going for the GOLD! Leopards are Regional Champions, now prepare for State Semifinals

The New Home Leopards made school history on Friday as the District 4-2A Division II Regional Final Champions against the Wellington Skyrockets, winning 35-20. This is the furthest in the playoffs New Home has reached in both six-man and eleven-man football programs – and they're still in the running for another school record as they head to the State Semifinals this week.

Junior quarterback, Brazos Beck, was nominated as a contender for Lubbock Avalanche Journal's Athlete of the Week. Beck passed for four touchdowns, rushed for one, and totaled 307 passing yards. On defense, he had 14 tackles and one interception.

The Leopards defense held the Skyrockets to one touchdown in the second half. Leading the Leopards in tackles was senior, Braxton Beck, with 16 tackles, followed by junior, Logan Addison, with 14 tackles. Senior, Brady Brown, had 11 tackles, sophomore, Baron Bass, had 10 tackles, and junior, Graham Keys, had 10 tackles.

Contributing to the score for the Leopards was senior, Jackson Raines, with two touchdowns,

and senior, Brody Emert, with two touchdowns.

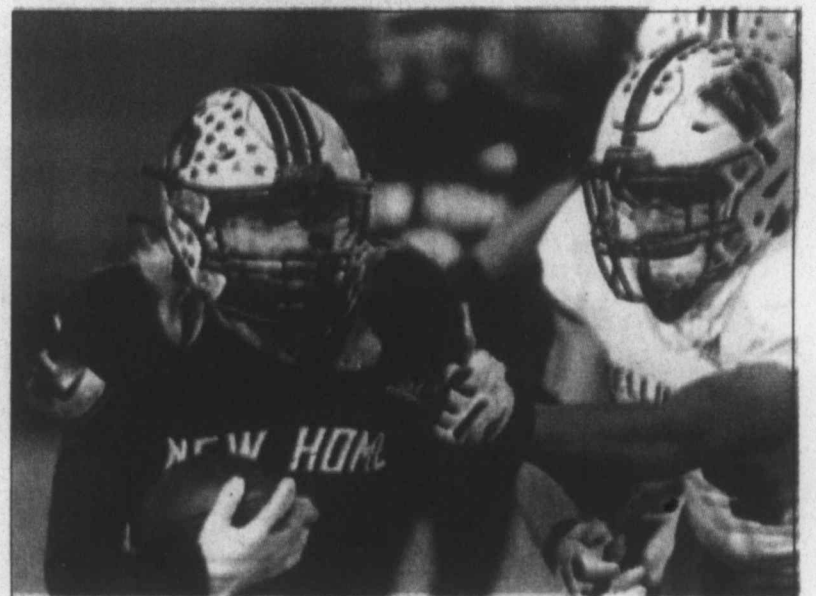
The Leopards will face the Albany Lions for the State Semifinal Championship tonight (Thursday), playing at 7 p.m. at the Mustang Bowl in Sweetwater.

"Albany is tough and I think the key to winning this week will be focus," said New Home football player Brody Emert. "Focus during practice is a must, but all week as well."

The furthest level the Leopards have achieved as a football program in the playoffs was the Regional Semi-Final Championship in 1988.

Head coach for the 2022 Leopards is Jon Ward.

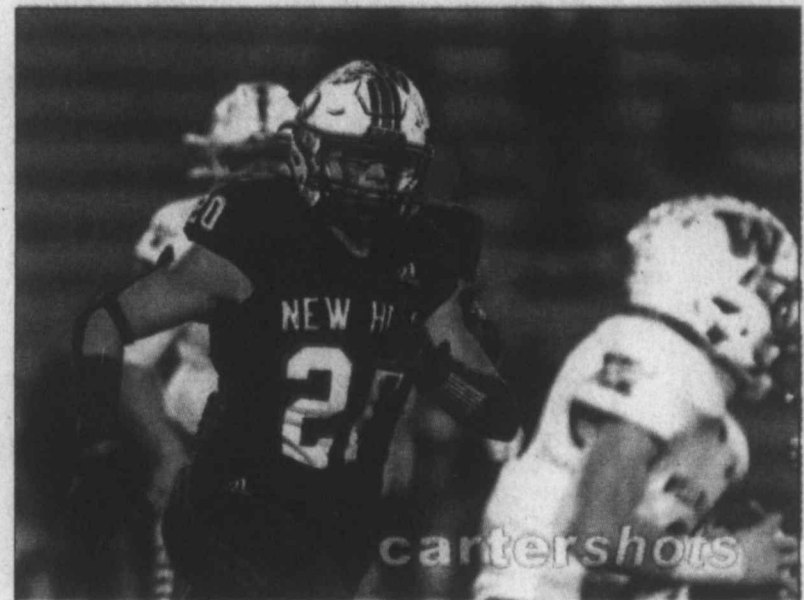

Local hospital is not closing

Despite some unintended indications, the Lynn County Hospital is not in danger of closing, according to hospital CEO Dr. Melanie Richburg, who told *The News* this week that a Lubbock news station ran photos depicting Lynn County Hospital in a story recently about some rural hospitals being in danger of closure.

Dr. Richburg said the news station ran a series of photos along with the news report about rural hospital closures, and while the report did not name Lynn County Hospital as one of the closures – or in fact name any actual hospitals – the accompanying photos with the story actually showed the Lynn County Hospital logo in several photos.

"It was all very misleading, and we began receiving phone calls immediately after the report was aired," Richburg told *The News*. "So, I just wanted our citizens to know that Lynn County Hospital is not, and never has been, in danger of closing," she stated.

She said she believed that the rural hospitals that were in danger of closure were actually in south and east Texas, but that the station pulled the stock photos they had of a rural hospital in this area, which happened to be Lynn County Hospital.

LAW OFFICER REPORTS

Possible kidnapping, arrest in naked-man case, five traffic accidents keep local officers busy

Five traffic accidents, a fleeing driver, a report of a possible kidnapping, an arrest in a naked-man case, and other incidents kept law enforcement officers busy during the past week.

Tahoka Police received a call at 5:15 p.m. Nov. 29 from a Lubbock man who said he was sitting in his vehicle outside a residence in the 2100 block of N. 4th Street in Tahoka, and said that he believed his wife had been kidnapped and was being held inside the home. When officers arrived at the scene and

spoke with the man, he explained that he believed that his wife was being held inside the residence and was tied to a chair, according to police reports. While speaking to the man, police received another call, this time from the homeowner of the residence, who said he had noticed the police activity outside his

home on his home security video and wanted to know what was happening, as there was no one home. After further investigation, police learned that the man initiating the call about the kidnapping thought he was in Lamesa, and not Tahoka, and he admitted that he was going through a divorce. Police said there was no such address in Lamesa, and the man eventually left the scene. No charges were filed.

Police made an arrest this week in connection with an Oct. 17 report

of a naked man reportedly seen on home security video outside a local residence at 3:23 a.m. Police arrested the man at 11:50 p.m. Dec. 2 at a residence in the 1700 block of N. 2nd on three warrants issued in connection with the case, including two counts of indecent exposure and one charge of criminal trespass.

A police officer on patrol was flagged down by a convenience store employee at the store located on the US 87 Access Road and

LAMESA – All of more than 65,000 people in the huge Lucas Oil Stadium in Indianapolis had to have known in advance who won the team title in the national FFA Milk Quality and Products competition.

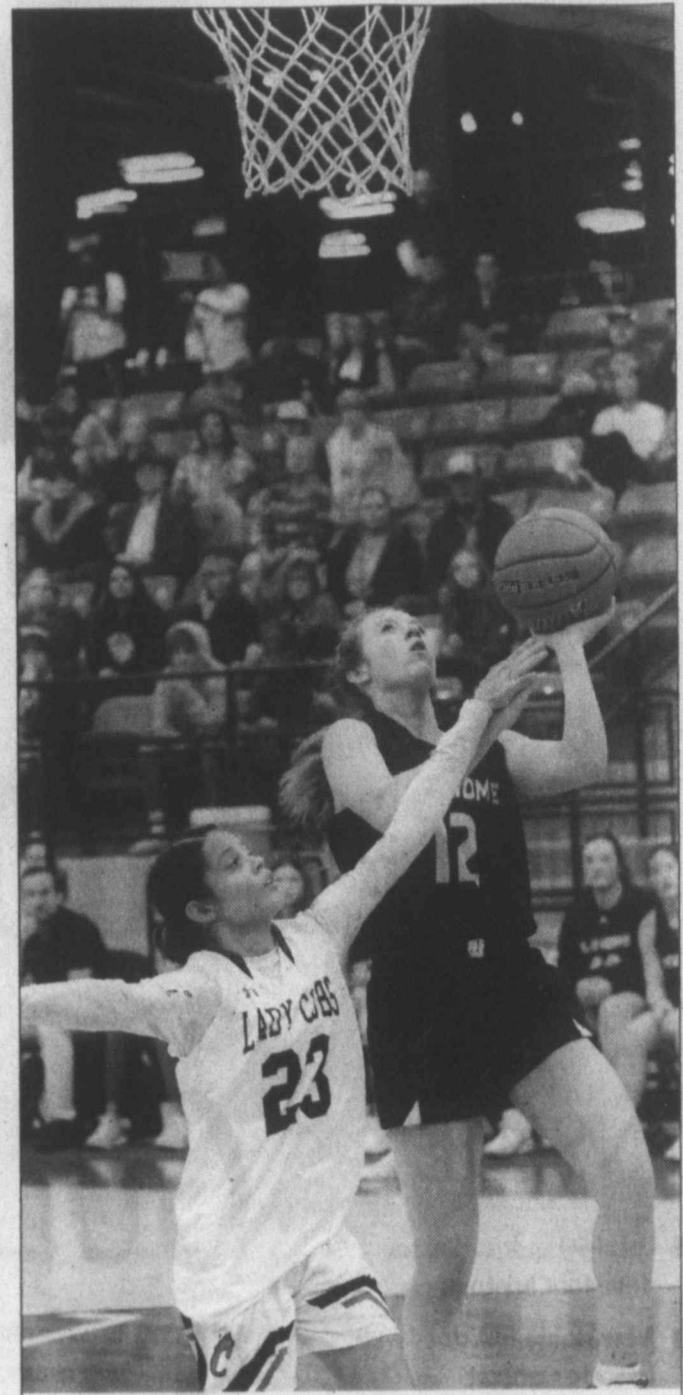
The individual placing had been announced on stage at the 95th National FFA Convention and Expo immediately before the winning teams were revealed.

When all four members of one team are among the top 10 individual finishers – including a sweep of the top three places – the team championship is practically certain.

Known in the competition simply as the Texas team, it was four girls from Klondike High School, just south of Lamesa, who shined the brightest on the national stage.

In addition to winning the team title, junior Raeligh Bellows won the individual crown, senior Neihmaya “Maya” Howard was second, sophomore Fallon Warren placed third, and senior Bella Stevens was seventh.

LAMESA – Lamesa Economic Development hosted a groundbreaking ceremony recently for the planned new Toot'n Totum travel center here.

The event was held at the construction site located at the northeast corner of Hwy. 87 and N. 22nd St., just south of the Mitch Hall auto dealership.

LEDC officials last December agreed to provide Amarillo-based Toot'n Totum a grant totaling \$300,000 to assist with the Lamesa store, which is expected to provide about 40 full-time equivalent jobs here. Those funds are not scheduled to be paid out, however, until the company meets certain construction and employment requirements.

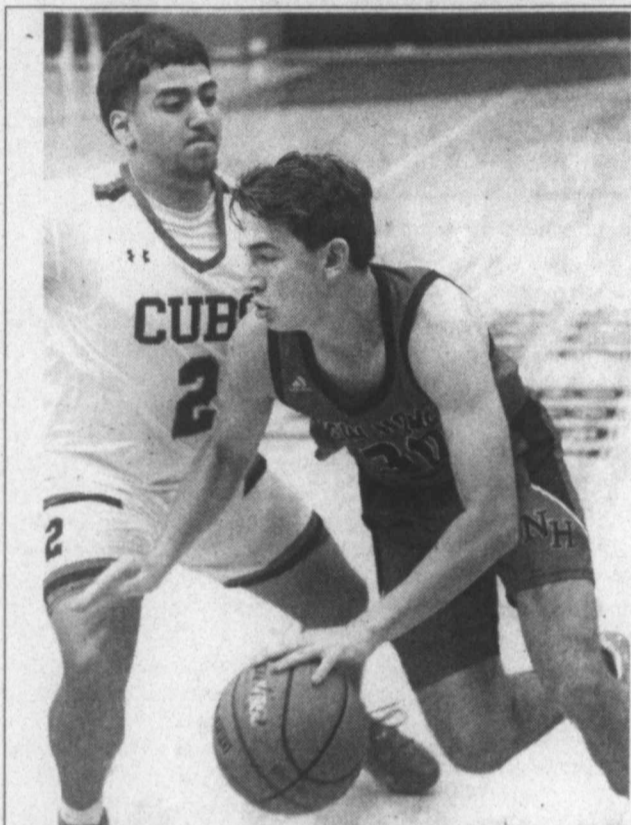

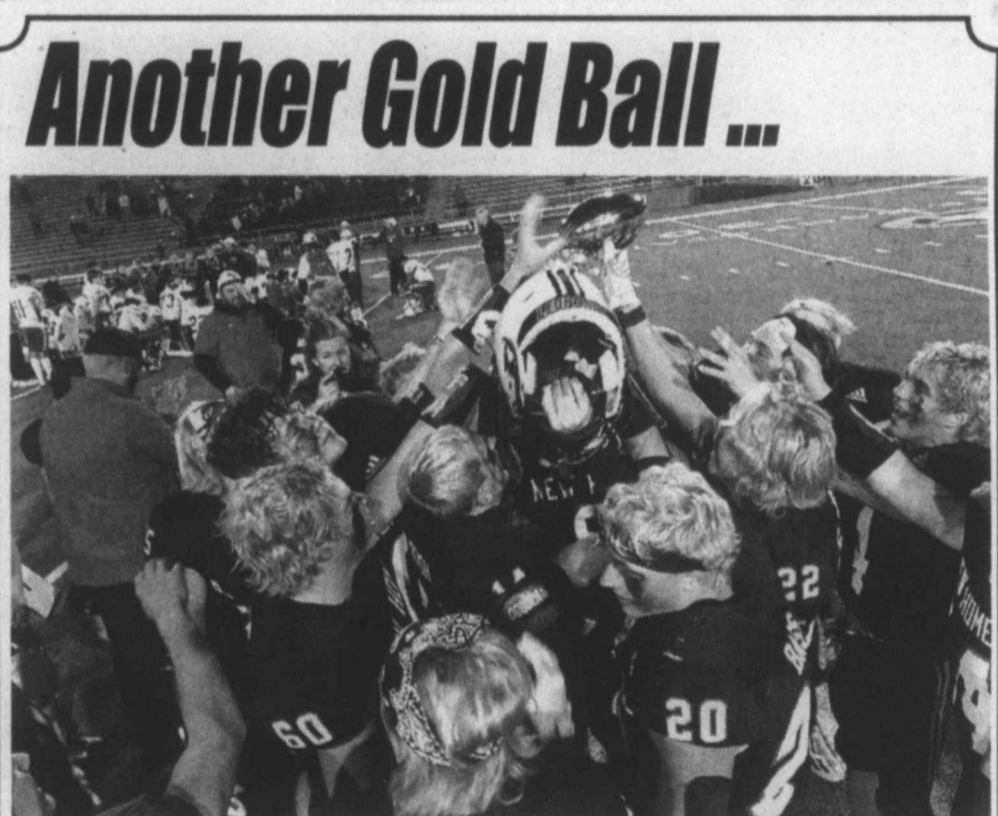

Hwy 380, at 10:47 p.m. Dec. 3. The employee pointed out a vehicle that was leaving the parking lot and told the officer that the female driver had taken a bottle of wine from the store without paying, after store employees refused to sell the alcohol to her, because they believed that she appeared intoxicated. The officer followed the fleeing vehicle to a residence in the 1300 block of Avenue J in Tahoka, where the female reportedly went inside and refused to come out. Relatives of the woman arrived on the scene to assist officers in gaining access into the home, and the woman was arrested on three charges, including Driving While Intoxicated, Evading Arrest with a Motor Vehicle, and Theft.

Five traffic accidents

occurred in the county, two of which involved vehicles striking deer, and one involving cows in the roadway.

A one-vehicle rollover was reported at 8:05 a.m. Nov. 29 about 4 miles west of US 87 on CR 38. A caller told Lynn County Sheriff's Office (LCSO) that there were still some people inside the vehicle. LCSO, DPS, Lynn County EMS, and O'Donnell Volunteer Fire Dept. all responded to the scene. EMS transported at least one person to Lynn County Hospital for medical treatment, according to call sheet reports.

At 7:20 a.m. Dec. 2, a caller reported his pickup had struck a deer 12 miles north of Tahoka on US 87 in the southbound lanes. LCSO and DPS responded to the accident, and the vehicle was towed from the scene. Another incident of a vehicle striking a deer was at 6:17 p.m. Dec. 4 about 10 miles north of Tahoka on US 87, also in the southbound lanes. The driver reported that her Toyota 4-Runner was still drivable and airbags had not deployed, and there were no injuries reported.

Two cows were in the median and a caller reported that a car was totaled on the side of the road of US 87 and CR 1, at 7:16 p.m. Dec. 4. The caller told LCSO that a male inside the vehicle was requesting EMS. LCSO, DPS, and Lynn County EMS all responded to the scene, and the male driver was transported to a Lubbock hospital. The owner of the cows was also notified.

A red Hyundai Santa Fe struck a pole in the median on US 87 about 3 miles north of Tahoka at 9:59 a.m. Dec. 2. The female caller said she was not injured. LCSO, DPS, and Lynn County EMS all responded to the scene. TxDOT was notified of a traffic sign that was hit, and the vehicle was towed from the scene.

A shed was reported on fire at 4:44 a.m. Dec. 2 on CR 11. New Home Volunteer Fire Dept. responded to the scene, reporting to LCSO that it was an outbuilding that was on fire and no threat of spreading.

Several arrests were made following traffic stops. A female was arrested for Possession of a Controlled Substance after a traffic stop on a vehicle on FM 211 at 10:32 p.m. Dec. 1.

A female was arrested during a traffic stop on a vehicle at CR 11 and US 87 at 8:13 p.m. Dec. 3, for an active warrant out of Ector County.

A caller to LCSO at noon Dec. 4 reported a suspicious vehicle was parked on the side of the road on Sam Road, and said that the vehicle had also been parked there the day before. A deputy located the vehicle and arrested a male in the vehicle for Possession of a Controlled Substance.

During a response to a civil matter involving an eviction notice from a residence in New Home Dec. 1, deputies discovered a man had two active municipal warrants out of Tahoka, one for a dog

running loose and one for no Drivers License. He was arrested and transported to Lynn County Jail.

At 5:20 p.m. Dec. 1, Tahoka Police notified a local family of the death of a relative who died as a result of a traffic accident in Gaines County. Louie H Salinas, 67, of Tahoka was pronounced deceased after being transported to Seminole Hospital District following a traffic accident at SH-214 and CR 206 in Gaines County at 2:11 p.m. Dec. 1.

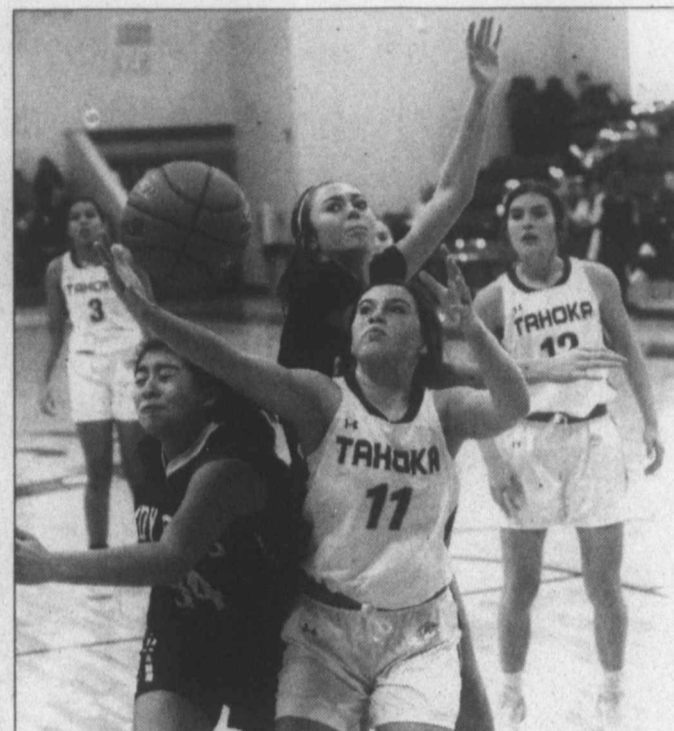
According to information from the Texas Department of Public Safety, Salinas was the driver of a 2008 Pontiac Grand Prix that was traveling westbound on CR 206, that failed to yield the right of way at the stop sign at the intersection of SH-214, and was struck by a 2022 Jeep Wagoneer traveling north on SH-214. Darryl Ramon Jeffley, 48, of Lodi, TX was the driver of the other vehicle. No other injuries were reported.

Theft of 120 gallons of diesel was reported stolen from a John Deere tractor sometime during the past week, from a location about three-fourths of a mile north of FM 211 on CR HH. A caller on Dec. 1 told LCSO that it appeared someone had also taken the tractor out on a joyride and had gotten it stuck and then used his other tractor to pull it out.

LCSO responded to a report of a runaway juvenile at 3:30 p.m. Dec. 1, from a rural residence. The 16-year-old female was eventually located in Lubbock, according to the call sheet report.

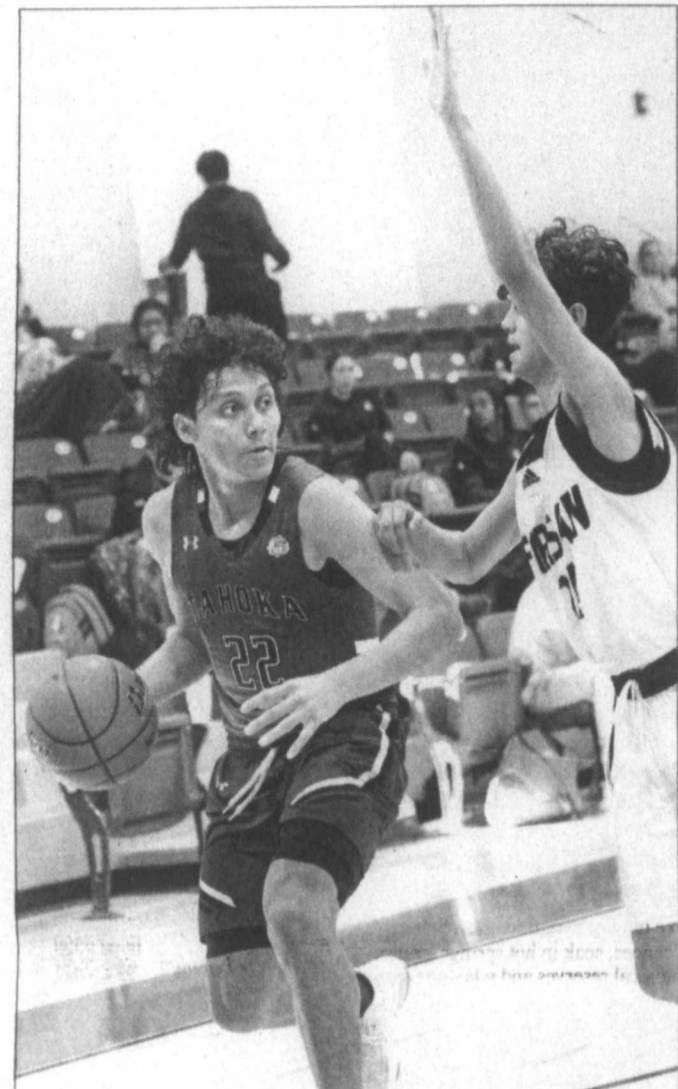

Lamesans feel quake

LAMESA - An earthquake that hit an area northwest of Pecos shortly after 3:30 p.m. on Wednesday, Nov. 16, was felt by some people here but not by others. Pecos is more than 150 miles west-southwest of Lamesa.

Amberlee O'Brien, working at the Tin Bucks Coffee Shop, said she felt the shaking from the quake, which registered 5.4 on the richter scale. O'Brien was sitting at a table when she felt the tremor under her feet. Others sitting next to her felt nothing, however. The experience only lasted a few short seconds.

"It was the weirdest feeling ever," O'Brien said. "I have never experienced anything like that ever. It was crazy. I felt it through my feet and up."

There were reports of people feeling the tremor throughout the Permian Basin, and in other locations such as El Paso, Lubbock, Coahoma and New Mexico, according to an online article.
