West Point graduated its largest class of black women in its 217-year history on May 25, 2019

Thirty-two black female cadets graduated from the United States Military Academy on Saturday, May 25 – the largest group of black women the school has matriculated in its 217-year history. The school, more commonly referred to as West Point, shared photos of the historic group, posing in dress uniform, with INSIDER on Thursday, May 23, 2019. West Point has been making an effort to recruit more multicultural cadets since 2014, when it set up a diversity office. Visit Business Insider's homepage for more stories.

A group of black female cadets at the United States Military Academy proudly posed for

photos together ahead of their May 25 graduation, to mark being part of the largest class of black women to graduate from the 217-year-old institution.

Thirty-two black women graduated from the school, more commonly known as West Point, in the class of 2019, the Philadelphia Tribune reported. The momentous occasion comes more than 155 years after the end of slavery, and nearly 99 years after women won the right to vote.

West Point was founded in 1802 but didn't admit its first black cadet until 1870. The first women were admitted in 1976.

Since 2014 though, the school has been making more of an ef-

fort to recruit more cadets from different backgrounds, by setting up an office of diversity, according to CNN.

West Point spokesman Frank Demaro told CNN on Wednesday that he expects many more landmarks in the school's future when it comes to diversity.

Last year's graduating class had 27 black women, Demaro said. And the expectation is next year's class will be even larger than this year's.

Demaro also pointed out that this year's class includes the highest number of female Hispanic graduates, along with graduating our 5,000th female cadet.



JUDGING TEACHER PERFORMANCE

This academic year is about over for most public schools and has already ended in some private and charter schools; graduation exercises and proms a done deal. It is towards the end of the year when teachers learn what kind of evaluation they have been given when they receive the end of the year paycheck. Of course, schools which choose a 'Teacher of the Year' generally know who that will be before the end of the year.

The guideline for 'Teacher of the Year' is usually not very well defined. What it generally comes down to is the teacher whom everyone likes or admires the most and who gets the most votes from their peers once nominated. Some schools pass the honor around, one well-liked teacher to the next each year, choosing one whom has not been previously chosen. Too often, the chosen one is a member of a particular clique in the school. Some may be deserving of the 'honor' and some may not be. It has been difficult for me to understand the choices as it has been difficult for me to understand teacher performance evaluation in the 'scientific' methods of evaluation anyway, especially when and if teacher pay is based on such evaluations.

We are all aware of the fact that students' abilities and teacher performance cannot always be accurately evaluated. A teacher can put on a 'show' when observed by an administrator and gain a very positive evaluation, yet the rest of the week, barely do what is needed or necessary to support an over-the-board evaluation. Aside from that, an administrator may feel that anything a teacher does is just dandy and give a great evaluation regardless of what is observed. Then there are days

when some teachers are at their worst just as days when some are at their best in performances. It must be considered that there are students in each class who will learn in spite of the teacher and there are those who will not learn if you put a firecracker under them. The other variable is the fact that there are no two identical learning capacities in any classroom, even with identical twins and therefore some days the teacher, who really works at teaching, will not have the same results for the students in the class.

I have never favored a teacher pay scale based on performance or test results because of differences in human individuals. Test scores show the result of student comprehension, not teacher performance. In some instances, the test score may not show either. The only area in which I feel that teachers should be judged on performance is attendance on the job and a daily observation of them working. Teachers who are on the job every day giving it their best should be honored as 'Teacher of the year.' All teachers should be paid based on their educational achievement and years of experience. Who can actually decide who has made the greatest impact on students in a school when the total enrollment is 500 or more students and one teacher works with no more than 25 students an academic year? Teachers are often admired by students whom they do not teach; the basis being that they are someone whom exerts a feeling of confidence, kindness and friendliness. This is fine, but is it a criterion for being 'Teacher of the Year?' Let us get 'in cinque' and reward teachers with an adequate payment for skill, perseverance and dedication to an underpaid-dis respected pro-

They Can't Take Away our Music – Especially the Motown Sound

We had the pleasure of going to the musical entitled "Pride and Joy" at the National Theatre in Washington, DC. It was Mother's Day weekend and the theatre was packed. "Pride and Joy" is the Marvin Gaye story as written in the diary of Anna Gordy Gaye – Marvin's first wife and sister of Motown founder Berry Gordy. The history of American Black music is a key component of our history and rich culture. The play was somewhat comprehensive dealing with the early days of the company. Plays and movies can sometimes drift away from the actual truth but this one did not fall into such poetic license.

The play starts in the early activities of Berry Gordy. "Sitting at the piano at a Motown Christmas party, life cannot get any better for a young Marvin Gaye, until his attention is captured by one of the most beautiful and glamorous women, he has ever laid eyes on. This woman's beauty rivals any Hollywood movie star's and Marvin must have her, but there is just one problem, she is Berry Gordy's sister. Marvin finds this intriguing and embarks upon a flirtatious conquest of Anna until she relents. However, Marvin who refers to himself as a "ram and a rebel," is met with the fierceness of Anna's strength, independence, and power, which makes for an explosive love affair with neither willing to be controlled by the other," according to the

The singer Jackie Wilson played a significant role as Berry wrote songs for Jackie and that provided good seed money for his ambition of starting his own company. Marvin was born and raised in the northeast section of Washington, DC. He joined the group Harvey and the Moon-glows as a background singer and part time drummer. Harvey Fuqua, a friend of Berry Gordy and business partner brought Marvin to Detroit. He became an in-house session player and later as a solo singer. At the same time Anna was becoming a principal in the business. She first joined as a song writer. Before that she began her career distributing records for Checker Records.

She started co-writing songs with Marvin. Some of her early songs were on an album that Marvin and Mary Wells collaborated on. Marvin would also

do a duet album with Kim Weston, but his biggest duet performance was with Tammi Terrell. By this time Anna and Marvin were married. The success of Marvin and Tammi duet songs caused some strain with Anna's and Marvin's marriage. They married in 1963 and the marriage was "rocky" but lasted until 1975. They adopted a son and named him Marvin III in the interim. Marvin would have two children from a subsequent marriage to Janis Hunter.

Marvin's biggest contribution to the world were his songs describing the social issues of the day. Inner City Blues, What's Going On, Mercy, Mercy (The Ecology) captured the attention of the entire nation and will be his legacy. He died violently in 1984 when his father shot him to death during a physical dispute. He was 44. Anna continued her work in the business and lived to be 92 years of age before dying

in 2014.

Motown is one of the most successful Black owned corporations known to the world. Marvin and Anna Gaye were major players in that activity. Motown specialized in "the Motown Sound". The Hitsville studios remained open and active 22 hours a day. Berry Gordy initially rejected two of Marvin Gaye's tracks that would become critical and commercial successes, "I Heard it Through the Grapevine" and "What's Going On".

Harry knew all 28 songs that were performed during the musical. I didn't know half of the songs. I was just a sweet little girl when Marvin came on the musical scene. But nevertheless, it was most enjoyable. Quentin Perry, the producer (and family friend) used a technique where they would flash actual newspaper clippings onto the back
