
thought, 'Can I do this?' I hope showing photos like this lets mothers know they're not fighting their battles alone."

Peggie Mitchell put her granddaughter, Khloe, on the bus to Flat Shoals Elementary School on Monday, expecting that the little girl would get to school safely. However, Mitchell told Atlanta news station WAGA-TV that she was "devastated" to find out that Khloe didn't make it to the Decatur, Georgia, school by bus that morning.

Instead, Khloe's teacher called the grandmother to tell her that the student was walked into school by another school employ
