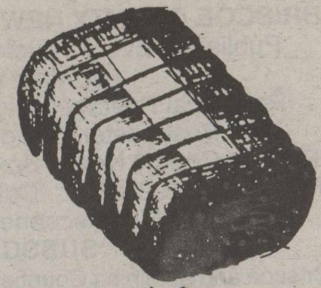

## Owls Entertain Homecoming Crowd By Defeating Cotton Center, 60-14

The Owls kicked off to open the Homecoming football game here Friday night, and on fourth down Drew Reed intercepted a Cotton Center pass on the 35 to give Silverton their first possession of the game. E. J. Ivory scored on the next play with 8:34 remaining in the first quarter. Gid Mayfield held and Max Comer kicked the PAT to give the Owls an early, 8-0 lead.

Humberto Vasquez kicked off, and the Elks controlled the ball on their 35. Reed, Jacob Francis, Chance Rhoderick, James Tiffin, Comer and Vasquez led the defense and the ball went over on downs to the Owls, who lost the ball via the fumble route on the first play. With tough defense and team fackling, the Elks were held to less than a 15-yard gain, and the Owls got the ball back with 5:53 remaining in the first period. Ivory ran for a first down on the Cotton Center 27, after which Rhoderick carried a touchdown with 5:12 remaining in the quarter. Comer's kick was blocked, leaving the score at 14-0.

Vasquez kicked off once again, and

the Owls allowed the Elks to make a first down before Rhoderick recovered a Cotton Center fumble.

Rhoderick picked up a first down for Silverton before Ivory carried another touchdown with 2:36 still on the first-quarter clock. Comer kicked the PAT, to give the Owls a 22-0 lead.

Vasquez kicked off again, and the Elks passed complete for a first down, stopped by Reed, after which Francis executed a quarterback sack. The Elks made a touchdown with 34 ticks remaining on the first-quarter clock. There was no PAT, and the score was narrowed to 22-6.

When the Elks kicked off, Ivory carried the ball all the way to the endzone. Comer kicked the PAT, and with 17 seconds remaining in the first quarter, the Owls led 30-6.

Comer kicked off and Cotton Center returned the ball to midfield. After making a first down, the Elks carried a touchdown with 9:50 remaining in the second quarter. They kicked the PAT, and narrowed the score to 30-14.
