
Geology Class On The Hunt For Fossils



Troy Lilly, Associate Science Professor at WTC, took his Geology class to the Caprock Escarpment at Fluvanna.

Lilly said, "This is an ancient reef or shoreline of an old inland sea. It extends from around Matador down to about Stanton. We are lucky that a large part of it goes through the northwestern part of Scurry County.'
