A Love Supreme, **Father to Son**

This is indeed a very rough world to raise a child no matter who or where you are. For a Black man to raise a Black son the odds may be stacked against you. For a Black woman to raise a Black son the odds may be impossible. We proudly take this challenge. For those of us who choose a marriage and then children the odds are on your side if the marriage remains in tack. As Marvin Gaye and Mary Wells sang about "It takes two to make a dream come true." This year for Father's Day my 32-year-old son, Harry III, gave me the greatest card I have ever received. Here it is:

"Two years ago, my dad was fighting for his life. Harry Jr., a veteran and successful entrepreneur idealized for courage, was laid up in bed at Suburban Hospital in Bethesda, MD with a subdural hematoma. Turned out that a small spill he had at home a month prior turned into a serious situation.

He hit his head after tripping and it slowly turned into a subtle leak of blood between his brain and his skull. Luckily, my mom noticed him off-balanced the morning before a 12-hour flight to the Seychelles for business. She immediately drove him to the doctor. The doctor suggested a routine CT scan and it wasn't even an hour later that he recommended emergency surgery. Had my dad flown, the pressure in his head would have killed him. After weeks of cognitive and physical therapy, my dad eventually recovered and is back to his usual self. I'll never forget the strength my mother exhibited during those four long days we spent in the hospital post-







Obituary of 15-year-old who killed self cites school bullies

The family of a 15-year-old Pennsylvania girl who hanged herself says in her obituary that she had a tough life made worse by school bullies.

Sadie Riggs' family posted her obituary on Facebook after she died Monday. They say she was in counseling and took medications for emotional issues complicated by bullying, much of it on social media.

Bedford Area Superintendent Allen Sell says that he can't comment on the specific situation but that policing social media bullying is difficult because schools don't have jurisdiction if it happens outside school hours. The district is offering counseling to students affected by Sadie's death.

Sadie's family tells the bullies: "Please know you were effective in making her feel worthless." They're asking people to "be kind to one another" instead of sending flowers.

Last Thursday, June 22, 2017, Chanty Andrews, whose child is a fourth-grader at Ardmore Elementary School, posted a video in which her daughter Nasir used placards to share her experiences being bullied.

> Nasir told Kiro 7 that when she told a teacher about the "Nutella" incident, she was told the comment was not "racist" and instructed to write the definition of the word. Nasir is a minority at the school, where black students make up only 8.5 percent of the population.


A smiling Nasir gave thanks to everyone who supported her and gave a special shoutout to someone named Kamara and

Serena Williams Stands Up Against **Domestic Violence, Financial Abuse**

The role financial abuse plays in keeping women trapped in abusive relationships is often overlooked.

A recent report, "The Status of Black Women in the United States," found that although Black women have high labor participation and voting rates, at all educational levels, Black women are concentrated in lower paying jobs.

Relatedly, close to half (41.2 percent) of Black women experience physical violence by an intimate partner during their lifetime. The report also states that more than half of multiracial women and Native American women have experienced domestic violence as well.

These rates are higher than for white women (30.5 percent), Latinas (29.7 percent), and Asian/Pacific Islander women (15.3 percent).

"Domestic or intimate partner violence is a cycle of violence in which one individual seeks to dominate and control another through psychological, sexual, economic, and/or physical abuse," the report states.

Tennis superstar Serena Williams is on a mission to end not only domestic or intimate partner violence against women but also economic abuse.

"Standing up for women's rights has long been a passion of mine," Williams said. "I am honored to join Allstate Foundation Purple Purse to bring financial abuse and domestic violence out of the shadows and into the public conversation."

In her role as the new ambassador for Purple Purse, Williams, an entrepreneur and philanthropist, intends to raise awareness of the often invisible role economic abuse plays in keeping women in abusive rela-

Ohanian, the 33-year-old cofounder of Reddit. The two are expecting their first child. In April, she publicly responded to former French and U.S. Open champion Ilie Nastase's racist remarks about the couple's unborn baby.
