Joining the show this fall are Jacob Brumley, Kristen Early, Lisa Parker, Sam Spreadborough, Corey Watson and Tara Woodall.

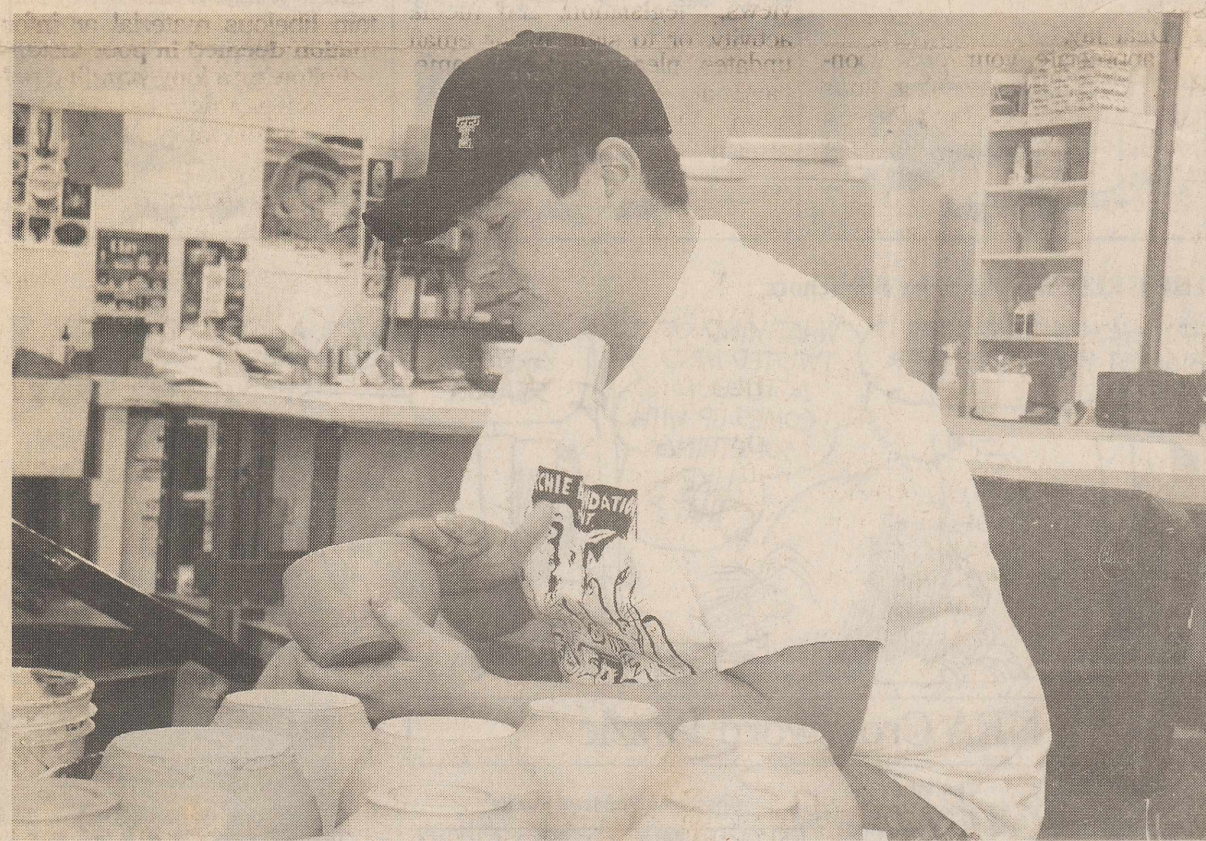

Funk currently has his ceramic art (pictured below) on display in the Fine Arts Building on the WTC campus. These art pieces are available to the public for purchasing.

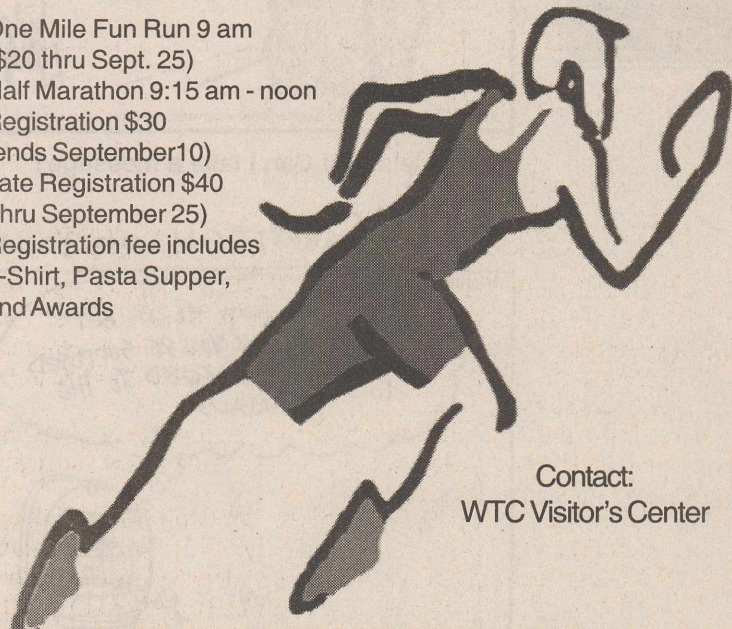

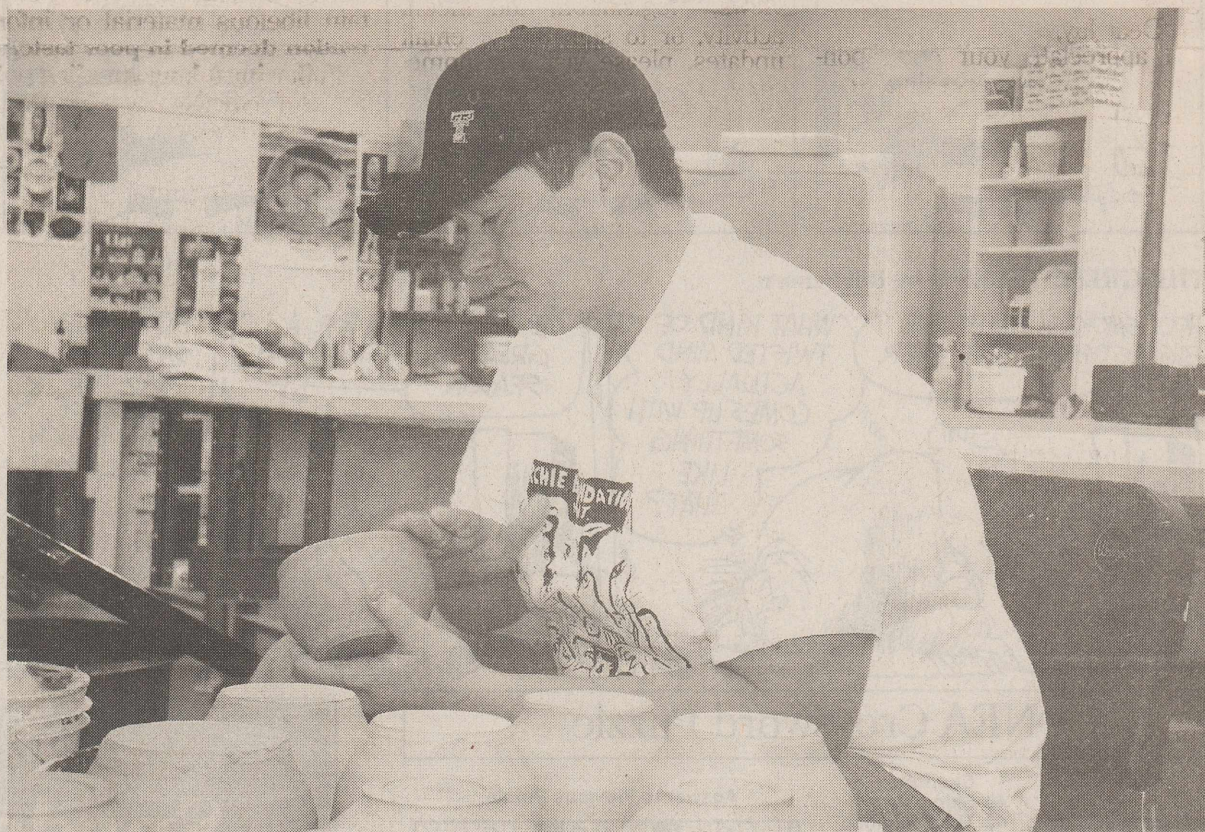

Funk currently has his ceramic art (pictured below) on display in the Fine Arts Building on the WTC campus. These art pieces are available to the public for purchasing.

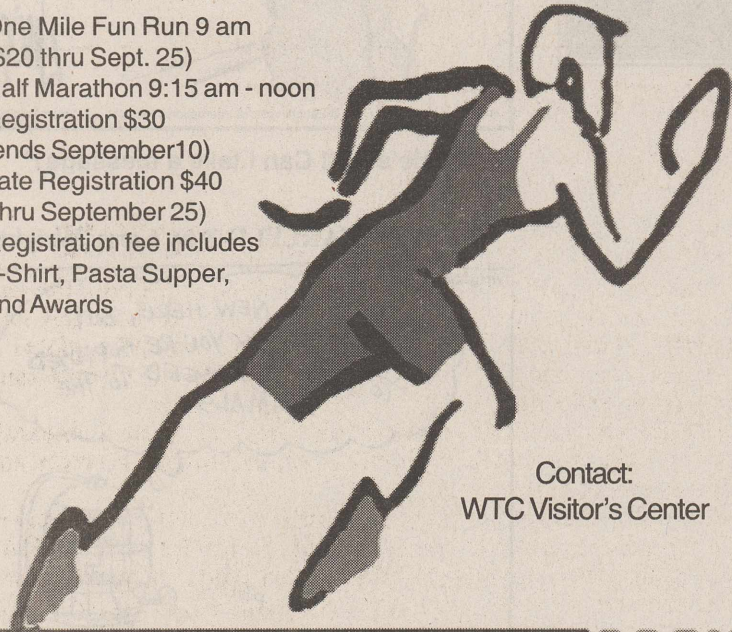
