason McAden was hired to begin April 1 as ladies volleyball coach for next fall. McAden was a 1993 Snyder High School graduate. After high school he went to Odessa College for two years before moving on to Hardin Simmons, where he played on the Men's Volleyball team for three years. He was captain for two years and player/coach for one year. When McAden became unable to play due to of knee injuries he was hired as assistant coach for the women's volleyball team, later to be named as interim head coach.

McAden played with the International Sports Federation and competed against the Antigua National Team. He started coaching high school volleyball in Hobbs, NM and has coached the last two years at A&M Consolidated High School, a 5A team in College Station, TX.
