

Rev. Moton was born March 27, 1950 in Northport, Alabama to Mattie Lou Moton. He was the oldest of six children. At an early age, Rev. Moton accepted Christ as his personal Savior at First Baptist Church in North-

Rev Moton graduated from Riverside High School in Northport in 1969. He attended Alabama A&M University and became a member of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc. He graduated with a Bachelor of Science degree in History and Political Science in 1973. He accepted a position with the Internal Revenue Service as a Revenue Officer in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. Upon arriving in Pittsburgh,







Racism has come full circle. There is no denying that the Charlottesville protests which ended in the death of one antiprotester and the wrong tweets and statements from the 45th President of the United States, has shown that there are many Americans of all colors and ethnic groups who do not embrace blatant RACISM.

One thing we need to remember is the fact that many of the statues which have been erected honoring Confederate heroes were built AFTER THE CIVIL WAR WAS OVER. The supporters of the Confederacy did not want slavery to end. The descendants of some of those same supporters and their friends still do not want to see the descendants of slaves free and equal. Defeated in war, coerced to be a part of the UNION and actively participating did not make the hearts of the Confederate citizens feel any different about people of color.

Amendments to the U.S. CONSTITUTION: Article XIII abolished slavery; Article XIV gave citizenship to slaves; Article XV gave former slaves the RIGHT TO VOTE. Though these Amendments to the Constitution were ratified the Confederate states have in every way possible, attempted to nullify the law with local and state laws which violate the U.S. CON-STITUTION.

In 1896, the case of Plessey v. Ferguson cemented separation and segregation in the United States. awful things are when construction unions "rule the day" in an urban center. It is almost a certainty that this endeavor will be declared a "Project Labor Agreement" which means union rules will be applied. PLA's are expensive, disruptive, and discriminatory. This was one of the big complaints when the City of Chicago competed for the 2016 Olympics. They said there will be a PLA on the construction and that led to many people saying they didn't want it to come to Chicago.

President Obama is a big fan of construction unions. He will be determined to put a PLA on this project and that will have a terrible effect on his legacy. Maybe this will be a very important moment for our Black architectural and construction companies. We are going to call it out systematically and perhaps file discrimination lawsuits as the ugly truth will emerge.

I hope I am not sounding too

depressive but, my people, this is real! The City of Chicago is over 60% minority. Any major construction project will not employ more than 8% Black employment participation. It can't get any higher because the employment rolls of the union trades do not have sufficient numbers of Blacks participating. This will not change until one day the US Department of Labor starts decertifying construction unions for discrimination. When will that happen? The Department of Labor is part of this problem. The minority population of this nation is over 30% but you won't see an assigned goal for any project to exceed 12%. That is not equal employment opportunity! 30% population versus 12% goals is a clear indication of why the unemployment levels for Blacks and other minorities are significantly higher than for whites.

Our mission must be to make this major construction event

different than the norm. It is time to stop taking it Black people! After the last major expansion of Midway Airport in Chicago, a "whistle blower" sent me the final EEO report for the project. This is what I wrote after reading the report: "I once received the final EEO-1 report on Midway Airport (Chicago) after their last major addition which was construction via a Project Labor Agreement. The report showed very little Black participation and very little local employment for the City of Chicago. It was amazing that a large city that is majority minority had so little minority repre-There were a sentation. noticeable number of workers from Iowa, Wisconsin, Michigan, and Indiana. The people of Chicago were ripped off. Oh! If they only knew which one of their employees slipped a copy of their report to me?"

Lawmakers Call on White House to Postpone HBCU

The White House has no plans to reschedule its conference for Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs) scheduled for next month, despite calls from lawmakers and other leaders to postpone the

Rep. Cedric Richmond (D-La.), chairman of the Congressional Black Caucus (CBC), slammed the Trump administration in a call with reporters on Monday, noting that nothing has changed since HBCU leaders went to the White House in Feb-

"They brought all those HBCUs to town. They took a picture in the Oval Office and then they did nothing," said Richmond. "If you look at President Trump's budget he has a number of actions in it that actually hurt HBCUs."

Instead of a conference, Richmond called for "substantive policies" to help HBCUs.

"I don't think you need a conference in D.C. in order to do that," Richmond told reporters. Further, he said, "This White House is not serious about improving our HBCUs, our institutions of advancement."

President Trump signed an executive order in February establishing a White House Initiative on HBCUs. But despite fanfare surrounding the order and the White House-HBCUs listening sessions (at which there was "very little listening," according to a subsequent blog

post by Dillard University President Walter M. Kimbrough), no progress has been made, and Trump has not yet assigned someone to be in charge of the initiative.

The Chronicle of Higher Educa tion reported last month that the Trump administration is struggling to find someone willing to lead the effort. A spokesperson for the White House reportedly told the outlet that there are several finalists in the running for the position.

Meanwhile, Trump's budget released in March proposed a 13.5 percent budget cut for the Education Department, going from \$68.2 billion in 2017 to \$59 billion in 2018. HBCUs and the Pell Grant Program were promised no additional funding, and the Pell Grant Program was set to lose its \$3.9 billion reserve fund. Various programs that provide funding for students from low-income and disadvantaged backgrounds to attend school were to severe budget cuts or be eliminated entirely.

Johnny Taylor, president and CEO of the Thurgood Marshall College Fund, suggested in a letter to White House officials that substantive action be taken rather than hosting a conference, according to HBCU Digest.

"If the event is postponed, we request that the administration use the intervening period to hire an executive director of the White House Initiative on HBCUs and appointing the membership of the President's Advisory Board on HBCUs; these appointments are necessary first steps for this administration to show its commitment to advancing the HBCU agenda," the publication reported the letter as saying.

Citing "recent events" and inaction from the White House regarding HBCUs, Congresswoman Alma Adams (D-N.C.), chairman of the North Carolina Legislative Black Caucus Foundation, said in a press release the event should not take place yet:

"Earlier in the month of August, my colleagues and I asked the administration for an update on their progress regarding HBCUs. In February, the President signed an executive order outlining greater investments and additional resources for HBCUs. It has become painstakingly clear that these promises are not being kept. In this current environment, and with zero progress made on any of their priorities, it would be highly unproductive to ask HBCU Presidents to come back to Washington."

Adams did not explicitly mention Charlottesville in her statement. Following the violent rally that left a 32-year-old counter-protester dead at the hands of a 20-year-old white supremacist, Trump insisted there were "very fine people" on the neo-Nazi side of the rally and described violence "on both

Mosquito-Borne Diseases

With the recent rains, the City of Lubbock Health Department (COLHD) is urging people to take steps to prevent mosquito-borne infections. Although the number of mosquito-borne disease cases in this area have been low, we are in peak mosquito season. Mosquito-borne diseases are those spread by the bite of an infected mosquito and include Zika, Chikungunya and West Nile Virus.

There have not been any reports of locally acquired illness, but current environmental conditions are perfect for mosquito breeding. City of Lubbock Vector Control works to keep mosquito populations low by treating mosquito breeding sites to prevent mosquito larva from developing and fogging to reduce the number of adult mosquitoes. In addition to Vector Control, it is very important for the community to remove mosquito breeding sites from around their homes such as dumping containers that collect water, filling in low lying areas that collect water, or covering containers that can't be dumped with wire mesh or a tight fitting lid.

In addition reducing mosquito breeding sites individuals can take the following precautions to reduce mosquito exposure by:

· Wearing an EPA registered insect repellent

· Covering up with longsleeved shirts and long pants

· Keeping mosquitoes out of living areas by using air conditioning or intact window screens

 Limiting outdoor activities during peak mosquito times Symptoms of mosquito-borne

diseases include headache, fever, muscle and joint aches, nausea and fatigue. If you are ill and suspect a mosquito borne infection, you should contact your healthcare provider.



"The family appreciates the outpouring of support and love and respectfully asks for their privacy as they grieve during this very difficult time. More details will be released over the next few

days." " My father, Dick Gregory remains hospitalized with a serious but stable medical condition. His prognosis is excellent and he should be released within the next few days," Christian wrote

"After feeling ill last Wednesday (August 9th) Mr. Gregory was taken to the hospital. He was evaluated, treated and re-

leased," the statement said: "Showing only minimal improvement we returned him to the hospital Saturday (August 12) he was evaluated and admitted. Balancing a fine line between privacy and his friends and fans (who are his extended family) right to know. We have and will always gladly and freely share this gift with the

world.' Christian continued: "When it comes to sickness and disease one's age is highly significant. There is no such thing as a 'simple' condition. In advanced age a simple cold or a simple infeetion could be catastrophic. At soon to be chronologically 85, my father's true age far exceeds that. A life well-lived but heavily sacrificed, has definitively taken its toll."

"Laughter is truly good medicine," Gregory's son finished. "I've watched my father for a lifetime heal the world. Today he is in need of your healing. We are truly grateful for the phenomenal care he has been receiving. My family and I remain thankful for all of the prayers, positive thoughts, messages and good energy."

Various celebrities and prominent figures flocked to social media to send their condolences. Disgraced comedian Bill Cosby was one of them. "His comedy showed his education, intelligence, and was inclusive of humanitarianism along with great timing," Cosby wrote about Gregory. "The man went off the stage into the arena of Civil Rights worldwide facing his enemies. He was FEARLESS. Rest in Power Dick Gregory."





The South Plains Food Bank to Coordinate Disaster Relief Efforts to Assist the Thousands Affected by Hurricane Harvey

According to David Weaver, CEO of the South Plains Food Bank, "Lubbock and the South Plains is filled with generous and caring individuals who want to help. At this point, we want to coordinate food relief efforts so that no food goes to waste. That may happen when people collect food and head to the coast without a destination in mind. By working through Feeding Texas, we are insuring that donations are put to the best use."

The most needed items are:

- Hand-held snack items such as granola bars
- Pop-top ready-to-eat items
- Shelf-stable pantry items such as peanut butter, tuna and soup
- Cleaning supplies (bleach, non-bleach, paper towels, etc.)
- Personal hygiene items (toothbrushes, toothpaste, etc.)
- PLEASE NO GLASS OR CANNED ITEMS that could be damaged intransportation







George Foreman on anthem, White House protests: 'Sore losers'



George Foreman

George Foreman, the twotime world heavyweight champion who shared a ring with Muhammad Ali, has weighed in on the national anthem controversy – and he's on the opposite side of Ali-esque political

Speaking to the "Offended America" podcast, Foremanwho admitted he doesn't "pay much attention to what kids do"-indicated that he believed the anthem protests were merely a cry for attention: "I got all this money, but nobody knows me,"" he said, speaking as if he were a protesting athlete, "so let me say something like Muhammad Ali and maybe I'll be different.' That's all that is."

Foreman, seven years younger than Ali, lost to Ali in one of the greatest fights in boxing history, the 1974 Rumble in the Jungle. Foreman then shocked the world two decades later by winning the heavyweight championship once

again at age 45. The concept of patriotism among athletes came up, and

Foreman, who represented the United States in the 1968 Olympics, proudly noted, "I still love this country. The greatest day of my life was when I put on the colors red, white and blue." He suggested that athletes who protest may not have been brought up in patriotic homes, and deemed athletes who declined to visit the White House "sore losers."

Foreman suggested that simply speaking out like Ali wasn't enough to make one equivalent to Ali. "The shame part of it, all of us, including Joe Frazier and myself, we became the heavyweight champion of the world,"
