### City seeks citizens for new Community Relations Board

he City of Tahoka, with approval from the City Council, is seeking citizens to form a new advisory committee whose purpose would be to serve as liaisons between city officials and the community, to report the community's needs and concerns to the city council in an advisory capacity, as well as to plan events.

"It is important for us to know what our citizens are wanting, what their concerns may be, and we would like for this board to also initiate and plan community events and projects with the city's involvement," explained Julie Arrington, City Administrator.

The City Council unanimously approved a motion at Monday night's council meeting to create a Community Relations Board, and discussed the need for having a diversified representation of citizens from throughout the community.

It was decided to have two citizens represented from each of the four city council districts, as well as additional citizens from at-large, to fill an 11-member board.

In order to implement the initiative, council members discussed finding volunteers for the board by speaking to citizens in their precincts, and to have an application form placed in this newspaper and on social media to provide opportunities for citizens to submit for consideration to serve on the board. To fill the board, each council member may appoint two citizens from the applications to represent their precinct on the board, and the mayor and the at-large council member may appoint three additional citizens.

The deadline for applications to be submitted at City Hall is Wednesday, Jan. 4.


Senior, Jackson Raines, ended his high school football career with nine receptions for 143 yards and two touchdowns.

#### Cities, county get monthly sales tax payments

Texas Comptroller Glenn Hegar announced he will send cities, counties, transit systems and special purpose districts \$1.1 billion in local sales tax allocations for December, 12.4 percent more than in December 2021. These allocations are based on sales made in October by businesses that report tax monthly.

Lynn County's net payment for the month was \$14,081.48, based on a halfcent sales tax rate, making the total payment to date \$194,986.04.

The City of Tahoka's net payment for the month was \$19,231.85, based on a 1.5cent sales tax rate (including a half-cent collection for the Tahoka Economic Development Corporation), making the total payment to date \$267,067.57.

The City of O'Donnell's net payment for the month was \$2,185.24, based on a 1-cent sales tax rate, making the total payment to date \$43,457.50.

The City of Wilson's net payment for the month was \$2,509.88, based on a 1-cent sales tax rate, making the total payment to date \$32,884.22.

#### Police locate woman for doctor concerned about her welfare
