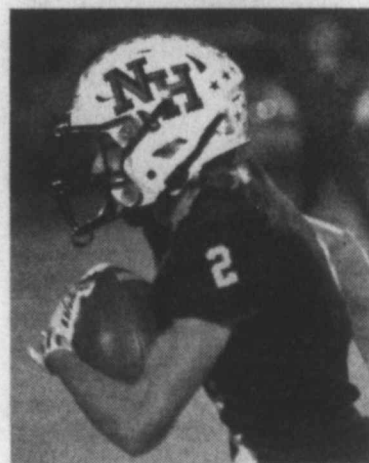

giving a HELPING HAND

Tahoka Police and Lynn County Sheriff's Office (LSCO) deputies assisted a veteran who was walking through Tahoka on his way to San Marcos last week.

According to information from Police Chief Jeff Parker, police were called for a welfare concern by a caller reporting a man with a backpack, with a dog on a leash, who was sitting on the ground slumped over near the on-ramp of US 87 near the Stripes convenience store, at 1:30 p.m. last Wednesday, Nov. 10. A police officer located the man to see if he needed assistance, and a background check revealed that the man was a veteran of the U.S. Navy and a Bronze Star recipient. He had no warrants, and was not breaking any laws, and told the officer that he was traveling on foot to get to San Marcos.

"The man told the officer, 'I have money, and water for myself and my dog, and I'm not asking for anything, I'm just trying to get to San Marcos,'" the chief told *The News*. "When we found out he was a homeless veteran who had served our country and was a Bronze Star recipient, we figured that if he fought for our country then we could at least do something to try to help him. So, we contacted the LSCO to see if they could transport him to Dawson County, and to arrange with other Sheriff's offices in other counties to kind of leapfrog him through these other counties to get him transport to San Marcos," he explained. "He didn't ask for help but it was a privilege to offer it."

In a traffic accident Monday night, Nov. 15, an empty tanker truck and another truck hauling cotton burs reportedly collided at US 87 and FM 213 at approximately 8 p.m. One person was reportedly transported by Lynn County

EMS for medical treatment.

EMS also transported one person from another accident on Saturday, Nov. 13, that occurred just after 7 p.m. at US 380 and FM 179. According to the LSCO call sheet report, the dispatcher received a 9-1-1 call and heard a child's voice asking what had happened, and another voice responding that a car had run a light. While on the line, the 9-1-1 system plotted the caller at US 380 and FM 179, and the caller explained that another vehicle had run a stop sign and struck his vehicle. He said that everyone in his vehicle seemed okay, but that his mother was unable to get out of the vehicle. He was unaware if there were any injuries in the second vehicle. LSCO, two Lynn County EMS ambulances, Tahoka Volunteer Fire Dept., and DPS all responded to the scene. Deputies later reported that there were only minor injuries, and that one patient was transported by EMS to a Lubbock hospital.

At 6:35 a.m. Friday, Nov. 12, a caller to LSCO reported that she had run over two pitbulls with her vehicle on US 87 south of Tahoka, causing some damage to her vehicle. A deputy located the vehicle and issued an accident form, and waited with the driver until her husband arrived to help tow the vehicle

A caller at 3:20 p.m. Nov. 12 reported three horses on FM 400 at CR 19 that appeared to be neglected, with no food visible for them, and noting that they appeared extremely skinny. She said one of the dark horses looked very weak in the back legs. A deputy checked on the animals and notified his supervisor of the animal welfare concern.

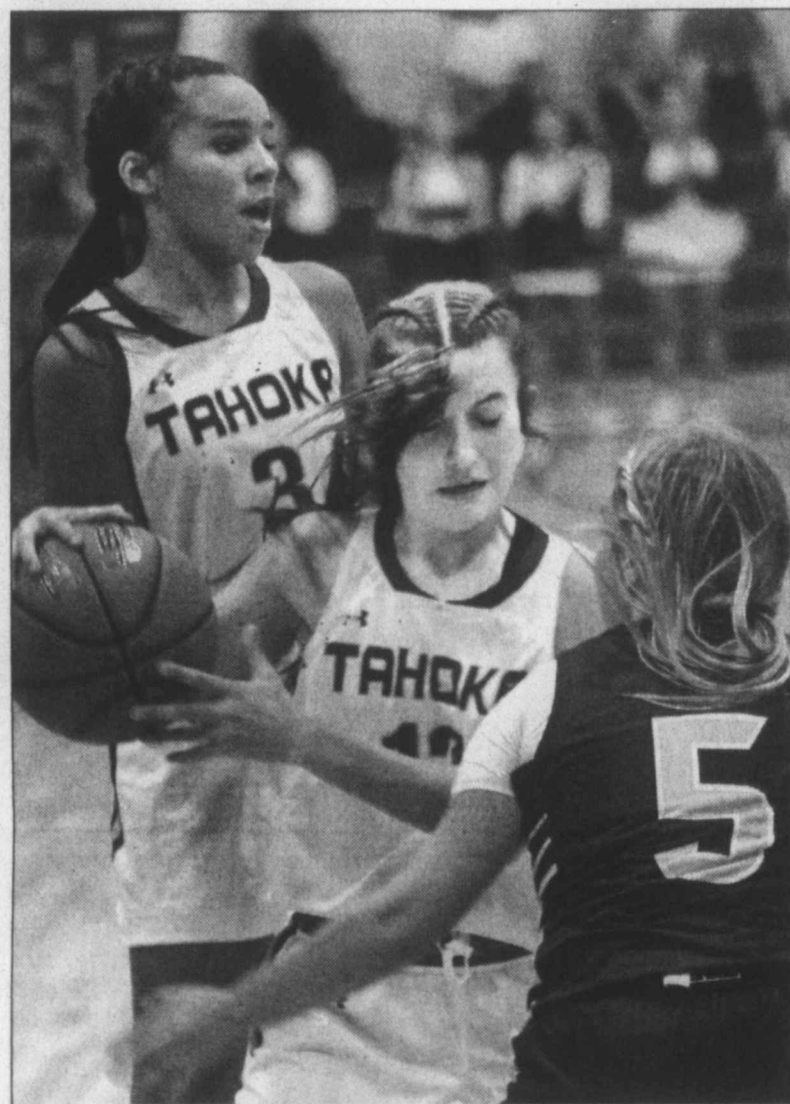
At 8:20 p.m. Nov. 12, a caller reported that she saw a truck parked on CR 19 east of FM 400 with its lights on, and said that she heard a single gunshot. A deputy respond-

ing to the location was unable to locate any vehicles in the area.

LSCO and Tahoka Police responded to other calls during the week as well, for fraud/scam phone

calls, reports of cotton modules on fire, unwanted persons, suspicious vehicle, domestic disturbances, stranded motorists, suspicious persons, and alarms.

Global innovator Tahoka's Dr. Cathy Box to serve on international education committee

A Tahoka woman has been invited to serve on an international education advisory committee, with the goal of identifying innovations in assessing student learning to help improve education across the world. It is an opportunity for Dr. Cathy Box to have global influence in the world of education, and she is excited about the chance to join others in a collaborative effort to inspire teachers with innovative methods of educating students.

Dr. Box is the Director for the Center for Teaching, Learning, and Scholarship (CTLs) at Lubbock Christian University. She has been invited to serve on an advisory committee for HundRED, a global education nonprofit organization that promotes innovations in education.

"HundRED is a not-for-profit organization based in Finland that seeks and shares inspiring innovations in K12 education," Dr. Box told *The News*. "HundRED.org's goal is to help improve education and inspire a movement by encouraging pedagogically sound, ambitious innovations to spread across the world. They are currently partnering with the Jacobs Foundation spotlight on 'Formative Assessment: Improving Learning for

Every Child' to identify 10-15 impactful and scalable education innovations that promote the systematic use of formative assessments to inform teaching and improve learning for each student. This project contributes to the strategic goals of the Jacobs Foundation's Learning Schools Portfolio and HundRED's mission of helping every child to flourish in life," she explained.

"I was asked to serve on HundRED's Advisory Board to review the leading educational practices and solutions from around the world on Formative Assessment and evaluate which ones should be included to feature in a collection of highly impactful and scalable innovations," said Dr. Box.

"According to their email, the HundRED Advisory Board is a

specialist group of stakeholders in education formed by educators, researchers, students, innovators, and experts from all over the world, so I will be one of many! Formative Assessment has been the focus of my research and writing for over 10 years, plus Palgrave Macmillan published a book I wrote a few years ago entitled *Formative Assessment in United States Classrooms: Changing the Landscape of Teaching and Learning*. The book and other publications are probably one of the reasons I was asked to serve on this board," she told *The News*.

Dr. Box said that she will work remotely with the advisory board during the month of January, but she does not know how many are on the board at this time.



"The advisory board will have a culminating event this summer in Helsinki that I would love to attend, but I don't know yet if it will work with my schedule," said Dr. Box.

Dr. Box is married to Ray Box of Tahoka, and she has been with LCU since the fall of 2008, serving as an Associate Professor in the School of Education before assuming her role as Director of the CTLs. She also serves as the Quality Enhancement Plan (QEP) Director, and formerly served as the founding Program Coordinator for the Curriculum and Instruction Master's Program in the Graduate School of Education.

She holds a Ph.D. in Curriculum and Instruction, a Master of Science in Multidisciplinary Science, and a Bachelor of Science from Texas Tech University in Lubbock, Texas. In her duties at Lubbock Christian University she provides faculty development and enrichment programs for all faculty, she leads the EquipLCU Learning Scholars as they find ways to enhance learning in their college courses, and she teaches graduate courses that focus on enhancing instruction and assessment practices in the classroom. She also serves as a consultant for schools, teachers, and faculty at the local, state, and national level.

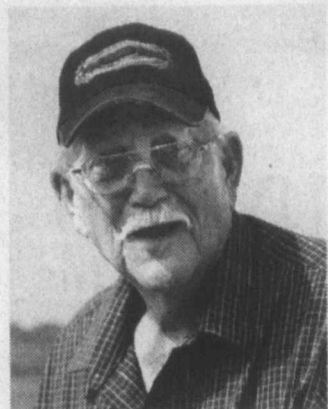
She was preceded in death by P. A. Austin (Father), Willie Austin (Mother); Nettie Lou Parrish (Sister).

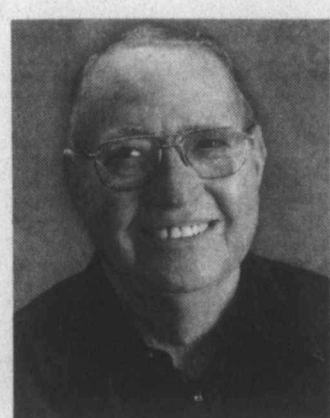
Area crafters have been busily preparing for this year's event.

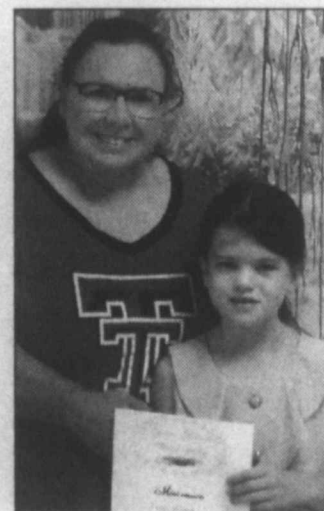

Filing period now open for county offices in March Primary

The filing period opened Saturday, Nov. 13 for persons interested in filing as candidates for any of nine Lynn County offices, but as of Tuesday none of the incumbents or other candidates have filed yet for a place on the ballot, according to information from the Lynn County Republican Party

Chairman. Typically, most local candidates file on the Republican party ticket in Lynn County. John Baker, Lynn County Republican Party Chairman, told *The News* that no candidates have filed as of noon Tuesday.

There are nine county positions whose terms will be up for election in the March 2022 Primary elections, including County Judge, County Sheriff, County Clerk, District Clerk, County Treasurer, Pct 2 and 4 Commissioners, and both Justice of the Peace offices (Pct. 1 and 4).

These terms of office will begin in January 2023. County officials serve four-year terms and must file in the year before the term ends in order to be placed on the ballots for the March Primary elections. The filing period continues through Dec. 13, with filing to be conducted through the local county chairman of the Republican or Democrat parties.

To file on the Republican ticket, contact Baker at (806) 789-1257.

Currently there is no Lynn County Democrat Party Chairman. However, candidates interested in filing on the Democratic party ticket should be able to file through the State Democrat party, since there is no local county chairman.

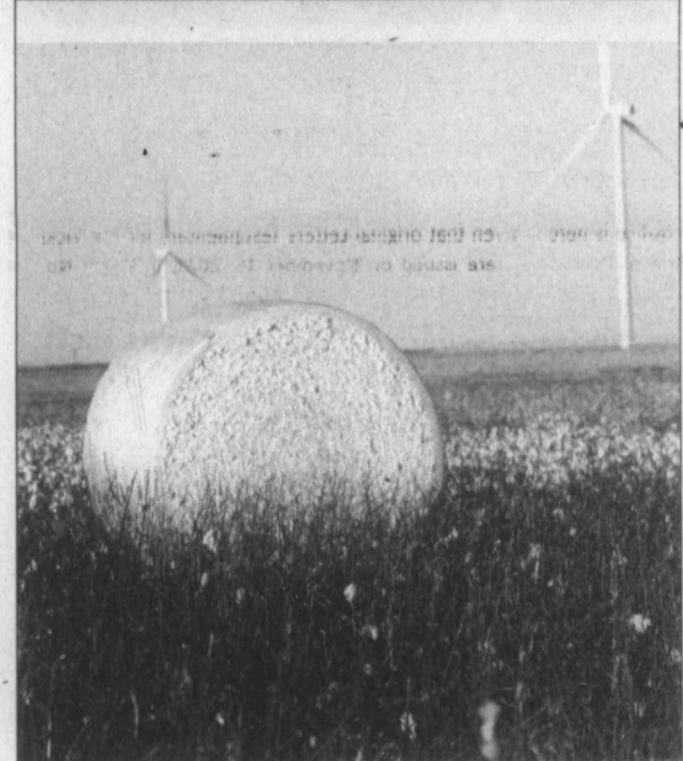
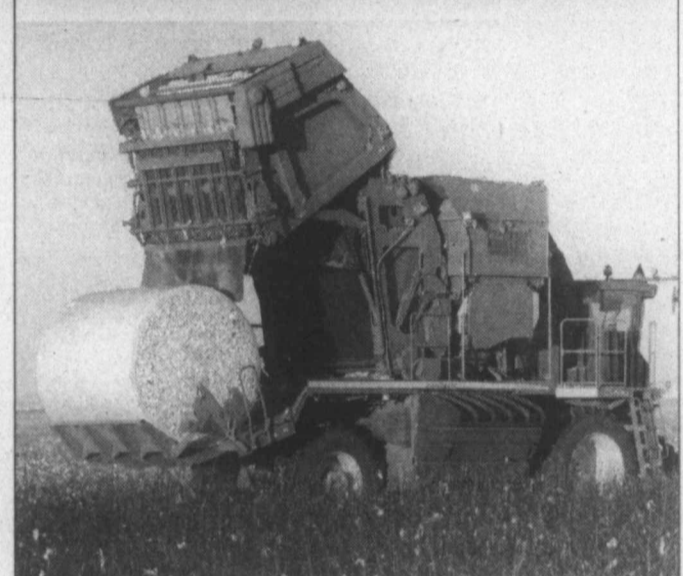
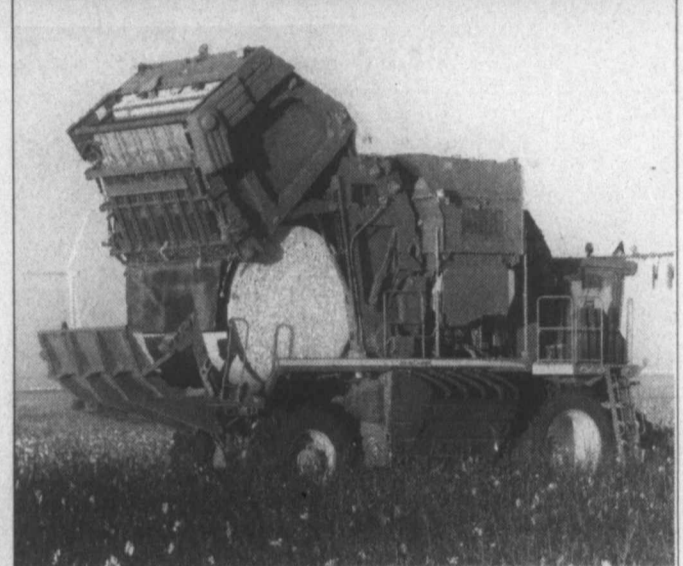
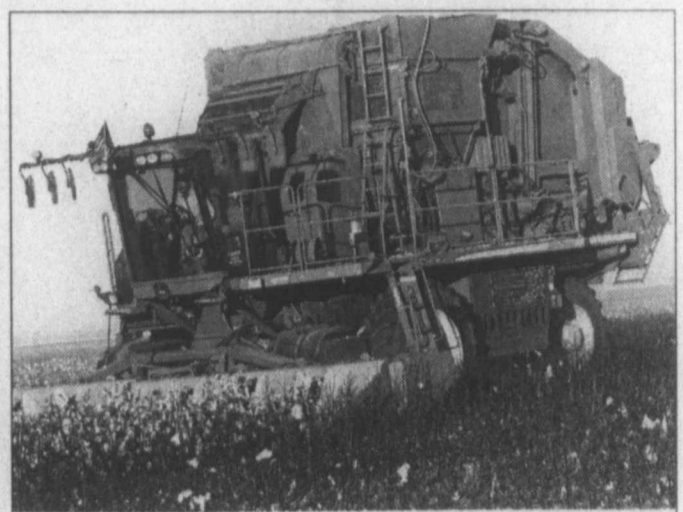
City/County Library hours to change

The round bale cotton picker is a non-stop harvesting process that eliminates the need for a boll buggy and module builder, as it picks the cotton, forms the cotton in a round bale and automatically wraps the bale in a plastic-like wrapping that protects the cotton. This series of photos shows the process as the round bale is picked, wrapped, and then deposited onto the field, ready for transportation to a gin.
