His new position begun on Sunday, July 1, 2018.

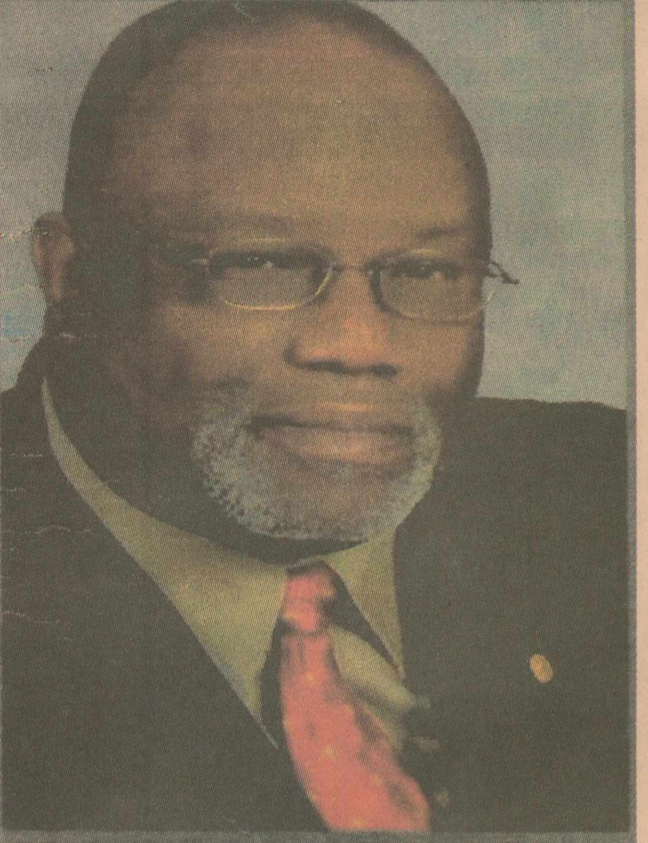
Pastor Gibson has pastored at the United Methodist Church out of East Texas. Also, his most recent church home was at the St. James United Methodist Church in Temple, Texas.

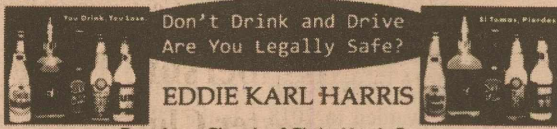

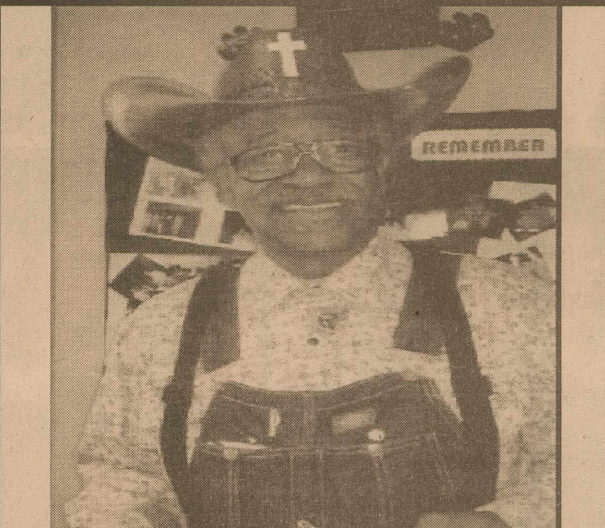

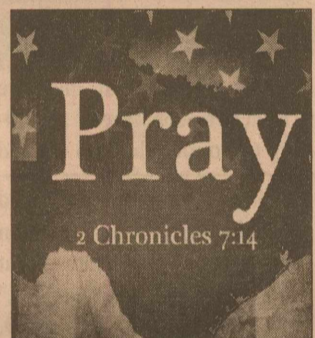

The above is no understatement. America became a strong and great nation through the development and maturity of its energy prowess. The sectors like coal, iron, oil, coal, natural gas, aluminum, electricity, telecom, etc. made us the industrial giant – greatest in the world. Thank God for those inventors, entrepreneurs and risk takers who pioneered robust corporations that made America the greatest nation on earth.

\$4 per gallon for gasoline. Today, even with the Organization of the Petroleum Exporting Countries, or OPEC, attempting to tamp down much of the global supply to push prices higher, American consumers are weathering the storm with gasoline hovering around \$3 a gallon. 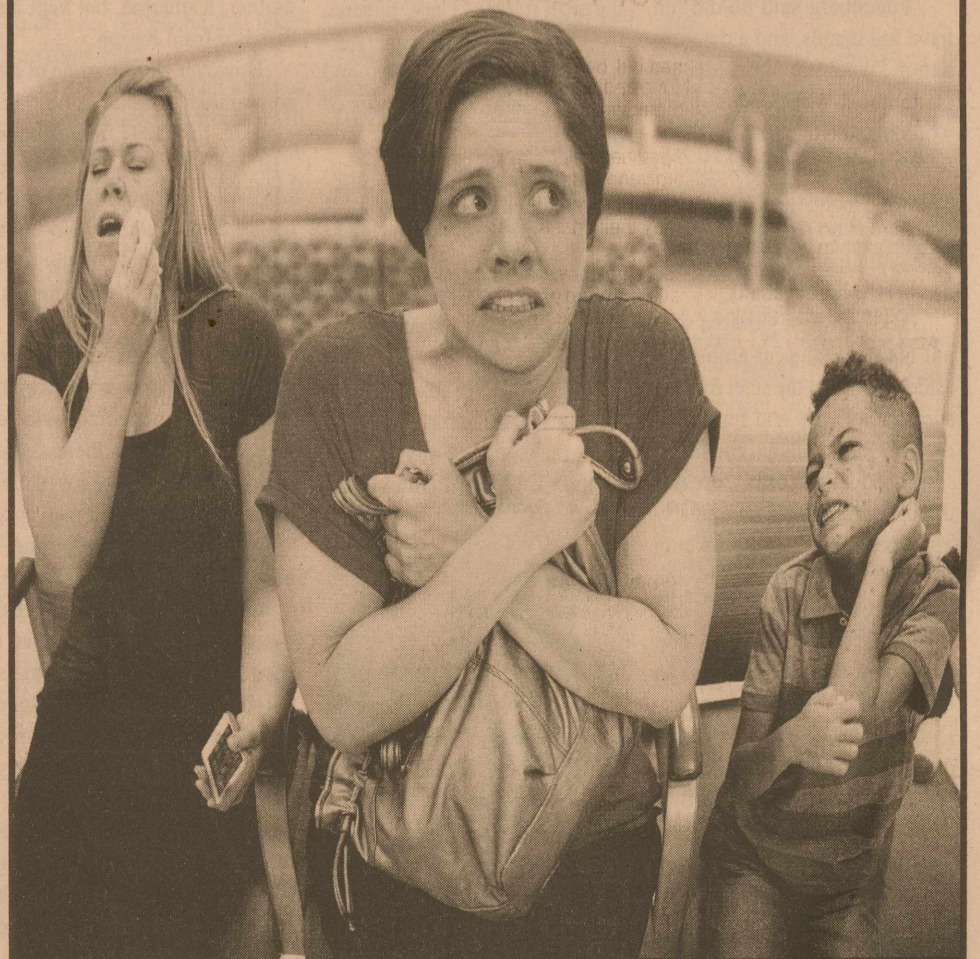

## NAACP Sues Connecticut over Prison Gerrymandering

Bringing First State-Wide Challenge in Nation

NEW HAVEN, CT. — The National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP), together with the NAACP Connecticut State Conference and individual NAACP members who live in five of the most overcrowded Connecticut state legislative districts, filed suit in federal court today to challenge the practice of counting prisoners as residents of the state legislative districts where they are incarcerated rather than in their home districts—a practice known as “prison gerrymandering.”

Connecticut, like many states, disenfranchises prisoners and has concentrated its prisons

primarily in rural areas. The effect is that white, rural voters in the districts where prisons are located have their electoral power unconstitutionally inflated, at the expense of voters of color in other, over-crowded districts.

forms of voter suppression it reduces the power of one community while inflating the power of another and it's time to end it.”

Although a number of states continue to engage in this practice, Connecticut has some of the worst discrepancies in population numbers between its prison districts and most populated districts. According to the complaint, when prisoners are reallocated to their home districts, the population of District 59, where three state prisons are located, has an overall population that is more than 15% smaller than the most populated district in the state. The effect is that the vote of a person in that prison district counts for 15% more than each vote of a person in the largest district.

“Connecticut is a state of extreme inequality with wealth concentrated in the suburbs and poverty in our urban areas; prison gerrymandering represents another way in which resources disproportionately favor suburban communities,” said Scot X. Esdaile, President of the NAACP Connecticut State Conference. “Our members are directly impacted by this process which not only siphons off our families through mass incarceration but siphons off our political power as well.”

“This is about making sure everyone gets an equal voice,” said Germano Kimbro, a formerly incarcerated individual and plaintiff in the case. A resident of District 97, one of the most overcrowded state legislative districts in Connecticut, Kimbro argues “My vote shouldn't count less than someone else's just because they live near a state prison.”

“The Equal Protection Clause of the Constitution requires Federal and State governments to follow the principle of “one person, one vote” when drawing legislative district lines. Each person's vote is to be equal to that of their fellow citizens,” explains Alden Pinkham, a student in Yale Law School's Rule of Law Clinic. “Using prisoners to inflate the population of the districts where prisons are located violates this principle.”

The plaintiffs in the lawsuit are represented by the Rule of Law Clinic at Yale Law School and the NAACP.
