He is employed as the Top Management Manager at Llano Logistics/United Supermarkets in Lubbock.

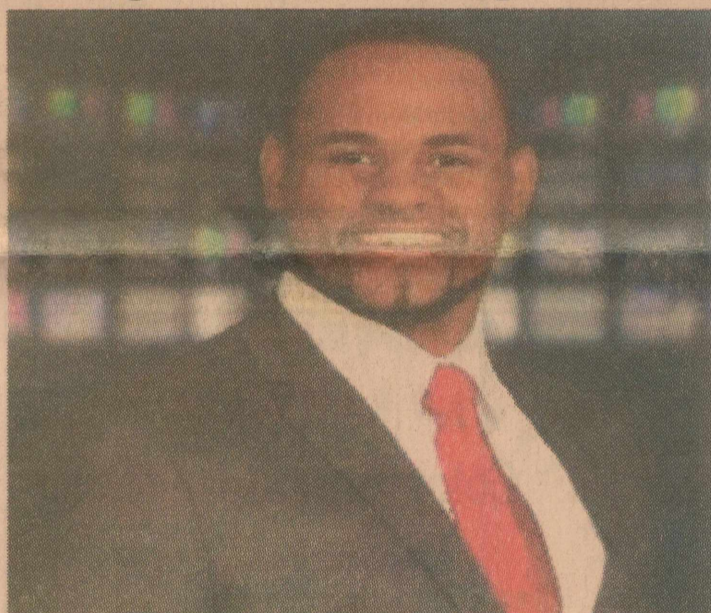
He gave a motivating speech on how important it is for us to be motivated about what we do in life. He had those in attendance excited about his presentation.

### District 2, We Did It!!! Shelia Renee Patterson-Harris Elected To City Council

Shortly after the early voting results during the watch party for the Lubbock City Council District 2 run-off on Saturday, June 25, 2016, at River Smith's, those in attendance shouted "We did it!" At that time, she was leading with a 59.35% to 40%.

There were 1,294 votes casted in the District 2, with 298 being casted on election day. Patterson-Harris won the five voting precincts on the East side of Interstate 27 with 88 percent of the votes casted. Her opponent, Jared Hall, won the five voting precincts on the west side of Interstate with 73 percent of the

votes.

Patterson-Harris is a retired juvenile probation officer and supervisor at the Lubbock County Youth Center and a long-time resident of District 2. She has made it known that her concerns for District 2 are safety, declining infrastructure and the lack of communications from the city.

Patterson-Harris will tell you that District 2 residents have different concerns and issues they feel should be addressed.

With sincerity, she will tell you there's no cookie-cutter solution for District 2, which was

The Coronado Project is a new concept for helping families suffering in poverty. TCP is based around an apartment complex in the Chatman Hill neighborhood. We describe ourselves as "a social service agency that looks like an apartment complex." We don't just provide housing; we help families with the issues they are facing, whether those issues are legal or

personal or financial.

Over half of our 120 residents were homeless or living in poor conditions prior to moving in with us. The "poor conditions" could have been violent or volatile relationships or other unhealthy environments.

Kassey Sexton is our apartment manager; her title is Family Support Specialist. She knows about the lives of each of our residents and works directly with those who need support. Many times Kassey also works as a liaison between our families and the legal system. As she has said on many occasions, "we

don't just help them, we live their lives with them." Kassey has two great assistants; Rachael Rudder who is also a Family Support Specialist and Sandra Young takes care of the administrative functions to make sure our records are complete and orderly.

T. J. Patterson allows us to use the former Mary and Mac School as our office and community center. Currently, we are participating in the Summer Lunch program to feed children a nutritious meal at noon and snacks in the evening.

## U.S. Term Limits Praises Troy Bonar for Signing Term Limits Pledge

Washington, D.C. – U.S. Term Limits (USTL), the leader in the national movement to limit terms for elected officials, today praised Texas U.S. House candidate Troy Bonar (District 19) for signing its congressional term limits pledge.

In November of 2014, 14 new U.S. Term Limits pledge signers were elected to Congress – including five new U.S. Senators.

USTL President Philip Blumel commented on Bonar's pledge, saying, "Troy Bonar's support of term limits shows that we still have candidates out there that recognize there is a need for rotation in office. Congress should have citizen legislators, not career politicians who have lost sight of what their constituents need."

The U.S. Term Limits Amendment Pledge is provided to every announced candidate for federal office. It reads, "I pledge that as a member of Congress I will cosponsor and vote for the U.S. Term Limits amendment of three (3) House terms and two (2) Senate terms and no longer limit."

The U.S. Term Limits Constitutional Amendment has been introduced in both the U.S. Senate by Senator David Vitter (R-LA) and the House of Representatives by Representative Matt Salmon (R-AZ).

Blumel noted, "People are fed up with career politicians in D.C. who put their own self-interest before the needs of their constituents. Fortunately, with candidates like Troy Bonar emerging, pressure will continue to build toward the passage of a term limits amendment."

According to the last nationwide poll on term limits conducted by Gallup, the issue enjoys wide bi-partisan support. The poll showed that 75% of

Americans support congressional term limits.

Gallup's analysis states, "Republicans and independents are slightly more likely than Democrats to favor term limits; nevertheless, the vast majority of all party groups agree on the issue. Further, Gallup finds no generational differences in support for the proposal."

Blumel concluded, "America is in trouble. Our career politicians have let the people down. It is time to limit their terms and

return control of our nation to people who have actually had to create a job, earn an honest paycheck and pay a mortgage. It is time for a constitutional amendment limiting congressional terms."

The term limits amendment bills would require a two-thirds majority in the House and Senate, and ratification by 38 states in order to become part of the constitution.

## Photo Shows Why Black Folk Celebrated Juneteenth 2016



The Emancipation Proclamation marked the end of the legalized institution of slavery in America, but in the small town of Galveston Island, Texas, black slaves had been carrying on their lives of bondage and subjugation, oblivious to the fact that they were actually free.

On June 19th, 1865, Major General Gordon Granger and his band of Union soldiers (who had been traveling throughout the South for two years spreading the word) arrived at Galveston Island to tell the last remaining slaves in the United States that they were finally free.

The day became known as "Juneteenth," a kind of Inde-

## LISD Trustees Ask For August 30, 2016 Election To Access More Than \$5.5 Million

The Lubbock ISD Board of Trustees called for a Tax Ratification Election (TRE) at their board meeting on Thursday, June 16, 2016. The August 30 election will ask voters to approve keeping the district's total tax rate at the same \$1.235 per \$100 valuation while allowing the district to access more than \$5.5 million in state/local funds by shifting two cents of the tax rate from debt service to maintenance and operations. The shift will allow the district an annual increase in state funding to facilitate a "pay-as-you-go model"

for instructional technology and priority capital projects.

Since 2006-07, Lubbock ISD has had the same tax rate of \$1.235, which is comprised of a maintenance and operations tax rate of \$1.04 and a debt service tax rate of \$0.235. The tax rates cannot be adjusted without voter approval. State funding mechanisms reward local tax effort with additional state revenue for each of the two pennies above \$1.04. While the tax rate will not change, the district will be able to service current debt on the existing payout schedule and add

additional revenue to the maintenance and operations budget.

Superintendent Berhl Robertson, Jr., said, "This shift of two pennies from one side of the tax rate to the other is good business. It will allow us to pay cash for priority capital projects and instructional technology, like Chrome books and iPads, rather than financing those things over time. We have managed our bond projects well. We are at a point where we can pay off our debt on schedule and leverage state funds that we are leaving on the table in Austin."

## NAACP Remembers Charleston Victims One Year Later

**BALTIMORE, MD** - The National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) issued the following statement in remembrance of the Charleston 9 on the June 17 anniversary of the shooting at Mother Emanuel A.M.E Church in Charleston, S.C.:

"The last week has been a difficult time for our nation as the lives of 49 innocent people were viciously taken in a nightclub at the hands of a shooter filled with hate and rage. And just one year ago, our nation recoiled in horror after a deluded young man, also filled with senseless hate, killed nine parishioners at weekly Bible study at Mother Emanuel African Methodist Episcopal Church.

"It is morally incomprehensible that this same tragedy plays itself out with a disturbing recurrency. The hateful rhetoric we hear every day on television, on radio, from our elected officials, and even in presidential campaigns fuels and exacerbates the climate of hate that moves terrorists to take so many lives. This rhetoric seeks to paint minority groups as "other," or "the problem with this country today."

"We are angry, we are heartbroken, we are tired. But in times like these, we have to come together to heal. As an organization that was founded to fight against hate and discrimination, we must stand together, take action and make sure our voices are heard. We cannot allow silence to allow violent and hateful speech to grow and fester. We must speak out against hate and continue to urge our elected leaders in Congress to pass responsible gun control measures and hold them accountable for their actions and their words.

"On this tragic anniversary, we call on all the people of this nation to pause for a minute in silent reflection at 9:05 this evening to honor the victims and families of Charleston, Orlando and anyone who has fallen victim to hate. We must use this as a moment to resolve in our own hearts to change through love, fellowship, empathy and compassion. We cannot allow our country to once again mourn innocent lives taken as a result of bigotry, hatred and violence."

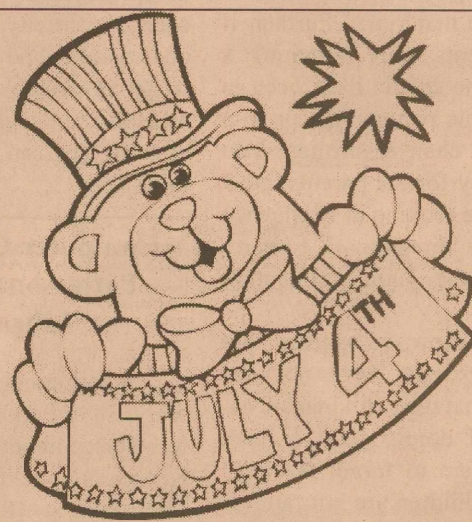

tending the conference, I learned that "Sin is breaking God's law; therefore, Christians are Ex-offenders." Prison ministry is important work, but not everyone has the fervor or passion to help those who are incarcerated. Many incarcerated people need to be trained how to remove emotional pain and recover from their addictions. When we minister to those who are incarcerated, we should recognize and realize that once they transition out, they still need us to continue to humble ourselves and remain faithful servants in ministering to and supporting them.

During this conference, we were blessed by the inspired word of Brother Freddie Anderson. Bro Anderson started as a correctional officer for TDCJ but soon saw he could do more as a religious volunteer. He has been the director of the

Huntsville Institutional Ministry in Huntsville, Texas for over 30 years.

Bill Clayton Detention Center in Littlefield, Texas has been changed to the Texas Civil Commitment Center and has about 210 men ranging in age from 27 to 78 who are convicted sex offenders.

There are now 180 students at the Darrington Unit in Rosharon, Texas enrolled in biblical studies offered by (Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary in Fort Worth. The annual cost of the program is \$250,000. The funds come from the nonprofit Heart of Texas Foundation which was founded by the father of a crime victim.



## Mississippi Holds Out for Confederate Flag One Year After Charleston

One year after public outcry forced the removal of the Confederate flag from state grounds and public institutions following the killing of nine Black churchgoers in Charleston, S.C., by a Confederate flag-waving gunman, there is still refusal by some to let go of the divisive symbol.

The state of Mississippi has been unable to bring itself to remove the Confederate symbol from its flag, remaining the only state in the U.S. still featuring the emblem on its flag, despite 12 bills filed in the state legislature this year to change the flag, which all died in committee.

Even institutions deeply steeped in tradition, such as the University of Mississippi and the University of Southern Mississippi, have removed the symbol from their campuses.

Earlier this month, on Flag Day, opponents of the flag rallied in front of the U.S. Capitol to protest the emblem's presence on Mississippi's flag and call attention to a federal lawsuit arguing the flag incites racial

violence and infringes upon the 14th Amendment protections for Black residents.

Mississippi has the highest percentage of Black residents of any state, at nearly 38 percent.

The lawsuit, filed by Black Mississippi attorney Carlos Moore, claims lawmakers disregarded their duty to act on bills introduced after the Charleston shooting. In addition to infringing on the 14th Amendment, Moore argues that the federal government should remove the flag based on its ability to remove "badges and incidents of slavery" under the 13th Amendment.

Although there is an emotional movement to get rid of the Confederate flag because it symbolizes racial hatred, there is an equally passionate group who claim the flag is a symbol of Southern pride.

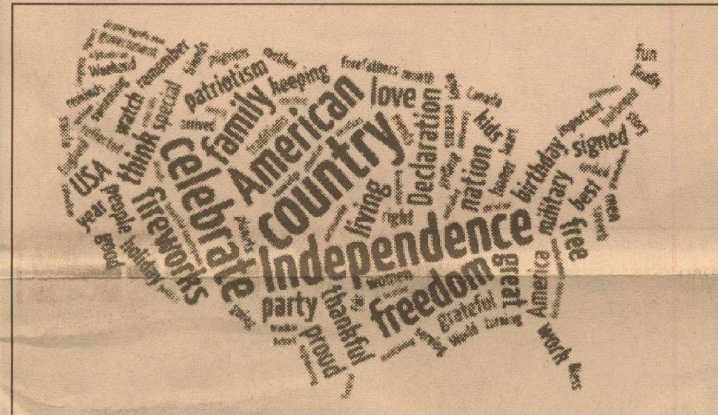
U.S. House Republican leaders earlier this month blocked Democratic Rep. Bennie Thompson of Mississippi from trying to ban Confederate symbols from the House side of the

Capitol, according to The Associated Press, with Thompson, the state's sole Black delegate saying the House "will continue to sanction and glorify relics of bondage, bigotry and oppression."

Moreover, Republican lawmakers quickly passed a bill in the middle of the night last week while all eyes were focused on the Democrats' gun control sit-in, that removed a provision limiting the display of the Confederate flag in certain federal cemeteries. The House had voted in favor of the ban by a vote of 265-159 in May, with most Republicans voting against the ban, but the House-Senate compromise version of that bill, which passed in the middle of the night, did not include the flag provision. The White House has promised to veto the bill as it is currently written.

Meanwhile, the Southern Baptist Convention last week approved a resolution urging Christians to stop displaying the Confederate flag, officially rec-

ogizing it as a "symbol of hatred, bigotry, and racism."

And the Washington National Cathedral this month said it will remove two images of the Confederate flag from the building's stained glass windows, which memorialize Confederate Gens. Robert E. Lee and Stonewall Jackson. They were installed in 1953 after lobbying by the United Daughters of the Confederacy.
