Did you know? ... about the Brain

Did you know blinking could serve as mental rest, not eye lubrication?

The intuitive reason why humans blink so much, 15 to 20 times per minute, is for eye lubrication. But research suggests that it's actually to give our brains a break. Although these breaks only last for a few seconds, they could be giving the brain a chance to go idle and recharge.

Did you know why we yawn?

The most popular, but likely wrong, theory is that yawning increases levels of oxygen to the brain. A more plausible theory: Yawning cools the brain down. A study conducted on mice found that as mice sucked in air, their jaws stretched—this increases blood flow to the brain. This combination of cooler air intake when yawning mixed with the blood flowing to the brain is thought to eventually cool the brain down.

Lynn County Healthcare System is sponsoring a County-wide Adult Health Fair in Tahoka next Thursday, Oct. 20.

The adult health fair is free and open to all citizens, from 9 a.m.-1 p.m. at the Life Enrichment Center, 1717 Main Street (enter through west entrance).

Free health screening for vision and blood pressure will be offered, and flu shots will available at a cost of \$25 (or free with Medicare card).

Other health-related information will be provided by a variety of organizations, including the Headstart program, parenting information, insurance information, grief counseling, Catholic charities, Germ Blast, 211 Texas, fitness information, WIC program, child safety, Southwest Parkinson's Society, diabetes care, victim's assistance, Covid information, and more.

LCHS has also sponsored

health fairs for youth in all Lynn County school districts, which provided information about 9-1-1, fire safety, EMS, demonstrations by the Lynn County Sheriff's Office K-9 team Deputy Dalton Erb and Dodger, and other helpful information.

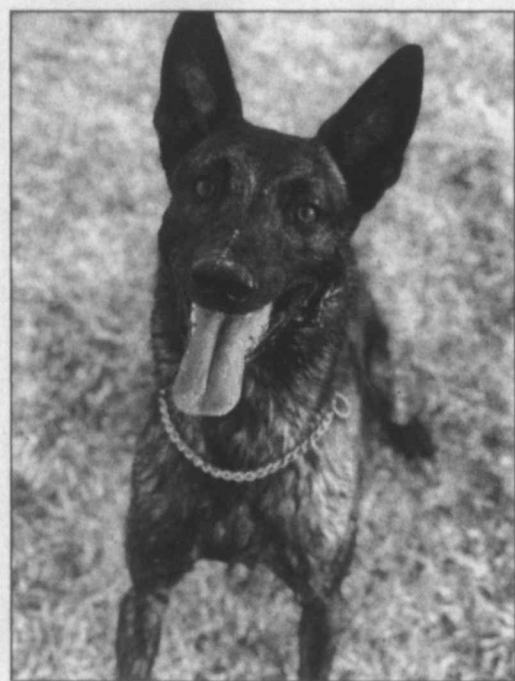

K-9

LCSO's new K-9 team to provide firearms/explosives detection

There's a new dog in town – and he's got skills. Deputy Jake Amason and his K-9 partner, Kova, are new to the Lynn County Sheriff's Office. K-9 team Jake and Kova add another dimension of expertise and crime-solving/prevention tools to local law enforcement that provides a valuable proficiency for detecting firearms and explosives. They are the second K-9 team to join the LCSO, providing the explosives detection, along with narcotics detection provided by Deputy Dalton Erb and K-9 Dodger, who joined the force earlier this year.

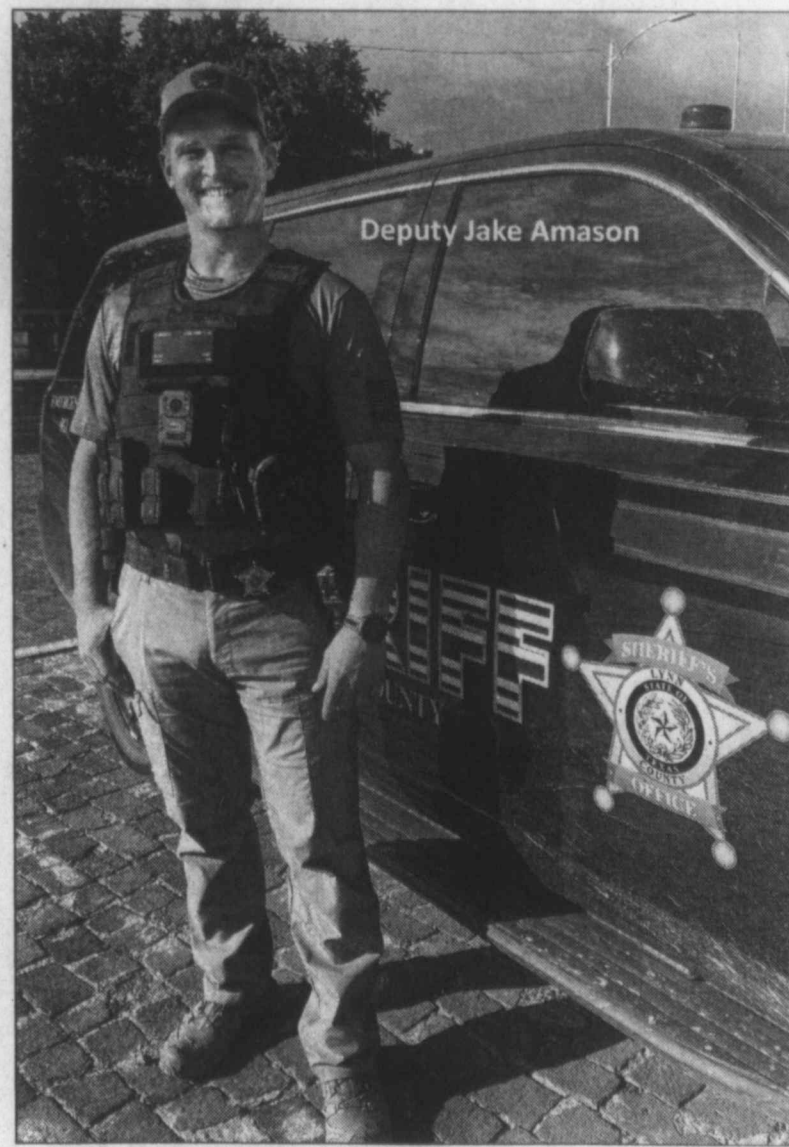
Deputy Amason is bringing his own dog, a 5-year-old Dutch Shepherd named Kova who has had years of specialized training, with him to the LCSO force. However, additional funding is needed to purchase some of the special equipment to allow the team to provide the K-9 services to the department.

Lynn County Sheriff Wanda Mason is asking for community donations of approximately \$6,000 to help fund the special equipment needed for the K-9 team.

"Firearms and explosives K-9s are widely considered the most effective and adaptive method for explosives detection and are proven

to combat crime and build community relations," Sheriff Mason said. "Deputy Amason's K-9 Kova is specially trained to sniff out firearms and explosives. This is the kind of dog that has been used for years at schools, stadiums, hospitals, parades, and other places that draw big crowds," she explained.

"LCSO's goal is to provide this significant service to the citizens of Lynn County and the surrounding communities while keeping deputy safety first in mind. The average cost of funding a new K-9 team is \$20,000-\$30,000 and is not traditionally funded by the government. We are requesting approximately

\$6,000 for the remaining items needed, including a transport cage, harness, heat alert system for the vehicle, safety strobe, a collapsible crate, and other smaller equipment," she said.

It is the objective of the LCSO

to seek assistance from the community to raise these funds to properly equip the new K-9 team. An initial fundraiser has already been set in place, with a benefit meal scheduled for this Sunday, Oct. 16

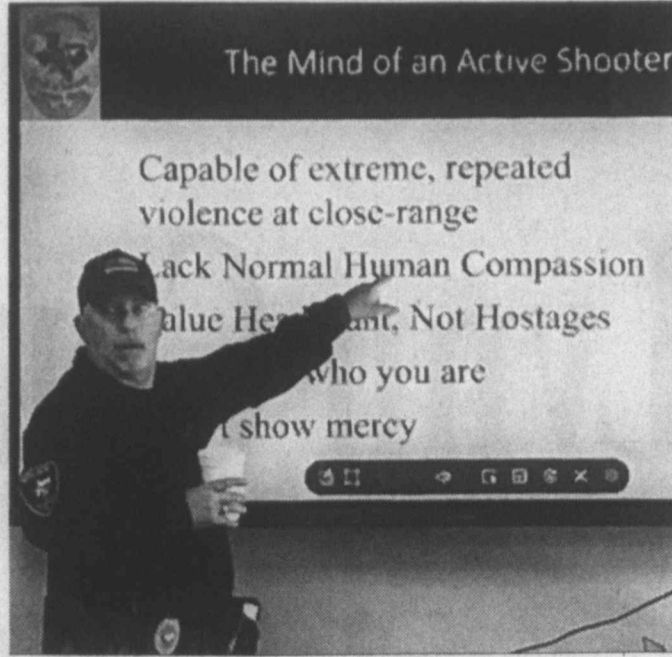
LCH department heads have active shooter training here

Lynn County Healthcare System departmental heads participated in an active shooter training session led by Tahoka Police Chief Jeff Parker here Tuesday morning. The training was held at the LCH Barb Cook Learning Center at LCH facilities, with approximately 30 staff members attending.

The three-hour session provided relevant information including facts and circumstances about other active shooting incidents, the mindset of active shooters and how it can be a stranger or a co-worker or other known person who for reasons that could be unknown becomes an active shooter, and other information.

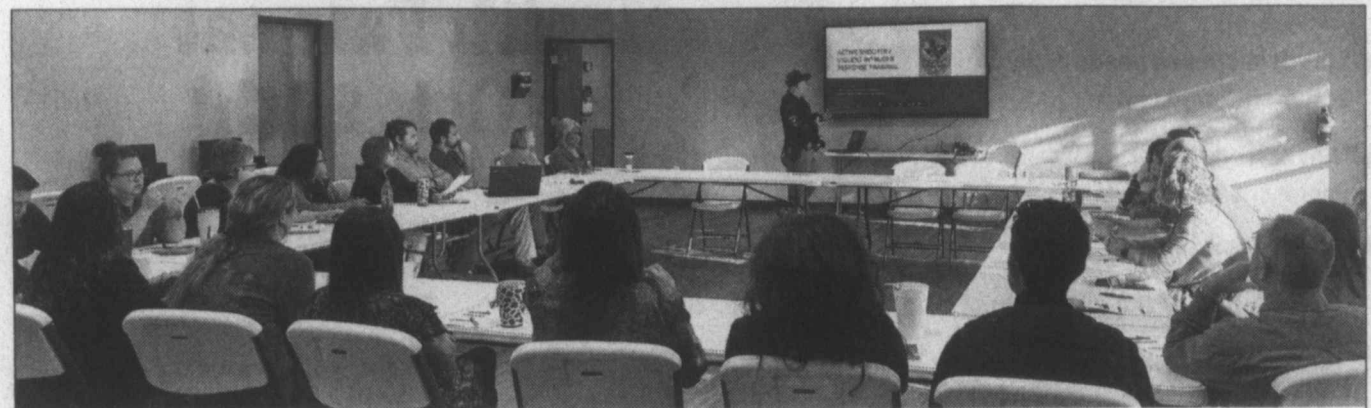
Chief Parker took the staff through preparedness and possible response scenarios in case of an active shooter or violent intruder occurrence.

Officials at LCHS said that the training session was deemed important in order to help formulate policies and protocols for Lynn County Healthcare facilities.

New start dates for Medicare Part B coverage is coming in 2023

Changes are coming next year for when Medicare Part B coverage starts.

What is not changing:
If you are eligible at age 65, your Initial Enrollment Period (IEP):

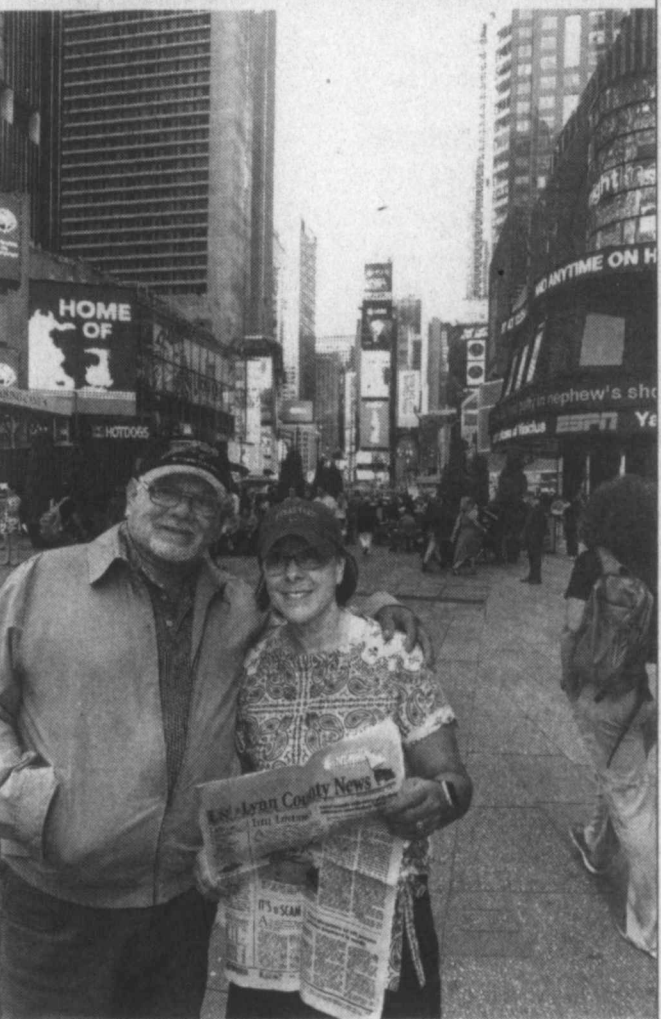
- Begins three months before your 65th birthday.
- Includes the month of your 65th birthday.
- Ends three months after your 65th birthday.

your 65th birthday.
If you are automatically enrolled in Medicare Part B or if you sign up during the first three months of your IEP, your coverage will start the month you're first eligible. If you sign up the month you turn 65, your coverage will start the first day of the following month. This won't change with the new rule.

What is changing:
Starting January 1, 2023, your Medicare Part B coverage starts the first day of the month after you sign up if you sign up during the last three months of your IEP. Before this change, if you signed up during the last three months of your IEP, your Medicare Part B coverage started two to three months after you enrolled.

If you don't sign up for Medicare Part B during your IEP, you have another chance each year during the General Enrollment Period (GEP). The GEP lasts from January 1 through March 31. Starting January 1, 2023, your coverage starts the first day of the month after you sign up. You can learn more about these updates on the Medicare webpage at www.ssa.gov/medicare.

New K-9 Team joins LCSO ...

at Crusher's 40-Weight Coffee Shop in Tahoka, with a pulled pork sandwich meal offered for \$10/person.

The meal will be served beginning at 11 a.m., until sold out. Dine-in or carryout plates will be available, at Crusher's Coffee Shop located at 1906 Main Street in Tahoka. Owners Michael and Tammi Angeley are providing the venue and will also supply homemade french fries, while Allen Elrod has volunteered to prepare the pulled pork sandwiches. Red Raider Wrecker is providing bottled water for the meal. Thrivent Financial, a company which supplements fundraisers, is providing funding for a portion of the cost of the food, with the remaining costs being donated, which means all proceeds will benefit the K-9 Kova fund.

Community donations will also be accepted. To contribute by mail, send a check to Lynn County Sheriff's Office, noting that it is for the LCSO-K9 fund, 810 Lockwood St., Tahoka, TX 79373.

Deputy Amason plans to bring Kova to the benefit, to meet the community and show off some of his skills.

"I've had Kova since he was eight weeks old, and we've been training together weekly since then," Amason told *The News*. "We've been through years of training together, and I love working with him," he added.

Amason grew up in Plainview, and was a patrol officer with the Plainview Police Department. He also has a military background, serving five years in the U.S. Army in Special Ops. He worked two years with a private contractor providing fireworks/explosives detection with Kova, working schools and other venues, as well as Texas Tech University games.

He said the opportunity to work at Lynn County Sheriff's Office was not only good timing, but that he had been building relationships with Lynn County citizens through Castle Firearms Training Center, which is a gun range and training facility in Lynn County.

"I love it here," Amason said with enthusiasm. "I love the size of the community, I like that everybody seems to know each other. It kind of reminds me of the old west," he said with a smile.

Deputy Amason will also be a member of the LCSO SWAT team, as well as patrolling with Kova and providing the fireworks/explosives detection.

Their services could be a major asset to the school districts in the county, if such services are required.

"With the schools the small sizes they are here in Lynn County, Kova could run a detection through it in 15 minutes - much quicker than a person could conduct a search," Amason said. "It is

unfortunate that these kinds of services are needed these days, but it is better to have it available when or if it may be needed."

He enjoys a good relationship with Kova, and treats him as a pet while off-duty.

"My mother rescued Collies, so I've been around dogs my whole life, and even showed dogs when I was a kid. A relationship with a dog is one that cannot be replicated, it's just a special bond. I really enjoy the work that Kova and I do together," said Amason.

The specialized equipment that is needed for equipping the new K-9 team at LCSO includes a transport insert designed to fit the LCSO vehicles (\$2,700), K9 deployment and heat system w/pager (\$1,350), a collapsible crate (\$850), K9 patrol harness (\$360), K9 safety strobe (\$200), and other smaller equipment, totaling \$5,800.

Should more funds be contributed than what is currently needed for the K9 fund, the remaining funds will remain designated for the K9 program, to be used for additional training and safety equipment not currently provided by county funding, according to information from Sheriff Mason.

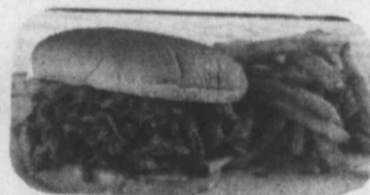

Late night house fire here is under investigation by State Fire Marshal

Multiple agencies here responded to a structural fire at 1 a.m. Oct. 8, at a house located just north of the Texas Department of Transportation facility on the US 87 access road in Tahoka.

The structure was reportedly fully engulfed in flames when Tahoka Volunteer Fire Department, Lynn County Sheriff's Office, Tahoka Police, DPS, and Lynn County EMS arrived on scene. According to reports, no one was injured and the house was reportedly vacant, but Tahoka Police reportedly

detained an individual at or near the scene, on charges of Public Intoxication. The cause of the fire was undetermined. The State Fire Marshal's office is investigating the fire.

A two-vehicle accident occurred in Tahoka at 2:45 p.m. Oct. 4, when two drivers backing out of opposing driveways at the same time in the 1900 block of South 1st Street accidentally bumped into each other. Patty Spruiell was the driver of a 2006 Chevrolet Suburban, and Melissa Charon was the driver of a 2019 Toyota Camry. Some minor damage

occurred, but no injuries were reported.

Aaron Hernandez, 23, was the driver of a 2019 gray Dodge Charger that struck a guardrail underneath the US 380 overpass in Tahoka about 4:45 a.m. Oct. 8. Reports indicate that the vehicle was headed northbound on US 87 when a possible flat tire caused the vehicle to swerve across lanes and cross the median, striking the inner guardrail and then going back across the highway to the right before stopping. Lynn County Sheriff's Office received a call at 4:40 a.m.

with a caller reporting a male standing in the southbound lanes of US 87 jumping up and

down and waving his arms, apparently trying to flag down a ride. When officers arrived at the scene, the vehicle was abandoned and the driver had left the scene. The following morning, LCSO received a call from a woman in Lamesa who inquired about the vehicle, saying that her son had had a flat tire the previous night. No citations were reportedly issued.

Tahoka Police assisted Lynn County EMS in transporting a youth apparently having a seizure at the Tahoka High School gym at 9 a.m. Oct. 6.

A female reported to LCSO on Oct. 4 that she had been sexually assaulted by an ex-boyfriend at a residence in New Home.

On Oct. 3, a caller reported that a county road grader had torn up his fence on property on FM 211, and said that it had happened a couple of times before as well.

The New Home ISD School Resource Officer reported that had to break up a fight between two male juveniles at the school, at 11:50 a.m. Oct. 4.

A New Home resident reported that he was the victim of a phone scam on Oct. 4, and a filed a report with officers.

A female was reported to be walking in the middle of the road on US 84 at 12:12 a.m. Oct. 9. A Lubbock EMS ambulance that was traveling on the highway reported to LCSO that a female was seen walking in the road and trying to jump in front of vehicles. The ambulance stopped to check on her, and reported to officers that she may have been "somewhat intoxicated"

but that nothing appeared to be medically wrong with her. A deputy met the ambulance and transported the woman to an address she provided as a friend's house, but the house was vacant. The deputy then took the woman to a location in Slaton until she could be picked up.

Police responded to the 1800 block of N. 1st at 4 p.m. Oct. 8 in response to a dispute reported between neighbors, reportedly over a dog tearing up paper in the neighbor's driveway.

At 6 p.m. Oct. 9, Tahoka Police stopped a white SUV that was reportedly seen speeding on US 87, at the request of a DPS trooper who had reported the vehicle and asked assistance with stopping the vehicle. DPS issued a citation for speeding to the driver.

Other calls during the week were for reports of reckless drivers, suspicious persons, welfare concerns, and assisting motorists.

Tahoka Police Chief Jeff Parker and other department members led a three-hour active shooter training at the LCHS Barb Cook Learning Center Tuesday morning for departmental heads of Lynn County Healthcare System.
