Agreement may be near on U.S. hostages

WASHINGTON (AP) - The United States and Iran are nearing agreement on a plan for release of the 52 American hostages, informed sources

reported here today. Separately, Vice President Mondale said shortly before dawn. 'We're trying to do things in hours that would take months oth-

erwise. The hostages have been held captive for 440

In Tehran, Iran's chief negotiator said an agreement had been reached and "the methods of implementing the transfer of our frozen assets'

have been presented by his government. Mondale said complex financial and legal arrangements still had

to be resolved. "It would be nice if it happened today and we're working hard to see if it can," he told CBS News: He agreed with an assessment that there was "a fighting chance" the American hostages would be freed before the Carter administration leaves 'office next Tuesday.

Still, Mondale said, "We've had our hearts broken before and I think we'd better keep our expectations under control.

There was no comment from President Carter, who began a White House conference with foreign policy aides at 7:30 a.m. EST. At the State Department, an official said, "I think we're getting down to specifics," and added that as of mid-morning, no

Iranian assets had been transferred by U.S. banks.

Deputy Secretary of State Warren M. Christopher summoned American and European bankers and other experts to Algiers to help complete the agreement. Forty officials of 12 banks were meeting at the State De-

The financial and legal authorities arrived in Algiers on a U.S. Air Force Boeing 707 that arrived from London. The experts were to help deal with Iran's demand that \$4 billion locked in U.S. branches overseas be transferred to the Central Bank of Algeria. Algeria has acted as intermediary in the talks between Iran and the United States.

The hostages have been held since Nov. 4, 1979 and President Carter has said he is devoting his last days in office to bringing them home. Mon-

dale said that Carter's successor next Tuesday, Ronald Reagan, has been fully briefed on the latest develop-

Top level Carter administration officials met until about 2 a.m. EST today at the Treasury Department to evaluate the new Iranian proposal, described as a "very complicated ... very different kind of ap-

Christopher, in Algiers since Jan. 8 negotiating through Algerian intermediaries, will remain in the Algerian capital as long as necessary, Secretary of State Edmund Muskie said Thursday.

"Chris is the kind of a guy you keep on the firing line," Muskie said.

The latest flurry of negotiations came as the clock approached a deadline set by Iranian officials for transferring frozen Iranian assets into the Central Bank of Algeria. But Muskie said, "The only deadline is Jan. 20, which dictates beyond our power to change it the transfer of authority from President Carter to President

The new Iranian plan was believed to deal mainly with \$4 billion in blocked Iranian deposits in overseas branches of American banks and loans to Iran declared in default.

In tandem with the indirect hostage negotiations through Algerian intermediaries, U.S. officials have been consulting with private bankers whose institutions hold the Iranian money. The New York Times said today about a dozen U.S. banks have been negotiating secretly in New York for the last week with American and European lawyers representing Iran and its central bank.

Fresh allegations threaten Cabinet pick's confirmation

WASHINGTON (AP) - In the first serious delay encountered by any of Ronald Reagan's Cabinet choices, the FBI is investigating fresh allegations against Labor Secretary-designate Raymond L. Donovan that sources say would destroy his hopes of Senate confirmation if proven true.

"We have new questions that have arisen that need to be resolved," Sen. Orrin Hatch, R-Utah, chairman of the Senate Labor and Human Resources Committee, said after the panel put off a scheduled vote on Donovan on

Hatch later met with FBI Director William Webster to request a swift investigation. Webster refused to discuss the case, except to tell reporters, 'We're in agreement as to how to

Few details were available, but the charges involved a reported series of payoffs to the Teamsters union in New Jersey by Donovan's firm, the Schiavone Construction Co.

One committee aide, who asked not to be identified, said the charges were serious enough, if true, to force withdrawal of Donovan's nomination.

But the source stressed there was no proof of the "naked allegation," and Donovan was said to have insisted in a conference with Hatch late Wednesday that he was innocent of any wrongdoing.

Hatch, asked by reporters whether Donovan's nomination was in jeopardy, said, "I think it's premature to answer that question.

He added, "I frankly think Mr. Donovan's an honest man, but we've got to resolve some conflicts and problems '

Donovan was unavailable for comment, but Reagan told reporters he was not concerned about the delay.

"I know what the evidence is," the president-elect said. "He's told me this is absolutely not true and I have every confidence in him."

Hatch told reporters he did not know when the investigation would be completed. He said additional hearings might be necessary and added, Whether or not it will be completed before Inauguration Day I don't

Ironically, the new charge against Donovan surfaced two days after the 50-year-old Cabinet nominee impressed most of the committee's members with his answers to questions about two other business transactions a decade apart.

In one case, Donovan's firm sent a \$13,000 check in 1967 to a company later discovered to be a dummy corporation set up to funnel kickbacks to New Jersey politicians and mob-

Donovan told the committee at his confirmation hearing Monday that he thought the check was a routine business transaction to purchase the right to dump construction debris on a va-

The second incident involved a federal grand jury investigation which reportedly received information from Schiavone employees that the firm put a "ghost" Teamster on the payroll in exchange for labor peace.

Donovan told the company he knew nothing of either the investigation or the purported arrangement until he was informed by Senate investiga tors.

Nominee pulls out of rodeo

DENVER (AP) - Because President-elect Ronald Reagan has summoned his Cabinet nominees to Washington for a special meeting, one member of the White House inner circle will miss the team roping event in the National Western Rodeo.

Malcolm "Mac" Baldridge, Reagan's nominee for secretary of commerce, has withdrawn from rodeo competition so he can attend the Cabi

net meeting early Monday morning, officials said.

Baldridge was to have competed in his first round of team roping competition Thursday and in the second round Sunday night. Because of the Cabinet meeting, he would have had to miss the second round, and so has told the Professional Rodeo Cowboys Association that he has

Baldridge, who is chairman of the Scovill Manufacturing Co. in Waterbury, Conn., lost his \$255 entry fee because he withdrew from the rodeo event, officials said.

Carter proposes lame-duck budget

Reagan aides promise wholesale cuts

WASHINGTON (AP) - The incom ing Reagan administration, accusing President Carter of playing politics with the 1982 federal budget, vows to slash the \$739.3 billion lame-duck spending plan from top to bottom.

President-elect Ronald Reagan, who reviewed the just-released budget with his economic advisers Thursday and scheduled another session for today, said he expected to find "some



least \$50 billion. 'We think that we're going to have to revise it (the budget) from top to

Carter's budget director, James T. McIntyre Jr., denied the spending plan for the fiscal year that begins mind. "I have taken no action with the purpose of embarrassing the incoming administration," he said.

Carter, as he signed the thick document, defended the budget as an example of restraint. The departing

made by his Republican successor or Congress will be "relatively minor in nature because this is a sound proposal that will withstand the scrutiny of congressional deliberations.'

Reactions in Congress, predictably, were positive from Carter's fellow Democrats and negative from the

Rep. James Jones, D-Okla., chairman of the House Budget Committee, called the budget "very honest" and "very, very tight as far as reducing spending.

Jones' Republican counterpart in the Senate, Peter V. Domenici of New Mexico, attacked the proposal as "an old, tired, timid budget.

Carter's budget calls for a \$76.6 billion, or 12 percent, spending increase from 1981, mainly due to a hefty boost for the military and inflation-triggered jumps in other areas. Defense spending would go up \$23

billion to \$184 billion. When adjusted for inflation, the projected overall budget rise is 1 per-

ORLANDO, Fla. (AP) - While agriculture officials kept an eye on the price of orange juice, stateofficials were meeting today to consider whether to continue embargoing shipments of fresh citrus for fear the fruit was ruined by a deep freeze.

The State Department of Citrus already has imposed a temporary embargo to ensure that fruit picked after the freeze would not be stamped and sold as fresh Florida citrus unless its quality was up

Meanwhile, agricultural leaders were waiting to see whether orange juice prices would be boosted prematurely by retailers taking advantage of this week's freeze.

wholesale price of Florida orange juice concentrate has risen 95 cents for a carton of 12 six-ounce cans, from \$2.60 to \$3.55. State officials said the market could absorb that fluctuation if retailers don't over-

'If they raise their prices now, they're really taking advantage of it," said Market Research Director George deJager of the Citrus Department. We're just going to hold our breath and wait and see what they do.

One industry official said he expected consumer prices to return eventually to what they were in 1977 freeze in imposing higher wholesale prices.

As a result of citrus losses in the freeze, the October 1979, before surpluses and processor promotions combined with Brazilian imports to steadily lower the price.

Oil company agrees \$20 million fine

HOUSTON (AP) - Two oilmen and a Denver-based company, in a plea bargain agreement with federal prosecutors, will pay more than \$20 million in penalties and refunds for selling low-priced "old" crude oil as a higher-priced "new" product.

B.A. Williams III of Houston, Marvin Davis of Denver, Colo., and Summit Transportation Co. entered guilty pleas before U.S. District Judge Norman Black, who imposed \$20,120,000 in fines and refunds. Williams is a former president of Summit and Davis is its former board chairman. Williams was fined \$40,000 on each of two counts and Davis agreed to pay

\$20,000 as a civil penalty. Summit entered a guilty plea to a two-count criminal information and

drew a maximum \$10,000 fine on each charge. The company also agreed to pay a \$3 million civil penalty and refund \$17

million, including interest, to the Department of Energy. Specificially, Williams was charged with willful violation of the Energy Petroleum Allocation Act and the company was accused of making false

Prosecutors said the pricing scheme existed between Jan. 1, 1973, and May 1,


could go homes if they chose. Others living closer to the refinery were asked to wait until the fire was completely out before returning,

Boston Gas, under the supervision' of the Public Utilities Department, is responsible for compliance inspections and has assigned 40 people to

monitor commercial customers. The school shutdown is designed to save about 4 million cubic feet of gas, about 1 percent of recent daily consumption, according to Energy Secretary Joseph Fitzpatrick. He said closing schools was preferable to shutting down industry to save gas while

avoiding a drastic economic impact. James O'Connors, a Boston Gas Co. vice president, said he hoped the school closings would spur others to

Doris Pote, head of the Department of Public Utilities, said the state would not fine business violators or consider cutting them off.

She said the department will begin an investigation of the gas supply problem Tuesday.

We are going to have to look at the question of negligence and the question of who is going to pay for excess charges" resulting from the shortage, said Ms. Pote.

Noting that synthetic gas, twice as

costly as pipeline fuel, is being used

because of the crisis, King said, "It doesn't appear to me that the consumer should pay for any error or miscalculation or lack of preparedness that a utility may have had. The supply problem came to a head earlier this week, when businesses and schools in Lowell and on Cape Cod





Former Rep. Celler dies at age of 92

Emanuel Celler, who spent 50 years in Congress and authored or co-authored the three great civil rights laws of the century, is dead of pneumonia at the age of 92.

The liberal Democrat, one of the most influential New Yorkers to serve in the House, died at his home Thursday night. He had been active and had worked in his Manhattan law office until suffering a stroke in July. Celler served as chairman of the

House Judiciary Committee for a record 22 years. He ran the committee from 1949 until his departure from Congress at the end of 1972, with a two-year interruption in 1953-54, when Republicans controlled the House

That departure came as a result of a stunning upset by Elizabeth Holtzman, then a political unknown, in the 1972 primary. She went on to represent his 10th District in Brooklyn for the next eight years, until her unsuccessful bid last year for the U.S.

the nation's history and a quarter of its presidents, from Warren G. Harding to Richard M. Nixon. Only Carl-Vinson, a Georgia Democrat who retired in 1964, equaled Celler's 25 terms in the House. He topped Celler's total service by two months

A force behind the civil rights laws of 1957, 1960 and 1964, Celler also left his mark on the major antitrust, labor and immigration legislation of five decades, both on the House floor and later as the powerful Judiciary chair-

He missed by a term leading the most celebrated Judiciary Committee action of modern times, the 1974

"I couldn't have done it any better," he said in 1978 of his successor as chairman, Peter Rodino of New

He also left no doubt about how he would have voted on the question, calling Nixon "a hatchetman who got his comeuppance.

:From the outset of his career, he could lie like an epitaph," the blunttalking Celler said. "He should have

Celler had his differences with other presidents too, even those he largely backed, such as Franklin D. Roosevelt

He deserted Roosevelt in 1938 over: the president's efforts to pack the Supreme Court, and later recalled, After that, I was never invited to the (Roosevelt) White House again."

His favorite White House occupant, he said, was John F. Kennedy, who displayed "charm and ability" and a true sense of history

Celler was born in Brooklyn and earned his law degree at Columbia University. His first legal job was defending a Polish immigrant who had voted without first troubling to become a citizen.

A taste of government service came during World War I when he was appointed an appeal agent under the Draft Act of 1917 He and Stella Baar, a teacher, mar-

ried in 1914 and had two daughters. Judith Celler, and Jane Wertheimer. Mrs. Celler died in 1966 at age 75, five years before Judith, who suffered from cerebral palsy

Celler is survived by Mrs. Wertheimer. Funeral services will be held

Lilienthal, the first atomic energy authority vested with control of the chairman of the Atomic Energy Commission and a development and use of uranium-producing plants former head of the Tennessee Valley Authority, has and stockpiles throughout the world. died at the age of 81.

Lilienthal, who lived in Princeton, N.J., died Atomic Energy Commission in 1947 and held the Wednesday of a heart attack in Manhattan after position until 1950. and studied at DePauw and Harvard universities. He practiced law in Chicago, where he became counsel to the city in a telephone-rate controversy. In 1931, he was appointed Wisconsin's public utili-

ties commissioner, and caught the eye of President

Franklin D. Roosevell. In 1933. Roosevelt appointed Lilienthal one of the first directors of the TVA. project involving 175,000 acres and the building of 21 dams for power generation and flood control. Lilienthal weathered charges by a fellow director

that he was corrupt and in 1941 was named chairman of the TVA At the end of World War H, Lilienthal was named

Budget includes highest defense spending ever

WASHINGTON (AP) - The dying Carter administration is recommending the highest-ever spending next year on defense, complicating a problem for the incoming Reagan administration.

That problem: Trying to carry out Republican campaign pledges to boost defense spending above Carter administration levels while meeting other Republican commitments to balance the overall federal budget

Counting this supplemental request for 1981, Carter's 1982 defense proposal represents a \$22.4 billion increase over this year. Defense Secretary Harold Brown calculated this amounts to a 1.1 per

cent "real growth" in defense spending after absorbing inflation. The main thrust of the final Carter defense budget is to upgrade the readiness of conventional ground, sea and air forces and their current weapons and equipment. The outgoing administration also recommended pushing ahead with a program started last year to enable U.S. forces to move rapidly to the Persian Gulf and other crisis areas.

Per capita debt is \$4,669

Your share of the federal debt amounts to \$4,669.76 in President Carter's final federal budget proposal.

And your interest charges for fiscal 1982 work out to a tidy \$470.20. But don't worry: your bill is not due and payable.

These figures represent the per-capita share for every American man, woman and child of the public debt and the interest on that debt projected by Carter's fiscal 1982 budget.

Public debt is estimated to soar over \$1 trillion for the first time - to \$1,057.7 billion — by the end of fiscal year in September 1982

And with soaring interest rates - just like the prime rate and the interest on home mortages - the interest bill will jump over \$100 billion for the first time, reaching \$106.5 billion before adjustments.

Most of the debt is held by banks, life insurance companies and individual Americans who have Treasury bills, notes, bonds and Savings

Much of budget goes to people

WASHINGTON (AP) - President Carter proposes that 42 cents of every federal dollar go directly to pay benefits to individuals - from retirees on Social Security, the elderly ill on Medicare, to students applying for educataion grants and to jobless workers getting unemploy-

Last year, Carter proposed that 43 cents of each federal dollar go to individuals, but in the fiscal 1982 budget he sent Congress on Thursday,

an extra cent was allocated to national defense. Social Security payments are projected to rise by \$21.4 billion to \$159

billion, or more than 21 percent of all federal spending. Most of the budget's social spending plans are aimed heavily toward the old, the ill and the poor.

Local aid nearly unchanged

WASHINGTON (AP) - President Carter's final budget proposes little additional assistance to state and local governments and would block the states from being readmitted to the federal revenue sharing pro-

Carter proposed spending \$99.8 billion to aid state and local governments in the 1982 fiscal year beginning Oct. 1. That would be an increase of \$4.5 billion, or about 4.7 percent, over the estimated spending of \$95.3 billion during the 1981 fiscal year.

Most of the money would be for funding such federal aid traditions as highway construction, mass transportation, sewage treatment plants, community development projects and air and water pollution control pro-

Carter's proposal to keep the states out of revenue sharing to states is certain to draw strong opposition from the nation's governors.

Carter firm on new water projects

WASHINGTON (AP) - Refusing to back down in the final week of his administration, President Carter has told Congress again that he will not propose any new water projects until lawmakers agree to an independent review of suggested projects.

Carter's budget proposal for fiscal 1982, which begins Oct. 1, recommends spending \$4.5 billion for continuing water-resource development, but with all the construction money allocated to projects already under

Budget includes big pay hikes

WASHINGTON (AP) - In a parting effort to make top government jobs more attractive. President Carter is pushing a big pay raise for some 35,000 federal executives while also proposing cost-of-living increases for rank-and-file civilian workers and those in the military.

In each of these initiatives, Carter is reflecting the views of Ronald Reagan, soon to be inaugurated as president. Reagan has criticized existing pay levels for senior government personnel, saying salaries aren't sufficiently attractive to lure top-flight people from positions in

Civilian rank-and-file employees would get a 5.5 percent cost-of-living raise Oct. 1, while the nation's nearly 2.1 million military personnel would

Ag budget increased by one-third

WASHINGTON (AP) - President Carter is asking Congress to raise spending a hefty 34 percent for food and nutrition programs, loans to farmers, agricultural research and rural development in 1982.

In the budget he proposed Thursday, Carter asked Congress to approve \$28 billion in total outlays for the Agriculture Department in the next fiscal year, which starts Oct. 1.

With the 1981 budget estimated at \$20.9 billion, the new spending plan would represent one of the sharpest increases in many years. So-called "farmer programs" would run at \$5.84 billion, up from

\$3.07 billion estimated this year. Food and nutrition programs would get \$17.2 billion - 61.4 percent of the total outlays for next year. The same programs were projected to cost \$15.6 billion this year - 74.6 percent of the total budget.

Payments to farmers to help offset natural disasters would drop to \$500 million from \$900 million this year.

Federal budget totals \$739 billion

Spending plan includes a \$271/2 billion deficit

WASHINGTON (AP) - President Carter is leaving Congress and his Republican successor an inflationswelled budget of \$739.3 billion for 1982 that proposes a big boost in military spending, modest personal tax credits and a \$27.5 billion deficit.

The farewell spending proposal, which President-elect Ronald Reagan and Congress are sure to overhaul. ealls for a \$76.6 billion, or 12 percent. increase over this year. The projected rise actually amounts to about 1 per cent when adjusted for inflation.

Reagan has promised that soon after his inauguration Tuesday he will present his own economic blueprint, which will include deep cuts in Carter's non-defense spending plan and a major tax cut to take effect this

Carter attributed his budget increase to added growth in defense and energy budgets and to uncontrollable items directly tied to double-digit ining hikes in Social Security benefits. and higher interest payments on the national debt

The defense budget, which accounts for 25 cents out of every federal dollar, would go up from \$158 billion in 1981 to \$180 hillion in fiscal 1982, which begins Oct. 1. Social Security spending would rise from \$138 billion to \$160 billion, and interest on the national debt would increase from \$80 billion to \$90 billion

Carter also called for a 14 percent increase in foreign aid to reverse a two-year decline in the assistance program. And he requested more money to fill the nation's emergency petroleum reserves at a faster rate to guard against future shortages of im-

The departing administration expects an inflation rate of 12.6 percent this year, about the same as last

When inflation's effect is taken into account, defense spending would show "real" growth of 4.4 percent

while the rest of the budget would actually decline slightly from 1981 after taking rising prices into ac-

Members of Reagan's transitionteam said in advance of the budget's release that they feared Carter would propose unrealistically low spending levels for non-defense programs and pump up defense spending beyond military needs. This would embarrass Reagan politically by forcing rim to cut defense and increase spending on other programs, they

The budget also estimates that inflation will push 1981 spending up to \$663 billion and create a \$55.2 billion deficit. The revised figures formally acknowledge Carter's failure to fulfill his 1976 campaign pledge to balance the budget within four years.

Carter requested a \$22.4 billion increase in the defense budget for 1982 along with an additional \$6.3 billion for the 1981 budget to cover pay increases, higher fuel costs and mounting expenses in maintaining a fleet in the Indian Ocean.

Carter said the steep boost is needed because "we face a threat to our security, as events in Afghanistan, the Middle East and Eastern Europe make clear." U.S. forces must be able to contain Soviet aggression and continue to assure our security in the future," he said.

The "real" growth in the new defense budget is greater than the 3 percent real annual increase Carter promised NATO allies but is the minimum increase that Reagan is expect-

Carter proposed an additional \$2.4 billion for the MX missile system, which has attracted opposition, particularly over the deployment plan the administration has devised.

DETROIT (AP) Chrysler Corp. says it will reopen a truck assembly plant that reportedly is not operating because unpaid suppliers have refused to ship components.

In other production news, General Motors Corp. soon will shut an assembly plant making "X-body" compact cars to reduce inventories for the first time since the model was introduced 21 months ago.

The developments were in the regular weekly employment and production reports issued Thursday by the five major automakers.

Those announcements put ong-term layoffs this week at 189,750 compared with 189,050 last week, and assembly layoffs to reduce inventories at 24,850 next week against 20,530 this week

Meanwhile, U.S. car pro duction this week should jump 17 percent from last week with the return of several assembly lines to operation, a trade weekly report-

Chrysler's truck plant in Warren, Mich., in a longplanned closing this week to reduce inventories, was missing gasoline tanks, tank attachments, carpets and other components, according to United Auto Workers union President Douglas Fraser

The financially troubled company said the plant would open on schedule Monday.

IUD should be custom-fitted

Dear Dr. Solomon: I've been reading about programs in some of the non-industrialized nations of the world for mass distribution of intrauterine devices. I have no objection to providing women in these countries with the devices if that is what they want. But how can they be used on such a large scale? Don't they have to be fitted to the individual patients?-Lydia

Dear Lydia: Intrauterine devices (IUDs) should be custom-fitted to the recipients, and I would hope that efforts in this direction are being made wherever they are used. In this respect, the quality of medical care should not be compromised.

Dr. Harrith Hasson, of Grant Hospital and North western University Medical School, notes that variations in the size and shape of the hyman uterus probably are greater than those of the human foot. Proper fitting of IUDs is therefore extremely important, and should help reduce many of the symptoms and complications associated with their use.

Dr. Hasson also notes that an IUD that may fit comfortably during one part of the menstrual cycle may not fit during another, since the uterus is constantly changing in size and shape. Therfore, the IUD must be adaptable within a certain range. Obviously, custom fitting becomes an even more important consideration when uterine abnormalities are encountered.

I agree with the thrust of your question, and can only add that all medical care should be tailored to

the needs of the individual patient Dear Dr. Solomon: My husband and I have been delaying starting a family primarily because I am concerned about my condition. I am a diabetic and very fearful of what a pregnancy would mean for me. In particular, I have heard stories of women who experienced serious problems with their vision following a pregnancy. Are these old wives' tales or is there some basis for them? My husband has been very supportive, but I know he would like a family.-Mrs. E.J.

Dear Mrs. J.: Most diabetic women can have children without being concerned about the possibility of blindness or the threat of seriously impaired vision following the pregnancy. Only those with a condition known as "progressive proliferative diabetic retinopathy" that is not responsive to treatment with photocoagulation may have to consider the advisability of an abortion if their vision is threatened.

According to Dr. Lawrence J. Singerman, an ophthalmologist, one of every four pregnant women with diabetes has retinopathy, but there is no proof that their vision would be helped if they had an abortion. However, careful monitoring of the condition and treatment with photocoagulation, if indicated, are essential if good vision is to be maintained.

These conclusions are based on a study of 66 patients by Dr. Singerman; Dr. Lloyd M. Aiello, an ophthalmologist; and Dr. Harvey M. Rodman, a diabetologist. Abortion was considered a possibility for only six of the 66 patients.
